





It is once again time for the launch of a new Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) campaign. The CSA collection funds many diocesan-wide projects and services that benefit all parishes and help to spread the faith. CSA funds are used to fund the seminary, immigration legal services for clergy, parish services which supports our parish in many ways, youth ministry support services, Pro-Life ministries and so much more. CSA not only supports the Archdiocese, but provides for services that our parish could not survive without. Our contribution to the CSA makes a difference in the lives of many people and is also a great way to strengthen the parish finances. Our goal for 2023 is \$107,853. If we are able to exceed the goal anything collected for CSA over and above the \$107,853 will be returned to the parish tax free.

The Archdiocese of Detroit will do a direct mailing campaign on the parishes' behalf as they did in 2022. Due to some scheduling conflicts our formal kick off at the parish level will be delayed slightly, but parishioners should be receiving their packets in the mail this week if you have not already received them. The direct mailing from, and

the handling of the majority of payments by, the AOD takes much of the burden of administration off the parish.

In answer to: Why I have chosen the Saint Name Of St. Therese the little flower. Is because She was an inspiration in my life when I was very young. My mother used to play the story of her life while I was doing my school work. An I just loved the way she served the lord she show many people that you can love him in many small ways. The way she loved the poor on the street, the way she cared for God's children. The way she joined a convent when she was fifteen, how after nine years as a Carmelite religious, having fulfilled various offices such as sacristan and assistant to the novice mistress. In her last eighteen months in Carmel she fell into a night of faith, in which she is said to have felt Jesus was absent and been tormented by doubts that God existed. How she recovered after she had turned to gaze at the statue of the Virgin Mary placed in Marie's room, where Therese had been moved. She reported on 13 May 1883 that she had seen the Virgin smile at her. How she prayed for others even after death, for those you have murder or killed others. How she discovered the joy in self-forgetfulness and said, "I felt, in a word, charity enter my heart, the need to forget myself to make others happy. Since this blessed night I was not defeated in any battle, but instead I went from victory to victory and began, so to speak, 'to run a giant's course'. How she never gave upon entering a convent and how she asked many priests and popes for advice that

helped her grow in her faith and believe in herself. How even if she was bullied she kept her faith kept up in her studies, how she kept helping others and how she yearned to help young children. How she showed her love for others in little ways such as making a small puppet show for the elderly nuns. How she also affirmed the essential role of obedience in religious life and said, "When you stop watching the infallible compass of obedience, as quickly the mind wanders in arid lands where the water of grace is soon lacking". How she realized how small and insignificant she felt, how she saw the limitations of all her efforts. How she remained small and very far off from the unfailing love that she would wish to practice, she is said to have understood then that it was from insignificance that she had to learn to ask God's help.
