Since 1883, the Month of October has been dedicated to the Holy Rosary. Through the centuries, Our Blessed Mother has asked for us to pray the rosary and to enlist in her spiritual warfare with this strong “weapon” against the evils of the devil.

Our Lady has appeared in Toulouse, LaSalette, Lourdes, France, Fatima, Banneux and Beauraing, Belgium and (possibly) Medjugorje, Bosnia-Herzegovina, and asks for us to daily pray the rosary.


