Dear Parishioners:

The liturgy of the Holy Mass concludes with the words Go and Announce the Gospel of the Lord. This is the mission of the Church, under the leadership of the Lord, who remains present and gives Himself to us in the Eucharist. Christ makes us spread the good news of the gospel and countless people respond with their faith and dedication, moving this mission forward.

Besides numerous activities and initiatives on the personal and parish level, our Diocese – the Archdiocese of Detroit – runs about 170 various ministries and services that assist countless people in southeast Michigan and bring the gospel to the world.

This shared mission also implies a shared financial responsibility. Our shepherd, Archbishop Vigneron, is asking all parishes to contribute to the Catholic Services Appeal. The goal set for our parish reflects the trends of the Parish finances (offertory income) over the past 3 years. Our goal for the year of 2023 is \$107,853. Contributing directly to CSA on behalf of Ss. Cyril & Methodius parish has the benefit of saving 7% on the diocesan assessment, which means that 100% of everybody's donation counts towards our mandatory goal.

June 13th—Second Apparition of Our Lady of Fatima
Tuesday, June 13—Marian Procession & Devotions after the 12:00 Noon Holy Mass

During World War I, Pope Benedict XV made repeated but forlorn pleas for peace, and finally in May 1917, made a direct appeal to the Blessed Mother to intercede for peace in the world. Soon, Our Lady began to appear at Fatima, Portugal to three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos, age 10, and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 9 and 7. Fatima was a small village about 70 miles north of Lisbon.

June 13, 1917: About 50 people turned up at the Cova da Iria on June 13 as the three children assembled near the holm oak tree where the Lady had appeared. The children then saw a flash of light followed immediately by the apparition of Mary as she spoke to Lucia: "I want you to come on the 13th of next month, to pray the Rosary every day, and to learn to read. Later, I will tell you what I want."

Lucia asked Mary to take them to heaven and was reassured in this way: "I will take Jacinta and Francisco shortly, but you will stay here for some time to come. Jesus wants to use you to make me known and loved. He wishes to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart throughout the world. I promise salvation to whoever embraces it. These souls will be dear to God, like flowers put by me to adorn his throne."

This last sentence is found in a letter written in 1927 by Sister Lucia to her confessor.

Lucia was sad at the first part of this reply and asked: "Am I to stay here alone?" Mary replied: "No, my daughter. Are you suffering a great deal? Don't lose heart. I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God."

One of the witnesses to this apparition, Maria Carreira, described how Lucia then cried out and pointed as Mary departed. She herself heard a noise like "a rocket a long way off," and looked to see a small cloud a few inches over the tree rise and move slowly towards the east until it disappeared. The crowd of pilgrims then returned to Fatima where they reported the amazing things they had seen, thus ensuring that there were between two and three thousand people present for the July apparition.



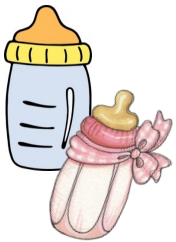

Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus • June 16

(CatholicDigest.com) The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus recalls Christ's love for us. Here are four facts that you may not know about this important feast of Our Lord.

1. The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus took centuries to become a universal celebration: Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back to the 11th century. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque had multiple visions of the Sacred Heart between 1673 and 1675. However, it wasn't until 90 years later in 1765, that the feast was officially celebrated in France. In 1856, Pope Pius IX made the feast of the Sacred Heart into a universal celebration.

2. The first feast of the Sacred Heart was actually celebrated in 1670: Even before St. Margaret Mary Alacoque had her visions of the Sacred Heart there was a recorded celebration of this feast. St. Jean Eudes composed the first Office and Mass of the Sacred Heart. The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on Aug. 31, 1670 in Rennes, France.

3. The feast takes place on the 19th day after Pentecost: The feast of the Sacred Heart is scheduled to be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (eighth day) of the feast of Corpus Christi. Corpus Christi is traditionally the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. However, in the United States, Corpus Christi is instead celebrated on the following Sunday. Despite this, the feast of the Sacred Heart still takes place 19 days after Pentecost.

4. Jesus made 12 promises to those who honor the Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque:

1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state in life.
2. I will establish peace in their families.
3. I will comfort them in their trials.
4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and, above all, in death.
5. I will shed abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
6. Sinners will find in My Heart an infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Lukewarm souls will become fervent.
8. Fervent souls will rapidly grow in holiness and perfection.
9. I will bless every place where an image of My Heart shall be exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. The names of those who promote this devotion will be written in My Heart, never to be blotted out.
12. I promise thee, in the excessive mercy of My Heart, that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months, the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their Sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

June 19 - 23

MASS or EUCHARISTIC LITURGY daily at 9:00AM (Parent must stay with the child at Mass. Mass is not required but highly encouraged. Have your children ever taken up the offertory gifts? If not, let me know?)

VBS runs from 10:00AM - 1:00PM daily!

DROP OFF your child/children each day in the Gallery no earlier than 9:45AM.

PICK UP your child/children in the Fr. Mikus Hall promptly at 1:00PM. Parents are encouraged to join us for our closing assembly at 12:50PM. Allow a half hour for pick-up due to 250 kids being at camp this week.

VBS T-SHIRTS are required to be worn each day with **CLOSE-TOED SHOES** (Gym shoes). Shirts will be available Monday morning of VBS either before or after Mass.

WATER will be provided at each station, but children may bring in water bottles.

- ♦ The Parishioner rate is available to families in the Good Shepherd Family of Parishes.
- ♦ Unfortunately, due to limited room availability, registered parishioners will be placed first. Non-registered parishioners will be placed if room is available. Family must be registered for 6 months before they are eligible for parishioner rate. Non-parishioners must supply letter from their pastor giving permission for them to attend St. Cyril's Catechism Program.
- ♦ The ideal method of payment is online through parish's Pushpay. Please be sure to select the drop-down for Religious Education and include the date, receipt number and authorization code on your registration form in the upper LEFT-hand corner. Don't forget to include the medical and media forms with the registration form in your envelope.
- ♦ If necessary, tuition may be paid by check (payable to Ss. Cyril & Methodius) and mailed with all registration, media, and medical forms to the church address, Attn. Paul or Carroll Schuller.
- ♦ If there are any question about eligibility or tuition costs, please contact *Paul or Carroll Schuller*.

Homeschool Program

- ♦ Only those who are homeschooled for other academics and active members in our church may homeschool for Religious Education.
- ♦ Home School students making the Sacrament of COMMUNION in 2024 must enroll at this time.
- ♦ Home School students making the Sacrament of CONFIRMATION in 2024 (8th grade) and 2025 (7th grade) must enroll at this time. The Confirmation Program is a two-year program. You must be enrolled both years to be eligible.
- ♦ KINDERGARTNERS: There is a \$20 supply fee and must be age of five by December 1st, 2023.
- ♦ Students with SPECIAL NEEDS do not have to be registered parishioners.

Registration Directions

- ♦ When completing the forms, keep in mind that you need to note the grade of your child for the next school year (2023-2024).
 1. Print clearly all family information or review all information if your form came preprinted.
 2. Fill out Media Form and list all your students under Name – example: John, Mary & Ann Smith
 3. Fill out Medical Form in its entirety and if possible include copy of medical card.
