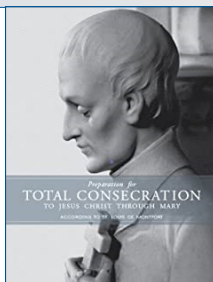

Prep Begins: Tuesday, July 13

Consecration Date:**August 15 after the 6:00PM Holy Mass**

The next 33-day preparation for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, St. Louis de Montfort, begins on Tuesday, July 13, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on August 15, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Once you make the consecration, it is for life. It can then be renewed annually. This is a formal consecration to Our Lady, like a vow. You are giving Mary ALL of yourself - your heart, your mind, and your soul - in order to bring you closer and help you be more faithful to her Son, Jesus Christ and that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan. She assists you, through the Holy Spirit, to conform to her virtues and to use your prayers, sacrifices, and sufferings for the greater glory of God. CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH

THE WONDERS OF OUR SPIRITUAL FATHER

**(Private) Consecration Date:****August 17 (Performed Privately)**

Mary is our spiritual mother, and St. Joseph is our spiritual father. The spiritual fatherhood of St. Joseph is extremely important for our spiritual growth. Everything we have given to Jesus and Mary can also be given to St. Joseph. The hearts of Jesus, Mary, and St. Joseph are one. **Program Overview:** Consecration to St. Joseph emulates the tried-and-true preparation method employed by St. Louis de Montfort in his Marian consecration, highlighting many of St. Joseph's titles, privileges, and heroic virtues. The program of preparation and consecration takes 33 days. You'll spend about 20-30 minutes a day on a short exposition on one of the invocations in the powerful Litany of St. Joseph, followed by a reading on St. Joseph, concluding with the recitation of the Litany of St. Joseph. If you miss a day, just make it up and continue your preparation. On the day of your consecration, feel free to use whichever act of consecration you like best; you can also make up your own, if you like. A limited number of books are available in the Parish Office for \$15.

July 13th—Third Apparition of Our Lady of Fatima



During World War I, Pope Benedict XV made repeated but forlorn pleas for peace, and finally in May 1917, made a direct appeal to the Blessed Mother to intercede for peace in the world. Soon, Our Lady began to appear at Fatima, Portugal to three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos, age 10, and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 9 and 7. Fatima was a small village about 70 miles north of Lisbon.

July, 13, 1917: On July 13 the three children assembled at the Cova and again saw the indescribably beautiful Lady over the holm oak tree. Lucia asked what she wanted, and Mary replied: "I want you to come here on the 13th of next month and to continue to pray the Rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary in order to obtain peace for the world and the end of the war, because only she can help you."

Lucia then asked her who she was and for a miracle so everyone would believe: "Continue to come here every month. In October, I will tell you who I am and what I want, and I will perform a miracle for all to see and believe."

Lucia made some requests for sick people, to which Mary replied that she would cure some but not others, and that all must say the Rosary to obtain these graces during the year. And she continued: "Sacrifice yourselves for sinners and say many times, especially when you make some

sacrifice: O Jesus, it is for love of You, for the conversion of sinners, and in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary."

The Vision of Hell: As she spoke these words, Mary opened her hands and rays of light from them seemed to penetrate the earth revealing to the children a terrifying vision of hell full of demons and lost souls amid indescribable horrors. This vision of hell was the first part of the three-part secret of Fatima, which was unknown until the writing of Sister Lucia's Third Memoir dated August 31, 1941.

The children looked up to the sad face of the Blessed Virgin, who spoke to them kindly: "You have seen hell where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish in the world devotion to my Immaculate Heart. If what I say to you is done, many souls will be saved and there will be peace. The war is going to end; but if people do not cease offending God, a worse one will break out during the pontificate of Pius XI. When you see a night illumined by an unknown light, know that this is the great sign given you by God that he is about to punish the world for its crimes, by means of war, famine, and persecutions of the Church and of the Holy Father.

"To prevent this, I shall come to ask for the consecration of Russia to my Immaculate Heart, and the Communion of Reparation on the First Saturdays. If my requests are heeded, Russia will be converted and there will be peace; if not, she will spread her errors throughout the world causing wars and persecutions of the Church. The good will be martyred; the Holy Father will have much to suffer; various nations will be annihilated. In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph. The Holy Father will consecrate Russia to me and she will be converted, and a period of peace will be granted to the world."

This concludes the second part of the secret. The third part was not made public until the year 2000 at the beatification ceremonies of Jacinta and Francisco Marto. Mary specifically told Lucia not to tell anyone about the secret at this stage, apart from Francisco, before continuing: "When you pray the Rosary, say after each mystery: O my Jesus! Forgive us, save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to heaven, especially those who are most in need." After assuring Lucia that there was nothing more, Mary disappeared off into the distance.

First World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly • "You are not alone."

Isn't Grandparents Day in September?

Yes, in the United States the Sunday after Labor Day was designated by President Carter as Grandparents' Day. Some other countries also have a national Grandparents' Day, but they are celebrated on other dates. In Spain and Brazil, Grandparents' Day is July 26, the Feast of Jesus' grandparents, Ss. Joachim and Ann.

What is World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly?

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly (WDGE) is a day set aside by Pope Francis for people the world over to reach out to grandparents and the elderly among them. It is a day to bring our grandparents or elderly neighbor to mass with us, to spend time with them, to recognize their importance in the family, their faith and their wisdom. Most of all, it is a day for prayer and works of mercy.

Why this date and why this year?

The Holy Father attributes his own faith to the example and teaching of his grandmother and speaks often of the significant role grandparents have in handing down the faith. He chose this year for the first WDGE because he is concerned for the elderly who have been so isolated during the pandemic, particularly those in nursing homes. Through his words and through our action and words, he wants them to know that God remembers them and cares for them. They are not alone. He chose the fourth Sunday of July for what will be an annual celebration because it is the Sunday that is closest to the Feast of Ss. Joachim and Ann.

Will the parish do anything special for this day?

Yes, the Saturday evening and all Sunday Holy Masses will acknowledge and honor the grandparents and elderly of the parish and our visitors. A copy of Pope Francis' message to Grandparents and the Elderly, as well as a prayer he has written for them, will be given to them after Mass.

What can we do as a family to celebrate World Day for Grandparents and Elderly?

Start now by helping your children think of special things they can do for their grandparents or a neighbor. Talk with your children about memories of your own grandparents and parents, particularly things they taught you about faith and loving God. Call your parents now and invite them to come to Mass with you on July 25. If they are not able to come to Mass, and if they struggle with technology, offer to help them join the 9:30AM Holy Mass by livestreaming (www.saintcyrils.church).

What if our grandparents are deceased?

Although they are no longer present in our daily life, our bond with our grandparents and other family continues on as we pray for them and we trust they pray for us. We can remember to pray especially for them on WDGE and, perhaps, make a visit to the cemetery. Also, just as there are children who do not have grandparents, so there are elderly who have no grandchildren. Make a point of visiting an older neighbor or a relative who might be lonely.

My parents and I don't get along/My child and I aren't speaking to each other.

This is a very painful situation for many. Sometimes the injuries of the past are so deep and so painful that we don't want to risk further pain. Or we are so angry that it is impossible to control our temper. WDGE is not something we can look forward to or think about celebrating. Pope Francis realizes ruptures exist in families, and the feelings of hurt and anger are real. He encourages those of us in such situations to reflect on the story of the Prodigal Son/The Forgiving Father. Can we ask ourselves in prayer, "Is there some aspect of this situation where I can acknowledge my fault and apologize? Can I forgive the person who has hurt me so deeply if they can take at least some responsibility, or even if they take none at all?" Forgiving injuries may be the most difficult of the spiritual works of mercy; but, because it is in imitation of Jesus' greatest act of love, it can also be the most rewarding.
