## June 13th—Second Apparition of Our Lady of Fatima Monday, June 13—Marian Procession & Devotions after the 12:00 Noon Holy Mass

During World War I, Pope Benedict XV made repeated but forlorn pleas for peace, and finally in May 1917, made a direct appeal to the Blessed Mother to intercede for peace in the world. Soon, Our Lady began to appear at Fatima, Portugal to three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos, age 10, and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 9 and 7. Fatima was a small village about 70 miles north of Lisbon.

**June 13, 1917:** About 50 people turned up at the Cova da Iria on June 13 as the three children assembled near the holm oak tree where the Lady had appeared. The children then saw a flash of light followed immediately by the apparition of Mary as she spoke to Lucia: "I want you to come on the 13th of next month, to pray the Rosary every day, and to learn to read. Later, I will tell you what I want."

Lucia asked Mary to take them to heaven and was reassured in this way: "I will take Jacinta and Francisco shortly, but you will stay here for some time to come. Jesus wants to use you to make me known and loved. He wishes to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart throughout the world. I promise salvation to whoever embraces it. These souls will be dear to God, like flowers put by me to adorn his throne."

This last sentence is found in a letter written in 1927 by Sister Lucia to her confessor.

Lucia was sad at the first part of this reply and asked: "Am I to stay here alone?" Mary replied: "No, my daughter. Are you suffering a great deal? Don't lose heart. I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God."

One of the witnesses to this apparition, Maria Carreira, described how Lucia then cried out and pointed as Mary departed. She herself heard a noise like "a rocket a long way off," and looked to see a small cloud a few inches over the tree rise and move slowly towards the east until it disappeared. The crowd of pilgrims then returned to Fatima where they reported the amazing things they had seen, thus ensuring that there were between two and three thousand people present for the July apparition.



### Archbishop's Letter to the Faithful Year of Prayer for Priestly Vocations

Forming Men of the Hearts: A Pastoral Note on a Year of Prayer for Priestly Vocations by The Most Rev. Allen H. Vigneron

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Each of you is called to something great.

June 1, 2022

Our first and foundational call is for every Christian to live out a life worthy of being a child of God. We received this gift at baptism, which carries with it the joy of knowing we are made in the image and likeness of God. We need not look to externals to define who we are; this is our treasured identity that no one can take away from us. Speaking of his flock, Jesus the Good Shepherd reminds us that, "My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand." (Jn. 10:29)

Each of us is also called to his or her own specific vocation in life. God gives his children meaning and purpose by calling us to give our lives in marriage, religious life or consecrated life, or to persevere in the generous single life. Another call from Our Lord is for men to share his priesthood, to serve as spiritual fathers and shepherds to the faithful. Throughout the Gospels, Jesus asks those who seek him out the question, "What do you want me to do for you?" (Lk. 18:41)

This year, we are focused on asking for more priests. While it is good to pray for all vocations, a most immediate need is an increase of priestly vocations here in the Archdiocese of Detroit. The priesthood is essential for the Sacramental life of the Church; without the priest, we would be without the Eucharist, the Mass, and would have no one to hear our Confessions to reconcile us sinners with our Father.

In this Year of Prayer for Priestly Vocations, Our Lord Jesus Christ is calling us to pray, invite, and encourage men to the ministerial priesthood for service in the Archdiocese of Detroit. Christ is asking us to accompany these men in forming the next generation of priests. God has not stopped calling men to serve as his shepherds; he continues to issue his call, but too many young men are struggling to hear and respond to this call. It is our duty to help them hear God's voice and respond to his invitation with joy. May their free choice, the same offered to Mary at the Annunciation, be one that echoes her fiat: "[L]et it be done to me according to your word." (Lk. 1:38)

Below, I will offer details about our situation and response, but first and foremost I am asking for your vital participation in prayer. Prayer is not an after-thought, but our first thought. If we pray with faith as Jesus says, "we will be able to move mountains." (Mt. 17:20) In responding to this challenge, we pray for God to move the hearts of men to rise to the occasion and answer their call to the priesthood.

This pastoral note explains why we are embarking on a Year of Prayer for Priestly Vocations: reflecting on the ministerial priesthood and its importance to the life of the Church, looking at our current situation in the Archdiocese in reference to priestly vocations, and offering to all the faithful a word of encouragement as we take up this most crucial task.

While I will speak openly about the challenge before us, the underlying message is a call to hope. God has not abandoned his Church and will certainly not leave us in our time of need. Each year we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ at Easter; this is the basis of this hope, made our own through our sharing in his death and resurrection. St. Paul reminds us that after our trials, "[H]ope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." (Rm. 5:5) With these words in mind, we give thanks to God ahead of time for the abundant fruit that will be born from our efforts of a year focused on praying for more priestly vocations.

# The Most Holy Trinity

Each Sunday at the Holy Mass, we stand and profess our Faith. While most Catholics are familiar with the Nicene Creed and the Apostles' Creed, most do not know that the Catholic Church has three approved Creeds - the third being 'The Athanasian Creed!'

Throughout the centuries, the very teaching of the Trinity has been attacked by some of the worst heresies! The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that the Trinity: "is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the Truths of Faith." Written in the 5th century, the Athanasian Creed is often a forgotten treasure of Holy Mother Church, defending the very doctrine of the Trinity. On this Blessed Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, let us recall the words of this ancient Creed and give glory to our Triune God!

# The Athanasian Creed

Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all, keep the Catholic faith.

For unless a person keeps this faith whole and entire, he will undoubtedly be lost forever.

This is what the Catholic faith teaches: we worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity.

Neither confounding the Persons, nor dividing the substance.

For there is one person of the Father, another of the Son, another of the Holy Spirit.

But the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit have one divinity, equal glory, and coeternal majesty.

What the Father is, the Son is, and the Holy Spirit is.

The Father is uncreated, the Son is uncreated, and the Holy Spirit is uncreated.

The Father is boundless, the Son is boundless, and the Holy Spirit is boundless.

The Father is eternal, the Son is eternal, and the Holy Spirit is eternal.

Nevertheless, there are not three eternal beings, but one eternal being.

So there are not three uncreated beings, nor three boundless beings,

but one uncreated being and one boundless being.

*Likewise, the Father is omnipotent, the Son is omnipotent, the Holy Spirit is omnipotent.* 

Yet there are not three omnipotent beings, but one omnipotent being.

Thus the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God.

However, there are not three gods, but one God.

The Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, and the Holy Spirit is Lord.

However, there as not three lords, but one Lord.

For as we are obliged by Christian truth to acknowledge every Person singly to be God and Lord, so too are we forbidden by the Catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.

The Father was not made, nor created, nor generated by anyone.

The Son is not made, nor created, but begotten by the Father alone.

The Holy Spirit is not made, nor created, nor generated, but proceeds from the Father and the Son.

There is, then, one Father, not three fathers; one Son, not three sons; one Holy Spirit, not three holy spirits.

In this Trinity, there is nothing before or after, nothing greater or less. The entire three Persons are coeternal and coequal with one another.

So that in all things, as is has been said above,

the Unity is to be worshipped in Trinity and the Trinity in Unity.

He, therefore, who wishes to be saved,

must believe thus about the Trinity.
