

Dear Parishioners: "Rise up and be not afraid". These are the words of Jesus, when his disciples fail to understand that suffering leads to glory. These words also encourage the faithful in the Archdiocese of Detroit during this year when we have been hit by the pandemic. All the struggles CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL – personal and economic – can never extinguish faith. On the contrary, the true faith will shine even more. The current situation has not only restricted the available resources, but it has also increased the needs of many people. Thus, more than before it is important to be good stewards of the resources each of us has been

blessed with. November 13: Archbishop Vigneron Letter Regarding the Dispensation from the Obligation to Attend Mass

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During these difficult months during the pandemic, I have granted a general dispensation from the grave obligation that we as Catholic Christians have to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation in the Archdiocese of Detroit, in part to

help ease the conscience of those who are unable to be present for public worship due to risk of illness to themselves or their families. The most recent dispensation expires on November 22, at which point we had hoped the pandemic would have eased enough to allow all of us to return in an unrestricted way to our celebrations of the Holy Eucharist.

Unfortunately, local and state health officials report that we not only continue to experience an increase in cases in our region and elsewhere, but that the rate of increase is rising dramatically and dangerously. I have been in communication with leaders in our Catholic hospitals and they are very concerned about the immediate future and the challenges they face caring for all those in need, not just those experiencing serious complications from COVID.

Dispensation

After carefully considering these and other factors, I am extending the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for people living in or visiting the Archdiocese of Detroit until Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021. As we have from the beginning, we will continue to closely monitor the situation in our region, with an eye on the day – hopefully in the not-too-distant future – when all of us are able to safely reunite in our normal patterns of worship.

Attending Mass

This extension is given so as not to unduly bind the consciences of those who are greatly troubled by the destructive potency of the coronavirus, and to care for the most vulnerable among us, such as the elderly. At the same time, one should not take advantage of the dispensation without a true need. Catholics who have already begun to engage in non-essential activities, such as widening one's social circle or going out to eat, should return to Sunday Mass – an essential activity – as church capacity allows. Our souls greatly need the grace that comes from the re-presentation of Christ's saving death and resurrection and this is what Jesus has entrusted to us in the celebration of the Mass. Just as businesses, schools, and other locations have opened safely, so have our parishes. Our pastors, parishes, and the faithful have worked diligently and adapted well in order to ensure the health and well-being of everyone who has been able to come to church for Mass, Confession, or to pray. I want to offer my sincere gratitude for the efforts that have been undertaken to implement and maintain the first-rate precautionary measures that have kept our parishes and schools safe.

Keeping Holy the Lord's Day

Whether or not they are able to attend Mass, all baptized Catholics are reminded of the grave necessity they have to keep holy the Lord's Day. This a divine law that neither I nor anyone else can ever dispense. Sunday is the day of the Resurrection of our Lord, and as such Christians from the earliest days have set it apart as a day unlike others. When it is not possible to participate in person in the Sacrifice of the Mass, it is vitally important for every member of the Catholic Church to observe the Sabbath by prioritizing prayer, time for God and for family, and works of charity. To that end, many of our parishes have been broadcasting their services over the internet during these last several months. While this virtual means of watching Mass can never replace the unmediated contact with the Real Presence of Our Lord we receive by being present and participating in Mass, these livestreamed Masses have been a way to help Catholics nourish their souls when they cannot be present for Mass.

Let us trust that the Lord accompanies us through all difficulties, including this pandemic. As we approach Advent and prepare for flu season, we should remember to pray daily for health care workers, first responders, including our priests, and all who are and will offer compassionate service and healing in the months to come. Let us also continue to invoke Our Lady of Lourdes, patroness for those who suffer illness, asking her to pray with us for healing and protection for the people of southeast Michigan and beyond.

St. Cyril's ... Spirit and Determination ... Our History (Cont'd.)

The Congregation of the Dominican Sisters continued to increase, and since there was no room to expand their current facilities, in January, 1948, they acquired 800 acres in Oxford, Michigan, which then served as the Dominican Sisters Motherhouse for over 70 years.

The 1950's was a decade of continued growth and jubilation. On June 3, 1951, Father Zalibera celebrated his 45th anniversary of priesthood. A procession comprised of school children, altar boys, parish societies and clergy led Father to the church where a High Mass of Thanksgiving was celebrated followed by a banquet organized by the parishioners. Another significant project was the installation of the automatically-operated Schulmetronic Basilican church

bells. After much planning and careful consideration, Father Zalibera choose these Basilican bells to complete the church towers which added to the beauty of the church building. The culmination of this work rang out on Christmas Eve in 1955.

On May 27, 1956, the parishioners gathered again to celebrate Fr. Zalibera's Golden Anniversary with a High Mass celebrated by His Eminence, Edward Cardinal Mooney. The day included a banquet where clergy, civil authorities, students and parishioners paid tribute to their beloved pastor. In honor of this occasion, the church was redecorated through the generosity of the parishioners.

The Dominican Sisters had been using the third floor of the school as their convent since the school was first built. This was not an ideal situation, and the continuing need for more classroom space brought about the plan to build a convent on parish grounds. Fundraising began and the groundbreaking ceremony was held on November 6, 1957. Work continued for two years and on September 27, 1959, Rev. Bishop Henry Donnelly blessed the new convent.

During the peak of the parish in the 1950s and 1960s, there were 1,800 parish families, a yearly enrollment of 800 students in the elementary and high schools and an on-site staff of 18 sisters. The completed building unified the church and school as one massive structure. The Byzantine style sanctuary occupied the center of the building while the three-story school wrapped around it and the gymnasium/auditorium was located below the sanctuary. When the entire parish complex, which included the church, school, rectory, convent and furnishings, was completed, the cost was estimated at nearly \$1 million dollars (equal to \$8,793,243 in 2020). This was a substantial sum of money at that time since most parishioners were mainly in the lower income bracket. It was very difficult at first, but the parishioners took pride in the sacrifices they made to build the church, school and auditorium that served them for many years. At that time, architects considered the structure as one of the three best-built church buildings in Detroit.

Knights of Columbus -Gianna House Baby Botte Project

WHAT A GREAT TIME TO BE CATHOLIC! WHAT A GREAT TIME TO BE PRO-LIFE!

As you know, The Knights of Columbus have been Pro-Life from their inception. St. Nicholas Council 7011 is pleased to announce the completion of its Baby Bottle Project for 2020. This Project was selected by Ss. Cyril & Methodius Church as one of its 2020 Lenten Projects.

St. Nicholas Council 7011 was involved in raising funds to provide operating and other expenses for Gianna House, a resource center for pregnant mothers, located in Eastpointe. Gianna House offers two separate programs. One program is its Community Outreach Program which since 2015 has focused on community building and skills enhancement, serving those who are pregnant, new moms, and moms with multiple children. These Outreach mothers are in their 20's and 30's and come from 21 different cities. In 2019, this program had 1,136 mother visits; mothers attended 978 classes and received over 4,000 baby items. On May 3, 2019 Gianna House, in a ribbon cutting ceremony, celebrated the licensing of their facility with the State of Michigan, the first certified nonprofit, long-term residence for pregnant teens in the State. This represents their second Program, their Residency Program.

Teenage girls, age 13-17, may stay for up to one year after the birth of their child and receive free room and board, prenatal care, counseling, as well as other classes in caring for their baby. Gianna House is in the process of a restoration of their facilities to open a second wing to accommodate additional residents and to respond to the needs of many inquiries received from pregnant 18- year olds. Last year through this program, Gianna House helped many mothers, providing many items, such as diapers, formula, car seats, and other essentials.



In late February/early March of 2020, the Knights from St. Nicholas Council 7011 distributed almost 600 baby bottles to parishioners at the weekend Masses to fill with donations for Gianna House. The collection of these bottles was delayed due to the COVID pandemic. The Council's Knights eventually completed the collection of these bottles. On November 11, 2020, the Council's Grand Knight, Joseph White PGK and Ken Pullis, Right to Life Chairman, met with some of the staff of Gianna House and presented them with a check for \$6,800 (photo). This total amount was a great accomplishment given the unusual circumstances in 2020 and is a result of the great generosity of our parishioners and visitors to Ss. Cyril & Methodius Church. Every contribution, large or small is greatly appreciated and will be well used by Gianna House.

We leave you with three thoughts- THANK YOU, THANK YOU, and THANK YOU.

- 1. Friends of the Congo: Many of us remember Fr. Jean Ikanga as a frequent visitor to St. Cyril's, during the holidays while he was a medical student at Emery University in Atlanta. After completing his degree, Fr. Jean returned to the Democratic Republic of the Congo, his home country, and began building a modern maternity clinic in an underserved region of the Congo. At this point the final need for this project is a source of clean water. Raising funds to construct the well has been difficult during the pandemic for Fr. Jean's funding agency, Friends of the Congo. Please help Friends reach its goal to finance the well which will make it possible for the clinic to begin caring for women and children. *Donations can be made online* at: https://www.congowomensclinic.org/ or by mailing a check to: Friends of the Congo, Inc., 6223 Hough Road, Almont, MI, 48003.
- 2. Mary's Children Family Center: This day program that provides care and enrichment for 25 adult survivors of traumatic brain injury was closed for 6 months due to Covid concerns. Last month, the center reopened on a limited basis and is once again providing loving care for these very vulnerable individuals. Students at Mary's Children begin their day together with the rosary, then participate in individualized projects and activities, coming together in the center's chapel at the end of the day to pray the Divine Mercy chaplet before going home. With a 2:1 student to caregiver ratio, each student is helped to participate as they are able and to reach their individual, full potential. In the past, our parish has collected cleaning supplies and applesauce cups to help the center offset costs.
