

#### Kingdom of Happiness 8-Week Study Program

Although God created us to be happy, the concept of happiness has been polluted in recent times. The world tells us our contentment will come from exercising our "freedom" so that we might pursue every pleasure or comfort offered to us. But in doing so, we surrender our freedom and become slaves to our passions.

Christ came and turned the world upside down (Acts 17:6-7). He showed us that only in dying to self and embracing our cross do we discover true joy. To help us do this, he stood upon a mount and gave us several marks of His interior life called the Beatitudes. These directives may seem paradoxical at first glance, but as was just noted, this is precisely how our Savior taught, with a reality that contradicts the world.

The above paragraphs are an excerpt from the book parishioners received at Easter this year, *"Kingdom of Happiness, Living the Beatitudes in Everyday Life"*, by Father Jeffrey Kirby, STD. Hopefully you've had a chance to read, and learn, from the book. Soon we will offer an 8-part study program that unveils Jesus' plan for happiness in the Beatitudes. The study program will:

- Show how the Beatitudes are much more than nice sayings, they are the path to happiness charted by Christ Himself
- Expose the "anti-Beatitudes" for what they are: the kingdom of man's false promises of happiness that lead only to misery
- Inspire a renewed resolve to live the Beatitudes through video profiles of re-life people living the Beatitudes in their everyday life.

Father Jeffrey Kirby is featured in the teaching videos along with powerful profiles of normal people living out the Beatitudes in heroic ways.

Mark your calendars to begin the 8-week program this September. Classes will be offered on Monday evenings or Tuesday mornings, beginning September 9.

#### **Things Turn Toward the Better**

Krátky pobyt Rev. Bendicka a jeho nečakaný odchod z Detroitu zanechal medzi Slovákmi zmiešané pocity. Vlial im nádej a presvedčenie, že aj drobnou prácou a malými krokmi sa dá dosiahnuť veľký výsledok. Na druhej strane si museli uvedomiť že vysnívaný slovenský kostol nebude záujmové, či etnické združenie, ale súčasť Rímsko-katolíckej Cirkvi a tak sa musí začleniť do miestnej diecézy.

Slováci sa preto znova vrhli do práce a využívali už osvedčené prostriedky na budovanie spoločenstva: hľadanie a zapisovanie nových členov, spoločensko-kultúrne akcie (zábavy) a zbieranie financií cez krajanské spolky. Spolupráca s Diecézou nakoniec viedla aj k druhému veľkému úspechu, keď pomocný biskup Kelly sprostredkoval príchod slovenského kňaza, Rev. Jána Kovalského z Du Quoin, Illinois. Pod jeho vedením a vďaka silnej podpore novozaloženého osadného spolku (obdoba dnešného mužského klubu) rýchlo napredovala i stavba kostola. To bolo možné iba vďaka predchádzajúcej práci mnohých jednotlivcov (zbieranie peňazí, zakúpenie pozemku...). Naše informácie o priebehu stavby, rozmeroch kostola a iných detailoch sú veľmi limitované a zakladajú sa iba na niekoľkých zachovaných svedectvách (napr. jedným z dodávateľov stavby bol F.H. The brief presence of Rev. Bendick as well as his unexpected departure from Detroit left the Slovaks with mixed feelings. It infused into them hope and certitude that grassroots work and small steps can lead to huge results. On the other hand, they came to realize that building a Slovak church could not be understood as establishing a cultural center, but rather as being a part of the Roman-Catholic Church in the Diocese of Detroit.

The Slovaks therefore rolled up their sleeves and used proven methods to build up the community and gather financial means. Collaboration with the Archdiocese finally led to obtaining a Slovak priest. Auxiliary bishop Kelly mediated the arrival of Rev. Jan Kovalsky from Du Quoin, IL, who would become the first pastor of the Parish. Under his leadership and because of the strong support of the newly founded "Men's club" even the construction of the first church advanced quickly. This was possible only due to the tireless work of many people who had helped in raising financial resources and in obtaining the property for the construction. Consecration of the cornerstone (by Rev. Van Antwerp) was a solemn moment, with the participation of Rev. Liscinsky from Cleveland, both pastors of the Czech churches (Rev. Janecek and Rev. Hajek), an Irish priest and Rev. Guzinsky.
