#### 2021 Catholic Services Appeal

We are fast approaching the launch of the 2021 Catholic Services Appeal (CSA). The CSA collection funds many diocesan-wide projects and services that benefit all parishes and help to spread faith. Contributions to the CSA makes a difference in the lives of many people and is also a great way to strengthen the parish finances. Although we do not yet have our goal for 2021, information on the process for the 2021 campaign follows:

- ♦ The Archdiocese of Detroit will do a direct mailing campaign on the parishes' behalf as they did in 2020. Families who contributed to CSA anytime between 2017 and 2020 can expect to see the first appeal in their mailboxes somewhere around April 15th. The direct mailing from, and the handling of the majority of payments by, the AOD takes much of the burden of administration off the parish.
- ♦ Those who did not contribute to CSA between 2017 and 2020 have the opportunity to contribute to CSA when blank pledge cards become available in early May. You can also call: (888) 331-8695 or go online to givecsa.org to donate.

If you provide your email address with your pledge or if your email address is up-to-date in our system, the Diocese will send out a follow up survey via email toward the end of the campaign. This survey will be an opportunity to provide feedback on CSA and will allow you to receive a custom impact report to see how your gift is making a difference.

## St. Monica Sodality Mass · Sunday, April 24

While we are enjoying the peace and joy of the Easter Season - including God's Divine Mercy, we continue praying for loved ones who may not share or practice our faith. Several intentions from the Divine Mercy Novena can be especially helpful with these prayers. For example:

### St. Monica Sodality Prayer

Recite this prayer DAILY for your intentions and in union with all those also praying this prayer.

Eternal and merciful Father, I give You thanks for the gift of Your Divine Son who suffered, died and rose for all mankind. I thank You also for my Catholic Faith and ask Your help that I may grow in fidelity by prayer, by works of charity and penance, by reflection on Your Word, and by regular participation in the Sacraments of Penance and the Holy Eucharist.

You gave Saint Monica a spirit of selfless love manifested in her constant prayer for the conversion of her son Augustine. Inspired by boundless confidence in Your power to move hearts, and by the success of her prayer, I ask the grace to imitate her constancy in my prayer for [name(s)] who no longer share in the intimate life of Your Catholic family. Grant through my prayer and witness that (he/she/they) may be open to the promptings of Your Holy Spirit, and return to loving union with Your Church. Grant also that my prayer be ever hopeful and that I may never judge another, for You alone can read hearts. I ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

#### Total Consecration to Jesus thru Mary 33-Day Preparation begins: April 28

St. Louis de Montfort (1673 – 1716) had a profound and deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and wrote extensively on the virtues of Our Lady, what true devotion to her consists of, and how the faithful need to turn to her as the way to her Son, Jesus Christ. He recommends that the faithful formally consecrate themselves to the Blessed Mother. For this end he developed a specific 33-day program consisting of various prayers and readings to help the faithful detach themselves from the world and bond themselves more closely with Christ through the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Louis de Montfort stands in a long tradition of saints completely devoted to Our Lady, and his work has been influential in the lives of many other saints, one of the most famous among them is Pope St. John Paul II, who took his papal motto, "Totus Tuus" (Totally Yours) from de Montfort.

This "Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary" consists of an initial 12-day preparation followed by a period of three consecutive weeks, each week focusing on a different theme. It is recommended that the consecration be done on a major feast day of Our Lady, meaning that the preparation would begin 33 days prior. That is, after the 33-day program is completed, the formal Act of Consecration is made on a Marian feast day. Once you make the consecration, it is for life. It can then be renewed annually. Keep in mind that this is a formal consecration to Our Lady, like a vow. Through this 33-day program you are giving Mary ALL of yourself your heart, your mind, and your soul - in order to bring you closer and help you be more faithful to her Son, Jesus Christ. Also, that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan - i.e. this consecration allows her the free reign in your life to make you holy (she assists you, through the Holy Spirit, to conform to her virtues) and to use your prayers, sacrifices, and sufferings for the greater glory of God.

The next preparation begins on Wednesday, April 28, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on May 31, the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

#### Reverend Joseph A. Nosal, Pastor of Ss. Cyril & Methodius, 1967 - 1977

After Father Andrew Forish's departure (see last week's bulletin), Reverend Joseph A. Nosal was appointed Pastor in June, 1967 and served until 1977. Father Nosal was born November 21, 1923. He was a pupil of St. Cyril's school and was ordained to the priesthood on May 20, 1950. His first Mass and ordination festivities were held at St. Cyril's on May 21. He was assigned to St. Edward parish in Detroit and served there for two years. He then was assigned to St. Cyril's and served as Assistant Pastor from 1952 to 1961. He taught Religion and Sociology classes and worked with the high school students, serving as photographer for the Cyrilite school newspaper and yearbook. He left St. Cyril's in February, 1961 and became an assistant at St. Lucy Church in St. Clair Shores and then in June, 1966 became an assistant at Ascension Parish in Warren. In June, 1967 the parishioners were happy to hear that one of their own would be returning to St. Cyril's as its Pastor, replacing Father Forish.

He was described as a good-natured person, dependable and cheerful with a good sense of humor. With the urging of Father Nosal, the St. Cyril Men's Club was

formed on June 20, 1968 with 12 members for the purpose of managing and leading the school athletic program. Father's task was not easy, since many changes had come about in the Catholic Church during this time. The English language was introduced into the Ordinary of the Mass, communal confession was initiated, the Sisters' habits were changed and several other changes took place that many parishioners found difficult to accept. After the Soviet Union invasion of Czechoslovakia in 1968, many Slovak refugees migrated to the United States from the Communist regime and St. Cyril's opened its doors to welcome them and provide assistance.

The parish faced many challenges in the 1970's. With the neighborhood changing and a decline in school enrollment, talks began about a merger of St. Cyril's school with St. Thomas, just a few blocks away. The merger was never realized, and in June 1971, with heavy hearts, St. Cyril's was forced to close both the grade school and high school. This was a very sad time for the priests, the sisters, parishioners, students and alumni of St. Cyril's. However, the spirit of St. Cyril's was not diminished during this time. Father Nosal arranged for the repainting of the church and repairs to the pipe organ. In 1972, the spirit of Slovak heritage was reignited when the parishioners focused their time and energies by taking part in the Slovak Festivals that were held in downtown Detroit annually until 1988. On June 1, 1975 Father Nosal celebrated his Silver Jubilee with a Mass of Thanksgiving and a banquet attended by parishioners and friends that filled the entire auditorium. In 1977, he transferred to Sacred Heart Parish in Yale, Michigan. He died April 23, 2017 at the age of 93.
