



2021 Parish Advent Giving Projects

The remaining Advent Giving Projects are outlined below. If you have questions about any of the projects, contact: Erin Rybicki at ChristianService@saintcyrils.church or Sandi Brady in the Parish Office.

Christian Service Fund: Donations made to the parish Christian Service Fund during Advent will be divided among Catholic Charities' Senior Outreach Program and Image of God Crisis Pregnancy Centers. You can contribute to this fund online using PushPay or place a check made out to Ss. Cyril & Methodius in a white Advent giving envelope and put it in the collection basket by December 25, 2021.

Senior Outreach: When the Covid shutdown occurred, Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan started a new initiative to deliver groceries to low-income seniors and people with disabilities. They discovered homebound individuals and couples who had struggled to get groceries prior to the pandemic. Because of this, the initiative is now a continuing program with volunteers delivering groceries, incontinence items, and cleaning products to 600 individuals in the tri-county area. A monetary **donation** to this program will help buy a commercial freezer so meat can be purchased in larger quantities (and lower prices), frozen, and stored until it can be delivered to clients. Any additional donations will help buy a refrigerator, and incontinence and cleaning products. Image of God Crisis Pregnancy Centers: For many years, these four centers have quietly and consistently been a haven sharing God's love for local pregnant women in crisis and in need. The centers provide free pregnancy tests and ultrasounds, maternity clothes, parenting classes, baby clothing, and baby furniture and supplies. Just as important, the staff offers loving counsel and guidance to help young mothers with life goals like finishing their education, building better relationships, developing a spiritual life, or finding a job. Donations to Image of God CPC will help meet essential costs, such as rent and utilities, so all four centers can continue serving women and babies in 2022. EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE FOR ADULTS

- 1. I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me.
- Do I give God time every day in prayer? Do I seek to love Him with my whole heart?
- · Have I been involved with superstitious practices or have I been involved with the occult?
 - Do I seek to surrender myself to God's word as taught by the Church?
 - Have I ever received communion in the state of mortal sin?
- · Have I ever deliberately told a lie in Confession or have I withheld a mortal sin from the priest in Confession?
 - Are there other "gods" in my life? Money, Security, Power, People, etc.?

2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

- Have I used God's name in vain: lightly or carelessly?
 Have I been angry with God?
- Have I wished evil upon any other person? Have I insulted a sacred person or abused a sacred object?

3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.

- · Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation?
- Have I tried to observe Sunday as a family day and a day of rest?
 Do I do needless work on Sunday?

4. Honor your father and your mother.

- Do I honor and obey my parents? Have I neglected my duties to my spouse and children?
 - Do I try to bring peace into my home life?
- Have I given my family good religious example? Do I care for my aged and infirm relatives?

5. You shall not kill.

- Have I had an abortion or encouraged or helped anyone to have an abortion? Have I physically harmed anyone?
 - Have I abused alcohol or drugs? Have I participated in or approved of euthanasia?
 - Did I give scandal to anyone, thereby leading him or her into sin?
 - Have I been angry or resentful?
 Have I harbored hatred in my heart?
 - Have I mutilated myself through any form of sterilization? Have I encouraged or condoned sterilization?
 - Have I engaged, in any way, in sins against human life such as artificial insemination or in vitro fertilization?

6. You shall not commit adultery.

- · Have I been faithful to my marriage vows in thought and action?
 - Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage?
- · Have I used any method of contraception or artificial birth control in my marriage?
- Has each sexual act in my marriage been open to the transmission of new life?
- Have I been guilty of masturbation?
 Do I seek to control my thoughts and imaginations?
- Have I respected all members of the opposite sex, or have I thought of other people as mere objects?
 Have I been guilty of any homosexual activity?
 - Do I seek to be chaste in my thoughts, words, actions?
 Am I careful to dress modestly?

7. You shall not steal.

- Have I stolen what is not mine? Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen?
- Do I waste time at work, school, and home? Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
 - Do I pay my debts promptly? Do I seek to share what I have with the poor?
 - · Have I cheated anyone out of what is justly theirs, for example creditors, insurance companies, big corporations?

8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

- Have I lied? Have I gossiped? Do I speak badly of others behind their back?
- Am I sincere in my dealings with others? Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
 - Do I keep secret what should be kept confidential? Have I injured the reputation of others by slanders?

9. You shall not desire your neighbor's wife.

- Have I consented to impure thoughts?
 Have I caused them by impure reading, movies, television, conversation or curiosity?
 Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?
 - · Have I behaved in an inappropriate way with members of the opposite sex: flirting, being superficial, etc.?

10. You shall not desire your neighbor's goods.

- Am I jealous of what other people have? Do I envy the families or possessions of others?
 - Am I greedy or selfish?
 Are material possessions the purpose of my life?
