2022 Parish Lenten Projects

During Lent, as we purge and renew our hearts, the parish has several projects for us to join together in our almsgiving and so better benefit our neighbors in need. School and Church Construction in Kahama Diocese, Tanzania/Bishop Minde: Thanks be to God!

Enrollment is steadily growing at **Ss. Cyril & Methodius Primary School**, which was built with financial assistance from our parish. The school opened its doors for the first kindergarten class in 2012 and grew to include primary grades in 2017. As the school continues to grow, construction of additional classrooms, offices and a student dining hall are underway and additional funds are necessary to complete this project. A second building project in Kahama, the construction of **Ss. Simon and Jude Thaddeus** church, is in the roofing phase; funds are needed to complete this project as well. To help the children who will learn in these classrooms and the community of Ss. Simon and Jude Thaddeus that will worship together in the new church, place your monetary gift in a blue Lenten Offering envelope and place it in the Sunday collection basket; or make your donation online using PushPay by Easter Sunday, April 17. Please make checks out to *Ss. Cyril & Methodius* and include *Tanzania* on the memo line. Note: per the IRS, donations to international projects are not tax-deductible.

Christian Service Fund/Monetary Projects Donations made to the parish Christian Service Fund during Lent will be distributed to three local projects. You can donate to this fund online using PushPay or by placing cash or a check made out to *Ss. Cyril & Methodius* in a white Lenten Offering envelope and putting it in the Sunday collection basket by Easter Sunday, April 17.

•Lifespan Wee Care Some of Wee Care's most dire needs are for cribs, car seats and strollers. Because of legal concerns, used items can't be given out by pregnancy help centers; these items must be new. To help them purchase these expensive necessities for the families they serve, a portion of the donations made to the Christian Service fund during Lent will be given to Wee Care for this purpose. To donate directly to Wee Care, place a check payable to: *Lifespan Wee Care* in a white Lenten Offering envelope. •St. Christine Christian Services (SCCS) While the majority of the food served by the soup kitchen or distributed by the food bank is non-perishable, many perishable items, such as meat, vegetables and fruit, and dairy products must be purchased. A

portion of the Christian Service fund donations will be given to St. Christine's for this purpose. To donate directly to SCCS, place a check payable to: *St. Christine Christian Services* in a white Lenten Offering envelope.

•Camp Ozanam/St. Vincent DePaul Summer Camp Scholarship Fund A week at summer camp can be the highlight of the summer and a source of treasured memories, especially for children whose families are struggling. This summer, St. Vincent de Paul Detroit will be offering five weeklong overnight camp sessions for boys and girls ages 8 to 14 at its Camp Ozanam, on Lake Huron. Daily Mass, prayer and catechesis are built in to the program along with swimming, crafts, sports and other outdoor fun. The campers all live in southeast Michigan, and the majority are from families in financial need. Some are in foster care, or have experienced emotional hardship such as the loss of a parent. All campers attend camp at no cost to their families. Their fees for camp are paid entirely by donations. A portion of donations made to the parish Christian Service Fund during Lent will help provide scholarships for local children to attend Camp Ozanam. To donate directly to the scholarship fund, place a check payable to: *St. Vincent de Paul Detroit*, include *Camp* on memo line and put in a white Lenten Offering envelope.

- Have I engaged, in any way, in sins against human life such as artificial insemination or in vitro fertilization?

6. You shall not commit adultery.

PLENARY INDULGENCE on DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY • April 24 Begin Novena • Good Friday, April 15

All Holy Masses on Sunday, April 24, are Divine Mercy Masses. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be recited after each Holy Mass.

HOW SHOULD WE PREPARE FOR THIS GREAT FEAST of MERCY?

Jesus told St. Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened". (Diary 699) Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to Confession and then receive Him in Holy Communion on the Feast of Mercy - the Sunday after Easter, which is now called Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus promised that "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary 699). To observe this feast, we should commence a Novena to the Divine Mercy on Good Friday. The Novena includes special intentions for each day and is concluded with the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

Thus, to fittingly observe the Feast of Mercy, we should...

- Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter
- Come to Jesus with a humble and contrite heart, repenting of all your sins. Go to confession (with a priest) 20 days before or after the feast, as approved by the Church.
- Receive Holy Communion on the Day of the Feast of Divine Mercy. (D 1072)
- Venerate the image of Divine Mercy on the Feast of Divine Mercy. (Diary 47, 48 & 49)
- Be merciful as God is merciful. Practice works of Mercy, physically by helping others or spiritually by your prayers of intercession.
- Be open to receive a Plenary Indulgence as Jesus promised: that of forgiveness of all sin and punishment; which is available to you on the Feast of Divine Mercy. (D 699). In simple terms this means that if we go to Confession and receive Holy Communion, we can obtain the total forgiveness of all sins and their due punishment. This means we would go straight to Heaven!
- To venerate a sacred image or statue simply means to perform some act or make some gesture of deep religious respect toward it because of the person whom it represents in this case, our Most Merciful Savior.

In His revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, Jesus made mention of His desires concerning the Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) on 14 different occasions. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in entry 699 of the Diary of St. Faustina Kowalska: *y* daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come

forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.

Benefit Concert for Ukraine Divine Mercy Sunday, April 24

Young concert pianist, Marek Janiga, from Slovakia will perform classical pieces by *Frederic Chopin, Ludwig van Beethoven, and Sergei Rachmaninoff* in the Fr. Mikus Hall on Sunday, April 24 (Time: TBD). Free-will donations will be used to provide basic needs for Ukrainian families fleeing their homes in the middle of war. More than 4 million people have fled Ukraine so far.

Slovakia, which borders Ukraine, is being inundated with refugees. The family of the artist is directly helping at the border -providing for desperate Ukrainian mothers and children seeking a safe refuge.

Come and enjoy an afternoon of classical music. Donations will be taken at the door with light reception to follow.
