Dear Parishioners,

Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over.

(Luke 24:29)

These words of the two disciples after their experience with Jesus on the walk to Emmaus belong liturgically to Easter time, but they capture well how we are feeling these days. We wish to experience the presence of Christ in our lives, but also struggle in our faith when we do not feel it. Is there something wrong with Christ, something that the Church is not doing right, or are we perhaps lacking the right mindset?

While feelings are an integral part of human life, Jesus offers much more than the satisfaction of our emotional needs. This Sunday we are entering Holy Week, which is the heart of the liturgical year. The liturgical celebration of Easter (and of every Eucharist) makes the victory and triumph of Christ's death present again. It appeals first of all to our intellect, in understanding, life-decisions, and attitudes. It is Christ who exercises his priestly office in liturgical celebrations, and the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, the Church responds by her actions. God's aim is always the sanctification of His people. People, however, should not remain passive in their attitudes. They are challenged to show readiness to hear



and believe, listen and follow. God's Word requires an answer (communication); His love invites reciprocal love.

This year, the parish community will be separated during the liturgical celebration of Easter. Yet, it must not stop us from living the presence of Christ and the gift of new life that Christ grants.

During the livestreaming of liturgy from the Church, please, gather in your families as a domestic Church. While salvation and forgiveness are accomplished by the action of Christ, and while we all create a virtual community in prayer, every family is invited to perform a liturgical action. Very soon we will prepare more information and materials for this house-liturgy. Most importantly, we need to adopt the mindset that Christ accomplishes salvation for us. We, for our part, strive to live this new life here and now.

May God continue to bless us.

- The Chrism mass will take place on Monday April 6, at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. The public are not allowed to participate but everyone can follow the Mass live stream beginning at 7pm.
- The liturgy of Holy Week will take place without the public's participation. Everyone is encouraged to join the live streamed liturgy from our Parish Church.
- The Holy Mass of the Lord's Supper will take place on Thursday at 7pm.
- The liturgy of Good Friday will take place on Friday at 3pm.
- The Easter Vigil will take place on Saturday at 7pm.
- Easter Sunday mass will take place on Sunday at 10am.
- Easter Novena Mass Cards are being offered and can be mailed to your loved ones. Please see the website for details.
- Besides the liturgy being live-streamed from our Church, additional materials will soon be available on our parish website for private use in families. You can also pray the Stations of the Cross and Chaplet of Divine Mercy at home.
- The Church as well as the Chapel will be closed during the liturgy of the Holy Triduum.
- There will be no Eucharistic Adoration, Veneration of the Holy Cross or tomb of Jesus at the Church.
- There will be no blessing of Easter food. Prayers for private blessing of food will also soon be available on our website.
- The Church will be open for private prayer on Thursday 10am-5pm; Friday 6-10pm; Saturday 10am-5pm. Only 10 people will be allowed in the church at one time. Please remember social distancing and please wear a mask or scarf over your mouth to help protect yourself and your neighbor.
- Please remember that Good Friday is a day of strict fasting. Remember to begin the Divine Mercy Chaplet on Good Friday in order to receive the plenary indulgence on the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday, April 19.




Garabandal Movie • Free During Holy Week

Acts of Spiritual Communion

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping Him in His Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

A Prayer for Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You in my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, Come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there And unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

The Divine Mercy Novena *Begins Good Friday, April 10

In *Divine Mercy in My Soul: Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, Jesus appeared to Saint Faustina, and told her that He desires a special nine day novena. Beginning on Good Friday, the novena is to be prayed for nine consecutive days, in preparation for the glorious Feast of Divine Mercy. (See *Diary* #1209-1230).

"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fount of My mercy, that they may draw there from strength and refreshment and whatever graces they need in the hardships of life and, especially, at the hour of death. On each day you will bring to My Heart a different group of souls, and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy, and I will bring all these souls into the house of My Father. You will do this in this life and in the next. I will deny nothing to any soul whom you will bring to the fount of My mercy. On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My bitter Passion, for graces for these souls." (Diary, 1209)

The Feast of Divine Mercy

HOW SHOULD WE PREPARE FOR THIS GREAT FEAST of MERCY?

Jesus told St. Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened." (Diary 699) Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to Confession and then receive Him in Holy Communion on the Feast of Mercy - the Sunday after Easter, which is now called Divine Mercy Sunday.

"The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary 699)

- Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter (Live Stream or EWTN Mass)
- Come to Jesus with a humble and contrite heart, repenting of all your sins.
- Receive Holy Communion on the Day of the Feast of Divine Mercy.

 (MAKE AN ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION)
- Venerate the image of Divine Mercy on the Feast of Divine Mercy. (FOUND ON THE FOLLOWING PAGE OF THE BULLETIN)
- Be merciful as God is merciful.
- Be open to receive a Plenary Indulgence as Jesus promised.

THOSE WHO CANNOT GO TO CHURCH OR THE SERIOUSLY ILL may obtain a plenary indulgence on Divine Mercy Sunday, if totally detesting any sin, as has been said before, and with the intention of fulfilling as soon as possible the three usual conditions, will recite the Our Father and the Creed before a devout image of Our Merciful Lord Jesus and, in addition, pray a devout invocation to the Merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in you). If it is impossible that people do even this, on the same day they may obtain the Plenary Indulgence if with a spiritual intention they are united with those carrying out the prescribed practice for obtaining the Indulgence in the usual way and offer to the Merciful Lord a prayer and the sufferings of their illness and the difficulties of their lives, with the resolution to accomplish as soon as possible the three conditions prescribed to obtain the plenary indulgence.

(APOSTOLIC PENITENTIARY - DECREE - Indulgences attached to devotions in honour of Divine Mercy)

Fr. Chris Alar, MIC urges us to "seal our homes" by pasting a 'blessed' image of the Divine Mercy upon our front doors, facing outwards, to express our trust in Jesus' promise of protection. Simply cut (or print) the image on the next page of the bulletin and, while making the sign of the cross over the image, pronounce these words of blessing:

"O Lord, I seek Your blessing upon this image, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen."
