

## Welcome Bp. Christopher Ndizeye Nkoronko

Bishop of Holy Family Parish Our Sister Parish in Kagongwa, Tanzania

You may have already had the opportunity to meet Bishop Christopher Ndizeye Nkoronko, Bishop of the Diocese of Kahama, (left) who is visiting our parish until mid-July. Bishop Christopher's responsibilities include the spiritual care of Holy Family Parish, our Sister Parish in Kagongwa. (Right: Bishop Christopher with villagers.)

This weekend, Bishop Christopher will update us on some of the progress that has been made in Kahama due to the prayers and generosity of the parishioners of Ss. Cyril & Methodius and he will also to share his vision for upgrading St. Ann Dispensary, the source of health care for the local population, including the local priests and the Bishop.



Among Bishop Christopher's top priorities to help the people of Kahama is to upgrade the local Dispensary, St. Ann Dispensary, to a Health Center. His vision includes three building initiatives:

First, because the current buildings are inadequate and in disrepair, a new building must be constructed. There are three existing buildings, two buildings that are in need of repair and an old one that is in need of replacement.


Second, new equipment and medical devices would need to be purchased.

Third, staff would have to be hired to serve the needs of the people. Currently, St. Ann Dispensary operates 24/7 with only two nuns working full time, all week long. Two part-time assistants, provided by the government, also help out on occasion, and a government doctor visits infrequently.

Once the Health Center is built and operational, the villagers who have government insurance will be allowed to use it for treatment. Currently, government insurance is not allowed at the Dispensary.

Also, according to government rules, services for children under five years of age, the elderly and some treatments for pregnant mothers must be provided for free.

Please consider these critical needs and keep Bishop Christopher and our Tanzanian brothers and sisters in your prayers. With the 4th of July still fresh in our memories, we can be thankful for all of the good things our Lord has done for us, and the wonderful country in which we live. Not everyone has had it so easy, or is so fortunate. Our brothers and sisters in Tanzania remind us that many people in this world still have a long journey ahead, where obstacles and challenges abound.

#### Our Lady of Fatima Procession • Thursday, July 13

On the 13th of each month, from May thru October, join in a very special Holy Mass and procession in honor of the apparitions of Our Blessed Mother to three Shepherd Children in 1917 in Fatima, Portugal. (Please note, a procession will not take place in August this year since it falls on a Sunday.)

The Rosary is prayed before Mass. Confessions are heard beginning one half hour before Holy Mass if it is on a weekday. Each Holy Mass concludes with a procession with the statue of Our Lady of Fatima from the Church to the outdoor Grotto, chanting Marian Hymns and Prayers to Our Lady of Fatima. Please join in this special day to honor Our Blessed Mother!

The procession this month takes place this Thursday, July 13, after the 12:00PM Holy Mass.

## TO PROTECT





The Archdiocese of Detroit (AOD) will soon be coming out with an update to the Protecting God Program. This update will require recertification for all who work or volunteer at Ss. Cyril & Methodius. Detailed information about the recertification process is not available at this time but is expected soon. Recertification will be required for anyone whose original Protecting God's Children certification took place prior to January 1, 2020. It is possible that registered users on virtus.org will be notified on/or after June 26th if you need to recertify.

At this time, no action is necessary. Detailed information will be available soon and posted in the bulletin to assist those who will need recertification.

#### Consecration to Jesus Through Mary

#### Preparation Begins July 13 for Consecration on August 15

St. Louis de Montfort (1673 – 1716) had a profound and deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and wrote extensively on the virtues of Our Lady, what true devotion to her consists of, and how the faithful need to turn to her as the way to her Son, Jesus Christ. He recommends that the faithful formally consecrate themselves to the Blessed Mother. For this end he developed a specific 33-day program consisting of various prayers and readings to help the faithful detach themselves from the world and bond themselves more closely with Christ through the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Louis de Montfort stands in a long tradition of saints completely devoted to Our Lady, and his work has been influential in the lives of many other saints, one of the most famous among them is Pope St. John Paul II, who took his papal motto, "Totus "Tous" (Totally Yours) from de Montfort.

This "Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary" consists of an initial 12-day preparation followed by a period of three consecutive weeks, each week focusing on a different theme. It is recommended that the consecration be done on a major feast day of Our Lady, meaning that the preparation would begin 33 days prior. That is, after the 33-day program is completed, the formal Act of Consecration is made on a Marian feast day. Once you make the consecration, it is for life. It can then be renewed annually. Keep in mind that this is a formal consecration to Our Lady, like a vow. Through this 33-day program you are giving Mary ALL of yourself your heart, your mind, and your soul - in order to bring you closer and help you be more faithful to her Son, Jesus Christ. Also, that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan i.e. this consecration allows her the free reign in your life to make you holy (she assists you, through the Holy Spirit, to conform to her virtues) and to use your prayers, sacrifices, and sufferings for the greater glory of God.

The next preparation begins this Thursday, July 13, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on Tuesday, August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

- 3) **Drink extra fluid** (water is helpful but limit caffeinated products)


