We are honored to welcome His Grace, The Most Rev. Milan Lach, SJ, Bishop of Parma, OH, to celebrate an Eastern (Byzantine) Hierarchical Divine Liturgy with our parish community next Sunday, September 15, at 10:00AM.

The Divine Liturgy of Our Holy Father John Chrysostom will be accompanied by the choir from St. Basil Byzantine Catholic Church in Sterling Heights.

The Byzantine Church is one the several churches that create the communion of the Catholic Church. The Byzantine Church origins from the Eastern ecclesial tradition and is in union with Rome. It shares the same basic faith and the same mysteries (sacraments), however, its way of expressing them follows the same tradition as the Orthodox churches.

Experience the richness of the liturgical traditions with Bishop Milan Lach next Sunday, September 15, at 10:00AM.



#### Kingdom of Happiness 8-Week Study Program • THIS WEEK, September 9 or 10

HAPPINESS Although God created us to be happy, the concept of happiness has been polluted in recent times. The world tells us our contentment will come from exercising our "freedom" so that we might pursue every pleasure or comfort offered to us. But in doing so, we surrender our freedom and become slaves to our passions.

Christ came and turned the world upside down (Acts 17:6-7). He showed us that only in dying to self and embracing our cross do we discover true joy. To help us do this, he stood upon a mount and gave us several marks of His interior life called the Beatitudes. These directives may seem paradoxical at first glance, but as was just noted, this is precisely how our Savior taught, with a reality that contradicts the world.

The above paragraphs are an excerpt from "Kingdom of Happiness, Living the Beatitudes in Everyday Life". The study program will:

- Show how the Beatitudes are much more than nice sayings, they are the path to happiness charted by Christ Himself
- Expose the "anti-Beatitudes" for what they are: the kingdom of man's false promises of happiness that lead only to misery
- Inspire a renewed resolve to live the Beatitudes through video profiles of re-life people living the Beatitudes in their everyday life. Father Jeffrey Kirby is featured in the teaching videos along with powerful profiles of normal people living out the Beatitudes in heroic ways.



#### Conflicts About Finances • Continuation on the History of Ss. Cyril & Methodius Parish

Kombinácia extrémnej chudoby v ktorej prví slovenskí prisťahovalci žili s ich úprimnou snahou postaviť si kostol neraz prinášala napätia a spory o peniaze. Z dnešného pohľadu sa niektoré rozhodnutia či postoje môžu zdať úsmevné, no v každom prípade odrážajú ducha doby, ako aj zanietenie za veľké veci.

Jednou z praktických otázok pri plánovaní stavby kostola bola zvonica, ktorá by uniesla istý počet zvonov. Dosiahnutý konsenzus bol dva zvony, na ktoré mal každý člen prispieť sumou 5 dolárov. Zvonenie (pri pohrebe) bolo zaručené iba pre členov, ktorí prispeli k založeniu komunity, alebo "jestlí ale pred smrťov sa pokaja a svoje výplatí abý sa zvonilo". Pre Slovákov bolo zjavne veľmi dôležité zachovávanie pohrebných zvyklostí v ťažkom momente v živote pozostalých.

Napätia medzi Slovákmi sa ukazujú najmä v opakovaných sporoch o peniaze, resp. pri ich kontrole. Pri volení nových zástupcov komunity v roku 1919 sa objavili podozrenie zo sprenevery na strane starých zástupcov, no spory sa nakoniec podarilo urovnať aj vďaka novým aktívnym členom (Ludvik Zeleňak, Jan Zeleňak ml., Ondrej Leško, John Hricík, Tuleja, Timko, Slamka a John Galdun).

Začiatok roka 1920 sa znova nesie v znamení sporov o financie a prináša nové organizačné výzvy. Je to nielen prejav ľudskej nátury, ale aj dôsledok ťažkých podmienok a nedostatku. Išlo najmä o otázky:

Verejná revízia účtovných kníh

Platba za prenájom Haly sv. Jána

Rozdelenie veľkonočnej ofery medzi farára a farnosť

Vyberanie peňazí počas omše

Slávenie nedeľnej omše za farníkov

Podpisovanie šekov

Vrátenie požičaných peňazí jednotlivcom

Upratovanie kostola (nakoniec sa tejto úlohy ujal organista)

Kúpa pozemku na stavbu novej fary

Ani farár, Rev. Kovalský nie je v týchto debatách vždy vykreslený v najlepšom svetle, aspoň z nášho dnešného pohľadu. Na žiadosť o vrátenie vianočnej zbierky pri dverách kostola a pri jasličkách reaguje dosť stroho, že "nedaju aní centa". Nedostatok dobových údajov nám bráni pochopiť, kto bol v práve.

Takisto nedokážeme vysvetliť vyhlásenie farára Rev. Kovalského, keď verejne spochybnil legitimitu členov farského výboru. Napriek tomu výbor pokračoval v práci (!) a naďalej sa venoval praktickým otázkam pri vedení farnosti.

Veľmi zaujímavo vyznieva debata o použití peňazí, ktoré sa vyzbierali na podporu misií (53.35 dolárov), keď niektorí farníci a aj farár (!) navrhovali časť peňazí ponechať pre potreby farnosti. To je z hľadiska morálky neakceptovateľné a vždy treba rešpektovať úmysel darcu.

The combination of extreme poverty of the first Slovaks and their sincere effort to build a church oftentimes led to tensions, arguments and disagreements about money. Some of their decisions or positions might seem surprising from our present perspective, but they reflect the spirit of the time as well as the strong excitement for their cause.

One of the practical questions to be decided was the planning of a bell-tower to bear a certain number of bells. The final decision was made to have two bells and every person was expected to contribute 5 dollars. Ringing the bells at a funeral was reserved only for members who had contributed to the foundation of the community ("in good standing").

Tensions among parishioners are visible in historical notes by the repeated arguments about finances. Discussions circulated around the questions of:

Public revision of financial records

Rental of St. John Hall

Splitting of the Easter collection between the pastor and the parish

Collections during Mass

Celebrating Sunday Mass for the parishioners

Authorized signers of checks

Paying off loans to individual parishioners

Church cleaning (the task was finally accepted by the organist)

Purchase of a new property for the construction of the rectory

Even the pastor, Rev. Kovalsky does not appear in the best light in these debates. He responded to the request to turn in the proceeds of the Christmas Nativity collection with these sharp words, "I will not give even one cent." The lack of available information prevents us from forming an opinion on who was actually right. We are also unable to explain the moment when Rev. Kovalsky called into question the legitimacy of the Parish Council and yet it continued its work.

Very interestingly, it appears there was a debate within the parish regarding the use of the funds collected for missions (\$53.35). Some parishioners and even the pastor(!) suggested they keep a portion of the collection for the needs of the parish. Morality requires that the Church respect —and strictly honor—the intention of the donor.
