



High School Students, we would love for you to come and work as assistants in the classrooms. Many of you are exploring professions or vocations; this experience may help you discern what God wants for you.



Jar 1917 – jedna zlá správa za druhou

Uplynul už viac ako rok od kedy sa malá hŕstka Slovákov rozhodla postaviť si slovenský katolícky kostol, aby mohli počuť slovo Božie v ich materinskom jazyku. Hoci sa borili s mnohými problémami, za krátku dobu dosiahli dosť. Získali povolenie od biskupa na založenie komunity, zapísali veľa Slovákov a nazbierali, či požičali si peniaze na zakúpenie pozemku pre kostol. A splnila sa im aj ich najväčšia túžba, keď získali slovenského kňaza. Táto nádejná situácia však bola narušená prvými mrakmi na obzore. Medzi ľuďmi sa vyskytli nedorozumenia i podozrievanie zo sprenevery peňazí, čo viedlo k rezignácií niektorých členov zodpovedných za zbieranie finančných prostriedkov. Jedným z príkladov svárov je i debata o pláci za hranie počas krížovej cesty. Organista Tomáš J. Grigliak nebol spokojný s ponúknutou sumou 50 centov a svoju nevôľu vyjadril slovami, "že on za tie peniaze ani nohu z havzu nevytiahne". Konečný kompromis bol 1.00 dolár.

Začiatkom marca po nedeľnej omši (v prenajatých priestoroch Poľského kostola) sa Slováci museli popasovať s novou výzvou. Všetky kontrakty a zmluvy o zakúpených pozemkoch bolo treba odovzdať diecéze. Pochopiteľne, zo strany ľudí sa táto požiadavka stretla so silnou nevôľou a viacerí vyjadrovali nespokojnosť a obavy, že im biskup tento pozemok odoberie. Netreba sa čudovať ich zmýšľaniu: Pozemok na kostol nadobudnutý za cenu veľkých osobných obetí chápali ako svoje vlastníctvo a neuvedomovali si, že (vtedy, tak ako aj dnes) diecéza je legálnym vlastníkom pozemkov a majetku všetkých farností. Hoci sa naň poskladajú veriaci a majetok je spravidla v správe danej farnosti, legálnym vlastníkom je vždy diecéza. Obavy Slovákov sa snažili rozptýliť (viac či menej úspešne) i Rev. Janeček (český kňaz) a Rev. Gdzela (poľský kňaz), ktorí poukazovali na fakt, že všetky farnosti a katolícke kostoly sú v rovnakej situácií.

Daná situácia neuspokojila viacerých členov zodpovedných za financie, ktorí sa snáď i v dôsledku osobných sporov vzdali funkcie. Väčším problémom však bola všeobecná nespokojnosť, nedôvera a oslabenie zaangažovanosti. Viacerí jednotlivci, ktorí požičali peniaze do spoločného fondu požiadali o ich vrátenie a to isté spravil i 36. Zbor katolíckych sokolov. Našli sa však aj obetaví ľudia, ktorí veľkodušne ponúkli ďalšie peniaze ako náhradu za tie, ktoré museli byť vrátené.

Okrem problémov s financiami mohla byť plánovaná výstavba kostola ohrozená i novým poľským kostolom, ktorý sa údajne mal začať stavať v tej istej lokalite. Z hľadiska daných národnostných skupín existencia viacerých kostolov v prílišnej blízkosti nepredstavovala problém. Pravdou však je, že z pohľadu diecézy by to bolo nie najlepšie strategické rozhodnutie, ktorému sa aj v iných prípadoch radšej vyhýbali.

Popri týchto nie malých problémoch sa Slováci museli dozvedieť ďalšiu zlú správu. Reverend Bendick narýchlo zvolal všetkých členov výboru a oznámil im, že na základe nariadenia biskupa nesmie viac slúžiť Slovákom a musí okamžite odísť k svojmu biskupovi (stále nevieme, odkiaľ vlastne prišiel). Pre Slovákov to bola trpká rana: V Rev. Bendickovi videli obetavého kňaza, ktorý pracoval pre ich novú komunitu a veľmi sa ich dotklo, že by mal odísť práve pred Veľkou nocou. Preto sa rozhodli poslať delegáciu za biskupom so snahou dosiahnuť zmenu daného rozhodnutia, alebo aspoň lepšie pochopiť situáciu. Ako to všetko dopadlo sa dozvieme v budúcom čísle bulletinu.

Spring, 1917 - Bad News

More than one year had passed since the first group of Slovaks decided to build a church where they could hear the Word of God in their mother tongue. Despite many challenges, during this first year they had obtained permission from the bishop to start a community, registered many Slovaks, as well as having collected funds for the purchase of property for the new church. And their biggest dream had come true in the person of Rev. Bendick, a Slovak priest. However, some initial disturbances began to appear as well. Personal conflicts, a lack of trust and suspicion led to the resignation of some members who had been responsible for collecting funds. An example of this situation was provided in notes regarding a debate about the wage paid for playing the organ during the Stations of the Cross. Organist Tomas J. Grigliak was not happy with the proposed 50 cents and he expressed his discontent with the words, "I won't even step out of my house for this amount of money". The final compromise was one dollar (approximately \$22 today).

In the beginning of March, 1917, after a Sunday Mass (in rented space at the Polish church), the Slovaks faced a new challenge. All contracts regarding the purchased property were to be submitted to the diocese. Obviously, this requirement met little or no approval among the people and many expressed their discontent and concern that the bishop would take away their property. Their thinking is understandable: they considered the property for their Church, obtained through many sacrifices, as their personal property and they failed to understand that – as is true today – the diocese is the legal owner of all Church parish properties. Although many people contribute towards these properties, and they are normally administered by the parish, the diocese remains the legal owner. Even Rev. Janecek, the Czech priest, and Rev. Gdzela, the Polish priest, tried to explain the situation to the Slovaks and pointed out that all other parishes are in the same situation.

Several members responsible for the group's finances became dissatisfied and resigned their positions. The more serious result was a general lack of confidence and decreased involvement in the project. Several individuals even requested a refund of their contributions toward the building fund.

While they were dealing with these financial problems, the construction of the church was also potentially jeopardized by the supposed construction of a new Polish church in the same neighborhood. From the perspective of these ethnic groups, the existence of several churches in close proximity to one another did not pose a problem. The truth is, however, that the diocese regularly avoided this kind of strategically imprudent decision.

Aside from these problems, the Slovaks received more bad news. Reverend Bendick suddenly summoned all of the group's representatives and shared with them the decision of the bishop: that he must leave Detroit at once. This was a bitter pill to swallow: The Slovaks regarded Rev. Bendick as a fervent priest who worked for their new community and they were also hurt because the timing of the decision was just before Easter. They decided to send representatives to the bishop, hoping to reverse the decision, or at least to better understand his decision.
