# New Protocols for Safe Environments Training for Adult Volunteers & Children in the Catholic Church

New Protocols for Safe Environments Training for Adult Volunteers and Children in the Catholic Church throughout the AOD:

TRAINING FOR ADULTS (18+): All priests, deacons, employees, and VOLUNTEERS who completed a Protecting God's Children workshop prior to January 1, 2020, are required to update their certification by completing the Protecting God's Children Online Awareness Session 4.0 with Vulnerable Adults Training 2.0 combined module. The online module is self-paced and takes approximately two hours to complete. Individuals may pause, save, and resume their position in the training if they cannot complete it in one sitting. You may have received an email regarding this recertification – which will give you specific directions on how to complete this process. Please check your spam folder just in case the message was placed there. If you did not receive an email, please go to: www.virtus.org and sign in using your existing account.

**Updated Codes of Conduct and Safe Environment Policies:** All current Virtus account users will receive an email asking them to review and digitally sign the updated Codes of Conduct for adult volunteers and our Safe Environment Policies.

**Background Checks:** No individual may be employed or permitted to volunteer at a parish or school in the AOD until a background check has been completed with this frequency (\*new frequency requirements): \*intermittent/occasional volunteers and independent contractors should be done at least biennially \*others (including staff, catechists, coaches, visitors to homebound, etc., or anyone directly interacting with children or vulnerable adults) must be done annually.

TRAINING FOR SCHOOL-AGE YOUTH: Children in Religious Education and Teens Beginning August 15, 2023, Virtus' Empowering God's Children curriculum is the only acceptable safe environment program for school-age youth in kindergarten through grade 12 in the Archdiocese of Detroit. This takes the place of "Circle of Grace." This program will be presented by staff with the assistance of catechists during the education year as an in-person lesson. The lesson is age-appropriate covering the topic of boundaries, how to recognize boundary violations, how to respond to persons who violate their boundaries, and how to report such violations to parents, family members, and other trusted adults.

**Teen Volunteers (age 14 – 17):** High school students who wish to volunteer at any AOD parish or school must complete Virtus' online workshops: Healthy Relationships for Teens 2.0 Online Module Expansion with Safe Environment Components. This module is accessible online through Virtus and is intended to help youth identify the differences between healthy and unhealthy relationships. The module also equips teens to follow a plan to do the right thing for themselves and others upon recognizing an unhealthy situation. This module only takes about 35 minutes to complete. To access the module, teen volunteers need to register on the Virtus site. After inputting their date of birth, the system will know they are a minor and will assign them the Healthy Relationships for Teens 2.0 module.

Please note that there is no longer a grace period for new employees or volunteers to complete a Protecting God's Children session and background check. Individuals cannot be employed or serve in any volunteer capacity in the AOD until they have digitally signed the revised Code of Conduct, supplied background check information, and have completed the appropriate Protecting God's Children session.

- **Drink extra fluid** (water is helpful but limit caffeinated products)
- 4) **Sleep well** (get at least 8 hours of sleep per night).

If you have not signed up yet, **please sign up today.** Without the proper amount of blood on-hand, patients (perhaps even our family members or friends) may not have blood available for necessary operations or emergencies. Thank you!
