
Beginning **Thursday, September 5**, is the Ss. Cyril & Methodius RCIA (*Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults*) course.

Consecration to Jesus thru Mary Prep • Saturday, July 13

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary is a beautiful exercise to increase our spirituality and ability to truly serve our Lord Jesus Christ. The basic premise set forth by St. Louis Marie de Montfort is simply that Jesus came into the world through Mary and that for us to always be assured of being close to Jesus, even closer than ever before, we should go through Mary.

St. Louis de Montfort (1673 – 1716) had a profound devotion to the Blessed Mother and he wrote extensively on the virtues of Our Lady. He developed a 33-day devotion consisting of various prayers and readings to help us to grow in holiness and increase our faith and love for our Lord. It is a prayerful and focused method of drawing closer to Jesus than ever before. It will help us to detach ourselves from the world and bond ourselves more closely with Christ through the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Consecration to Jesus is for anyone, who is old enough to understand the love of Jesus and Mary. The preparation is intended to prepare our hearts and minds by praying and meditating. The consecration prayers usually take approximately 10-15 minutes per day. The total consecration begins on a date that will end on a Marian Feast Day.

The next preparation begins Saturday, July 13. The "Total consecration to Jesus through Mary" ceremony will take place on Thursday, August 15, the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Total Consecration book is available in the Parish Office to purchase for \$10.

Big Problems to Overcome - The History of Our Parish, Part 8

Nepříjemná správa o nečakanom odchode obľúbeného kňaza, Rev. Bendicka tesne pred Veľkou nocou bola pre Slovákov ťažko pochopiteľná a ešte ťažšie prijateľná. V snahe zvrátiť toto rozhodnutie sa podujali navštíviť biskupa a žiadať vysvetlenie. Takýto krok si iste vyžadoval veľa odvahy od týchto jednoduchých ľudí, ktorí museli prekonať jazykovú i sociálnu bariéru, no zároveň ukázali ako veľmi im na slovenskom spoločenstve záleží. Ani stretnutie s biskupovým sekretárom, ktorý ich prijal však neprinieslo túžený výsledok. Sekretár v mene biskupa vydal svedectvo o morálnej bezúhonnosti Rev. Bendicka a obavy Slovákov z rozptýlenia sa snažil zahnať prísľubom iného slovenského kňaza. Napriek tomu sa rozhodnutie ohľadom Rev. Bendicka nezmenilo: dostal posledný plat vo výške \$10 za mesiac apríl, výťažok zbierky vo výške \$70 a krátko po Veľkej noci odcestoval. Domnievame sa, že návrat Rev. Bendicka do Pensylvánie si vyžiadala jeho tamjší biskup, ktorý ho následne poveril starostlivosťou o Slovákov v meste Luzerne, PA, kde sa stal správcom a neskôr farárom kostola sv. Jána (<https://www.holyfamilyluzerne.org/St-John-Nepomucene-Parish>). Počas svojho pôsobenia (1918-1956) sa pričínil o postavenie školy a kláštora pre rehoľné sestry.

Po odchode Rev. Bendicka z Detroitu sa bolo treba postarať o praktické záležitosti: brat Andrew Antal prevzal zodpovednosť za farskú budovu, za čo dostával \$5 mesačne. Spoločný majetok na konci apríla 1917 bol nasledovný: 9 parciel v hodnote \$4,400, nábytok a riady (\$406), krížová cesta (\$30), Betlehem (\$30), organ (\$25), kríž (\$7.50) a v pokladnici bolo \$257.14. Po odrátaní dlhu \$1,706 činil majetok spolu \$3,449.64.

Ani po odchode Rev. Bendicka však Slováci neboli ponechaní sami na seba a zo strany biskupa sa im dostalo podpory v podobe vymenovania českého kňaza Rev. Jozefa Janečka (ktorý im v minulosti už pomohol a radil) za duchovného správcu slovenskej komunity. Je to znakom toho, že i biskup vnímal danú skupinu Slovákov nie ako nejaký záujmový národnostný spolok, lež ako súčasť Katolíckej Cirkvi, ktorá sa má starať o duchovné potreby všetkých jej členov.

Dočasné prenajímanie priestorov na omšu v pivnici Poľského kostola bolo samozrejme iba provizórnym riešením. V snahe pohnúť sa vpred so stavbou vlastného kostola sa ukázalo, že pozemky zakúpené s týmto úmyslom sú nevyhovujúce. V bezprostrednej blízkosti totiž už rástol poľský kostol a hoci by to pre dané národnostné skupiny problém nebol, diecéza sa takýmto situáciám radšej vyhýbala. Pod vedením Rev. Janečka (ktorý mal zjavne skúsenosti s vedením farností) sa podarilo predat 9 stavebných parciel určených na stavbu kostola (po \$750) a tieto peniaze použiť na zakúpenie nového pozemku na Foster Street. Hoci ešte malo prejsť dosť času, na tomto mieste neskôr naozaj stál prvý kostol sv. Cyrila a Metoda.

Okrem týchto veľkých rozhodnutí pokračovala činnosť vznikajúcej farnosti i každodennou prácou: hľadanie nových Slovákov, nadviazovanie kontaktov so slovenskými organizáciami, zbieranie peňazí a organizovanie spoločenských akcií. Táto drobná práca postupne budovala a upevňovala celé spoločenstvo.

The unexpected news about the sudden departure of their beloved pastor, Rev. Bendick, shortly before Easter, 1917, was a bitter pill to swallow. In an effort to reverse the decision, the Slovaks decided to visit the bishop of Detroit and request an explanation. Such a step must have required a lot of courage, as they faced both linguistic and social barriers in meeting with the Bishop, but their love of the Slovak community helped them meet these challenges.

However, their meeting with the bishop's secretary failed to bring the desired result. The secretary, on behalf of the bishop, assured them of the moral integrity of Rev. Bendick and he responded to the Slovaks' concerns by promising a new priest. Nevertheless, the decision was not reversed and Rev. Bendick departed shortly after Easter for Pennsylvania. Before leaving, he received his final monthly wage of \$10 *(\$203) and the proceeds from a special collection (\$70) *(\$1,423).

In all probability, the departure of Rev. Bendick had been requested by his bishop in Pennsylvania, who appointed him pastor of the Slovak community in Luzerne, PA (<https://www.holyfamilyluzerne.org/St-John-Nepomucene-Parish>). He served at St. John's church from 1918-1956 and helped build a school as well as a convent for sisters there.

After the departure of Rev. Bendick, practical questions had to be addressed as well. The care for the rectory was assigned to Andrew Antal, who was receiving \$5 *(\$102) per month for this task. The total value of the property was: 9 building lots (\$4,400 total) *(\$89,429), furniture and tableware (\$406) *(\$8,252), stations of the cross (\$30) *(\$610), nativity set (\$30) *(\$610), organ (\$25) *(\$508), cross (\$7.50) *(\$152), and \$257.14 *(\$5,226) in cash. Minus the debt of \$1,706 *(\$34,674), the total value was cash positive: \$3,449.64 *(\$70,113).

Even the departure of Rev. Bendick had not left the Slovaks abandoned. They received support from the Bishop in the person of a Czech priest, Rev. Janeček, who had been assigned as a temporary administrator of the community. Although Rev. Janeček had advised and helped the Slovaks in the past, this arrangement could not have satisfied their hopes and expectations.

However, it did prove that even the Bishop viewed this group of Slovaks not as a social club, but as a solid part of the Catholic Church, which is to provide pastoral care for all its members.

They continued to rent the basement of the Polish church temporarily as just a provisory solution to their current situation.

Attempting to move forward and take specific steps toward their own church proved to be insufficient, because of the building of a Polish church just two blocks away. Although national ethnic groups would not perceive this as a problem, the Archdiocese would have preferred to avoid this kind of situation. Under the leadership of Rev. Janeček (who must have had experience with parish administration), the Slovaks sold nine lots intended for the construction of the church (\$750 each) *(\$15,244 each) and purchased another property on Foster Street. Although it would still take a long time to be accomplished, this would eventually become home of the first St. Cyril and Methodius Church.

Aside from these large-scale decisions, the life of the community continued with their everyday struggles to locate new Slovaks to join them, make contacts and relationships with more fraternal organizations, raise funds, and organize social events. This grassroots work would eventually build and strengthen the community bonds.
