Abortion is now legal in Michigan at an unprecedented level and the Archdiocese of Detroit is committed to accompanying women and families in need, with greater resolve than ever. In the AOD, we do this largely through Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan, our charitable arm, and through the Archdiocese's Evangelization and Missionary Discipleship Department. In particular, *Walking with Moms in Need* (WWMIN) is a ministry to help parishioners identify and create local resources that provide assistance to pregnant and parenting moms in need, and Project Rachel is an important ministry for individuals who have been harmed by abortion.

Christmas is on the horizon and food and energy costs are climbing, with no end in sight. As we are all tightening our belts, let's keep our hearts open to those around us who are affected even more than we may be. Giving Tree: The Giving Tree will be filled with gift requests from children who are receiving services from Macomb County Community Mental Health programs, and for families and seniors who are assisted by St. Dominic's Outreach Center, as well as individuals from our neighborhood. Please bring your **wrapped gift, with the gift tag attached**, to the Parish Office by December 11 or leave it under the Giving Tree when you come to Sunday Holy Mass. To assist the growing number of people in Detroit who are in need this year (so far 354 families, totaling 1700 persons from the Brightmoor neighborhood, have asked St. Christine's Christian Services for help this Christmas,) there will also be gift tags requesting **gift cards in the amount of \$25** that will be given to families assisted by St. Christine's Christian Services and St. Dominic's Outreach Center, as well as our own parishioners who are in need. Gift cards can be placed in the Sunday collection basket or dropped off in the Parish Office by December 11.

Mary's Children Family Center Collection: The day program at Mary's Children continues caring for and bringing God's love to adults suffering from traumatic brain injury. Students begin their day together with the rosary, then participate in individualized projects and activities, coming together in the center's chapel to pray the Divine Mercy chaplet before going to their homes. In order to help the center offset its significant expenses, we will be collecting **Lysol wipes, paper towels, toilet paper, facial tissue and individual servings of applesauce**. Please bring your donation when you come to Mass on December 10 or 11 and place it on the cart in the vestibule or outside the Fr. Mikus Hall. Please Note: **This is a one-time collection.** We will not be collecting these items throughout advent. They will only be collected December 10 & 11.

Food Collection for St. Dominic's Outreach Center: Groceries are currently the greatest need that parents and seniors are requesting from St. Dominic's. Prices are high, food stamps have been reduced, and the need is significant. The staff at St. Dominic's hopes to provide each of their families with a complete Christmas dinner in addition to supplementing their daily needs. Please bring your **non-perishable food donation in a paper grocery bag or cardboard box** when you come to Mass on December 10 or 11 and place it on the cart in the vestibule or outside the Fr. Mikus Hall. Particular Christmas dinner needs are: **Instant mashed potatoes, stuffing mix, candied yams, canned vegetables and fruits, canned gravy, dessert mixes; but any non-perishable food is greatly appreciated.** Please Note: **This is a one-time collection.** We will not be collecting food throughout advent. Food will only be collected December 10 & 11.

St. Nicholas' Helpers: This advent, give the gift of your time. **Volunteers with larger vehicles and others to help load** donated items are needed Monday morning, December 12, to make the deliveries to St. Dominic's in Detroit or to Mary's Children in Clawson. Volunteers are also needed on Tuesday, December 13 to deliver the Giving Tree gifts to the Macomb County Community Mental Health office in Mt. Clemens and gift cards to St. Christine's Christian Services in northwest Detroit. A little bit of your time will go a long way toward helping the parish deliver Christmas to local people in need. Slovak Seminarian Sponsorship: Since its foundation, our parish has been blessed with the generous pastoral care of priests from Slovakia. By assisting the seminary in Bratislava financially, we can show our appreciation to the Slovak Bishops for their continued support of Ss. Cyril and Methodius and help build the Church in Slovakia. Currently 16 men are preparing for the priesthood. You can help cover their fees and expenses with a **gift of \$300**. If you would like to **sponsor the seminary**, please contact Sandi Brady in the Parish Office. You will receive a Christmas ornament with the photo of one of the seminarians to place in your home as a reminder to pray for him.

Kahama Diocese Church and School Construction Projects: The Diocese of Kahama, where our sister parish is located, has recently welcomed its newly-consecrated bishop, Christopher Nkoronko. As Bishop Nkoronko begins his tenure, he plans first to wrap up some of the building projects that Bishop Minde initiated. Among them are the completion of the roof of Ss. Simon and Jude Thaddeus Church in Busoko and the addition to Ss. Cyril and Methodius Primary School in Kagongwa. You can **contribute to the Kahama diocese building fund** online using PushPay or place a check made payable to Ss. Cyril and Methodius in a blue Advent Giving envelope and put it in the collection basket by December 25, 2022. This international donation is not tax-deductible, per the IRS.

Christian Service Fund: **Donations made to the parish Christian Service Fund** during advent will be divided between **Image of God Crisis Pregnancy Centers and (Slovak Parish in Chicago)**. You can contribute to this fund online using PushPay or place a check made payable to Ss. Cyril and Methodius in a white Advent Giving envelope and put it in the collection basket by December 25, 2022.

- † **Image of God Crisis Pregnancy Centers:** Now that abortion is unrestricted and unregulated in our state, now more than ever, women facing unplanned pregnancies must know there is a better choice. Crisis pregnancy centers partner with women to help them move from crisis to the confidence to care for their babies. Image of God Crisis Pregnancy Center ministers to women at three centers in Detroit and one in Madison Heights. Our donation (see page 6) will help Image of God meet essential costs, such as rent, utilities, and a social media presence, so all four centers can continue caring for women and babies in 2023.
- † **Slovak Mission in Chicago:** Did you know that Chicago is the new home to a small and thriving community of families that have recently moved from Slovakia to the United States? Much like our parish 100 years ago, they have a pastor from Slovakia, so Mass, the sacraments, and Christian formation are all available to them in their familiar Slovak language. Through their "Slovak School" they work diligently to hand on their language, faith and culture to their children. Also like St. Cyril's in its early years, the community hopes to find a church building of their own. This Christmas, we can show our solidarity with this "sister" community with a donation to their building fund (see page 6).
