



In accordance with the AOD Guidelines, I will be overseeing the Circle of Grace Training on March 22, during class for K - 8th grades. There will be different talks accommodating the students' maturity level. "Circle of Grace is the approved safe environment training program for elementary through high school students enrolled in religious education in the Archdiocese. The goal of the Circle of Grace program is to educate and empower children and young people to actively participate in a safe environment for themselves and others.

Circle of Grace is the love and goodness of God that surrounds us and all others. It is the recognition that God is with us always and is there to help us in difficult situations. Through the Circle of Grace Program, adults assist children and youth to recognize God's love by understanding that each of us lives and moves within a Circle of Grace. The Circle of Grace program teaches children and young people to seek help from a trusted adult, reinforcing God's presence in their real life struggles.

If you decide that your wish is for your **child not to attend**, please fill out the **'Opt Out Form'** sent home February 8^h or contact your child's teacher to receive another copy. So it is not confusing, if you choose for your child to attend, you do nothing but bring them to class. The students whose parents are opting out will go to another classroom during the lesson and return when it is over. All students please report to their normal classrooms that evening. Of course, if you have any questions you are free to contact me at (586) 726-6911 or cschuller@saintcyrils.church. I would like to once again share something that happened a few years ago during the Circle of Grace Training. When the 7 year olds were asked if they were approached by a man at a park to help him find his lost puppy, would they go, one sweet young man answered yes. With beautiful compassion, this young boy wanted to help someone. He learned from his wonderful Catholic parents to help others (Works of Mercy). You understand that I was hoping for a "no, tell him to ask an adult". I explained that we do want to help others but we must also know when it is appropriate. We must trust God's Grace and the funny feeling in the stomach the Holy Spirit gives us when something just isn't right; that message from Him telling us to run to a trusted adult for help. The reason I share this is that I feel if one child learns from this program to help preserve their innocence and wellbeing, it is well worth one week's inconvenience to our class schedule. Northland Family Prayer News • April 1


As our Lenten journey continues, we know the Lord's passion is drawing near - when He shed all His blood to save us and reconcile us back to God the Father. May we draw closer to Christ and become more aware of brothers and sisters who are struggling around us or even facing persecution - especially the vulnerable and unborn. Please consider fasting and/or adding pro-life prayers into your day (perhaps a rosary or chaplet). If you wish to pray with others, please consider the following items:

- The monthly prayer and witness event outside the Northland Family Planning Clinic, 3810 17 Mile Rd. (west of Ryan Rd.) takes place Saturday, April 1, from 11:30AM 12:30PM. Bring your friends, family, rosary and weather gear. Park in the shopping center lots nearby no parking is allowed at the clinic. Prayer events usually last an hour, but may be shortened due to the weather, and you can also pray nearby from your car.
- The 40 Days for Life campaign runs daily until April 2. People can pray on the public sidewalk in front of the clinic or nearby from their vehicles during daylight hours (typically 7AM to 7PM). Once again, no parking is allowed at the clinic. Prayer groups invite you to join them on Tuesday's from 9:45AM to 11:15AM and Thursday's from 10AM to 11AM.

A Pro-Life rosary is usually prayed each Saturday at church. The Joyful and Luminous Mysteries are prayed before Mass, starting at 8:10AM, and the Sorrowful and Glorious Mysteries are prayed after 9AM Mass, starting around 9:45AM. Schedule is subject to change.

St. Monica Sodality Mass • Saturday, March 25

The Via Matris - The Way of Our Sorrowful Mother is a reflection on the life of our Lady from the infancy of Jesus to His death and burial. The third station is the search for Jesus lost in Jerusalem which happened when Jesus was 12 years old and the Holy Family had gone to celebrate Passover. While the Blessed Mother and Saint Joseph searched diligently for Jesus for three days, before finding Him in the Temple, they did not understand His reaction "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" (Lk 2:49). If we are truly honest, most people know what it's like to be lost or to be concerned about others who are. May we entrust ourselves and our loved ones to the care and protection of the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph - and especially Jesus, who came into this world to seek the lost.

The next St. Monica Sodality Holy Mass takes place next Saturday, March 25. at 5:30PM. After Mass we will pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet and the St. Monica Sodality Prayer. "PRAY: The Story of (Venerable Father) Patrick Peyton" is an inspiring documentary about a poor, uneducated Irish immigrant who sets sail for America in 1928 with nothing but his faith and dreams of becoming a millionaire. Arriving in Pennsylvania and unable to find work, he accepts the position as a janitor at the cathedral, which rekindles his long-lost desire to become a priest and changes the course of his life. Nearing ordination, his life takes a radical turn when he is stricken with tuberculosis. Facing certain death, he sinks into despair. A visit from his mentor, who delivers a simple message to pray, lifts the darkness. Taking his advice to heart, Patrick prays fervently to Mary, the Mother of Christ, for her intercession and he experiences a miraculous recovery. Feeling deep gratitude, he dedicates his life to telling all the world about the power of prayer and encourages families everywhere to bring prayer into their homes. Never taking "No" for an answer, he convinces Hollywood's biggest stars to help him spread the message, "The family that prays together stays together," through the power of mass media including radio, television, and film. Father Peyton's fame spreads around the world and audiences in the millions flock to his public prayer rallies. This is the story of a tireless missionary, an unlikely hero and one of history's greatest advocates for family prayer.

Monetary Donations to Parish Christian Service Fund: Help local organizations serve local people in need with a monetary gift. Donations made to the parish Christian Service fund during lent will be divided between:

- **Gianna House:** Disaster struck this local residence for pregnant teens on December 26. Near zero temperatures caused the pipes of the home's fire sprinkler system to burst, causing extensive damage to the entire building and rendering it temporarily uninhabitable. Most of the furnishings are a complete loss, as well as all the baby items that had been donated for the teen moms and for moms in the Gianna House neighborhood. Financial assistance is needed to help Gianna House recover from this catastrophe so they can return to providing a home to teens and support services for neighborhood moms.
- St. Vincent de Paul Camp Ozanam Camper Scholarships: A week at summer camp can be the highlight of the summer and a source of treasured memories, especially for children whose families are struggling. This summer, for the 100th year, St. Vincent de Paul Detroit will be offering five weeklong overnight camp sessions for boys and girls ages 8 to 14 at its Camp Ozanam, on Lake Huron. Daily Mass, prayer and catechesis are built in to the program along with swimming, crafts, sports and other outdoor fun. The campers all live in southeast Michigan, and the majority are from families in financial need. Some are in foster care, or have experienced emotional hardship such as the loss of a parent. All campers attend camp at no cost to their families.
