

The baby's life in the womb is an astonishing odyssey of growth and development. As science makes clear, it is at fertilization that a new, unique and genetically complete human being comes into existence. From that moment onwards each of us did not grow and develop into a human being. We grew and developed as a human being.

- 18–21 days after conception, before many women will even realise they are pregnant, the baby's heart is beating.
- At 8 weeks every organ to be found in a fully grown adult person is already formed.
- At 11 weeks fingerprints and fingernails can be clearly seen.
- At 12 weeks the baby's lips open and close. The baby can turn her
 or his head and move around the womb.
- At 16 weeks the baby reacts to sound, sucks, swallows and yawns.
- At 18 weeks most mothers feel the baby moving. The baby exercises her or his developing muscles by pushing with the feet and head. The baby now sucks her or his thumb.
- At 24 weeks the baby continues moving, hearing and perhaps even dreaming.
- At 30–40 weeks the baby, if protected from harm, will continue to grow bigger and stronger until it is time to be born.

Lord Jesus, you are the source and lover of life. Reawaken in us respect for every human life. Help us to see in each child the marvelous work of our Creator. Open our hearts to welcome every child as a unique and wonderful gift. Guide the work of doctors, nurses and midwives. BLOOD CRISIS! Calling All Blood Donors!

The American Red Cross is facing a national blood crisis – its worst blood shortage in over a decade, posing a concerning risk to patient care. Doctors have been forced to make difficult decisions about who receives blood transfusions and who will need to wait until more products become available. Blood and platelet donations

are critically needed to help prevent further delays in vital medical treatments. Please schedule your blood donation today.

What is Causing the Blood Shortage Crisis?

- 10% overall blood donation decline since March 2020.
- 62% drop in college and high school blood drives due to the pandemic. Student donors accounted for approximately 25% of donors in 2019 accounted for just approximately 10% during the pandemic.
- Ongoing blood drive cancellations due to illness, weather-related closures and staffing limitations.
- Additional factors like a surge of COVID-19 cases and an active flu season may compound the already bad situation

At a time when many businesses and organizations across the country are experiencing pandemic challenges, the Red Cross is no different. We are all learning how to live in this new environment, how we spend our time, where we work, how we give back, how we make a difference in the lives of others – donating blood must continue to be part of it.

Supply of Critical Blood Types

The Red Cross, which supplies 40% of the nation's blood supply, has had to limit blood product distributions to hospitals as a result of the shortage. In fact, some hospitals may not receive 1 in 4 blood products they need.

Blood cannot be manufactured or stockpiled and can only be made available through the kindness of volunteer donors. Less than a one-day supply of critical blood types in recent weeks.

Please consider booking additional appointments further out due to the fact that while availability of drives may be impacted, the need for blood remains constant.
