

TO PROTECT Child and Youth Protection



Matthew 25:40 says, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." As Christians we are called to look out for the innocent as if they were Christ himself. In response to this call from Christ, the Archdiocese of Detroit has updated the safe environment policies it has in place to protect children and vulnerable adults. You may have seen some of the bulletin articles or heard Fr. Libor talk about the changes that now expand the certification requirements to all volunteers. The changes being implemented have been deemed necessary by the Archdiocese in order to better comply with the regulations set forth in the Charter for Protection of Children and Young People by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

As a result of these changes the following steps must be taken:

- 1. **All volunteers will need to sign a Code of Conduct** on virtus.org. The virtus system will require you to sign this before you are able to register for a class. If you took the recertification class prior to virtus having this uploaded, you should receive an email asking you to go back into virtus to sign the code of conduct.
- 2. Adult volunteers who have regular contact with children are required to have annual background checks. The current paper form only authorizes us to run the initial background check. Virtus is working on uploading a form to be completed online that will authorize the annual background checks so the paper form will need to be completed now and the online form will need to be completed once it is available online. Completed forms can be dropped off in the Parish Office for Deacon Phil. **
- 3. Adult volunteers who do not have regular contact with children are required to have background checks completed at least biennially.
- 4. Any adult volunteer who took a Protecting God's Children course prior to 2020 will need to take a recertification class online at virtus.org by August 31, 2023. There is also a Vulnerable Adults Module connected to the recertification class. In all, the combined class takes approximately two hours to complete. It is self-paced so, if needed, you can pause and return later to complete.
- 5. Any adult volunteer that has not taken a Protecting God's Children class and has regular contact with children must take a live Protecting God's Children course in-person or via zoom before volunteering. You can sign up for a class online at virtus.org.
- 6. Any adult volunteer who has not taken a Protecting God's Children class and does not have regular contact with children, must take a class but can choose from either the live version or the self-paced on-line class.
- 7. **Any teen volunteer (ages 14 17)** will need to take the Healthy Relationships for Teens module in virtus. Teens should enter their date of birth when registering at virtus.org and the proper teen module will be assigned to them. No background checks are required for teens.
- 8. Every three years an online recertification will be required for the Protecting God's Children & Vulnerable Adults class.
- If you do not know your username or password to login to virtus.org, you can select the blue "I need login help" button to try to recover your login information. If you have taken a Protecting God's Children class in the past, it is important that you access your existing account in virtus so you are properly assigned to the recertification class and it will be linked to your previous class. If you are unable to gain access to your account with the "I need login help" button, please contact virtus at (888) 847-8870.
- If you are a group leader, please send us a list of the names of all the current volunteers involved in your group as well as notify them that they need to take the above steps. From there, it is up to you if you want to have each volunteer notify Deacon Phil or our business manager, Rob Avery, directly when they have completed the class or they may notify you and then you can let us know. Once Deacon Phil is able to complete the background check, confirm the sign off on the code of conduct and confirm the class was completed, we will make sure the group leaders are informed that your volunteers are cleared.
- ** If you have concerns with providing all of the information requested on the form, many times the background check can be completed with as little as your full name, date of birth, race and sex. A phone number is also helpful so if something of concern shows up on the background check we can discuss it with you directly. Please be assured all information provided as well as the results of the background checks are kept confidential. Deacon Phil runs the background checks and in the event that Deacon Phil is unavailable to run the check it will be run by our business manager. If your record is clear, it will be identified as such in the virtus system for recordkeeping purposes. If there is an issue involving violence or abuse on your background check, Deacon Phil will discuss the findings directly with Fr. Libor to determine if the issue is one that will prevent the individual from volunteering. If they are unable to volunteer, the reason will not be discussed with anyone. The background check will consist of a criminal history check only to confirm whether there are any criminal or misdemeanor arrests, charges or convictions. The background check is very important for us to ensure that we are not putting anyone who may have a history of violence or abuse in a volunteer position for the parish.

We greatly appreciate everyone's assistance in ensuring all groups/volunteers are in compliance with these new requirements. Though it certainly is going to take some extra effort by all of our volunteers, we are hopeful that the training is not only helpful in protecting our children and vulnerable adults while at church but also outside of church. I think we can all agree that if we can keep just one child or vulnerable adult from violence or abuse this will all be worth it.



August is almost here, the catechism books have been ordered, and the teachers are in place anxiously awaiting the first week of class. Mark your calendars as Catechism Classes will begin Wednesday, September 13, 2023 (6:15-7:30).

If we have your paperwork, you will receive a packet later this month with your child's teacher, room assignment, calendar, and program notes. Parents that haven't sent in their child's paperwork, please do as soon as possible or we will not be able to promise that your child will have a book or classroom assignment the first week of class.

The cutoff for early registration is July 31st. We must have your paperwork by July 31st to be eligible for the early tuition. Fees go up on August 1st.

- Only those who are home schooled for other academics may home school for Religious Education.
- Home School students making the Sacrament of Communion in 2024 must enroll at this time.
- Home School students making the Sacrament of Confirmation in 2024 (8th grade) and 2025 (7th grade) must enroll at this time. The Confirmation Program is a two year program. You must be enrolled both years to be eligible.

Confirmation Packets were mailed to registered 8th Grade Confirmation Families two weeks ago. If you did not receive a packet of information, we do not have your registration forms.

Families of registered 7th Grade Students received their packets at the parent meeting on July 26th. If you did not receive your child's packet, please contact us.

Our Family of the Good Shepherd Walking with Moms In Need Committee was established in February, 2023. Since then we have been meeting monthly to implement the USCCB Phase 1-5 recommendations. Presently, we are in Phase 2 (Launch the Inventory Process) in which core team members have been visiting local pregnancy resources to determine first-hand what is available to moms in need. Thus far, we have visited/validated

six pregnancy resource centers: Abigayle Ministries, Compassion Pregnancy Center, Image of God, Mary's Mantle (Home for mothers), Mother and Unborn Baby Care, and Pregnancy Aid. We have found all of these to be wonderful resources for mothers. We have plans to visit approximately seven more centers. Once this is accomplished we plan to share our results with the parish and commit to a parish response.

In April, some of our committee members donated household supplies and clothing to a single mother of three children who had lost everything in an apartment fire in Sterling Heights. The St. Jane Francis Conference of St. Vincent de Paul worked with Nationalwide Furniture to deliver 2 complete brand new beds. SVdP members also donated other household goods, and a St. Jane parishioner donated several pieces of furniture. Clearly the Holy Spirit at work in our parishes.

In May, we had a speaker from Project Rosie who described their wonderful confidential pregnancy help 24 hour hotline/texting service. Anyone needing emotional or physical support for pregnancy can Call or Text (616) 312-2282.

August ~ Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

History and Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

n 1854, Blessed Pope Pius IX, proclaimed the the Immaculate of Conception. This affirmed the truth that the Blessed Virgin Mary, from the very moment of conception, was free from sin, and this means that Mary is truly 'Full of Grace' that Divine Grace flows unhindered into and through Her. Mary is unable to do anything other than be entirely devoted to God.

While we, with our fallen nature, aspire to Holiness, Mary was, from the moment of her conception, our perfect model – the one who shows us how to love God with a pure heart and how to overcome our sinfulness.

The core of the Blessed Virgin's love is, of course, her Heart, her Immaculate Heart. which was formed pure and perfect through her Immaculate Conception. And we are called to be devoted to her pure Heart, as a refuge - a refuge in which we can bathe in the sweet love of our holy Mother, and where we can learn to model our lives on the will of God and return the love to Him, as her Immaculate Heart does with every beat.

We are called to pay homage to Our Lady's Immaculate Heart, through acts of prayer and devotion, just as throughout the centuries, those who have gone before us have done. They, like ourselves, were helped and aided by Saints, Popes, and those who also rendered special devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart.

Of course, we must not forget the guidance of the Blessed Virgin Mary herself, who – at Fatima above all - specifically called us to Devotion to her Immaculate Heart, through acts of sacrifice and reparation.

While veneration of the Immaculate Heart of Mary began much earlier in the Church's history, it was only in 17th Century France that this particular devotion became intensively developed widespread. St. Jean Eudes (1601-1680), in particular, fervently spread the devotion throughout France and the Catholic world, in the 17th and 18th centuries.

> St. Jean developed a new theology of the Hearts of Jesus and Mary. He recognized the importance of seeing how the Sacred Heart of Jesus had been born from the Immaculate Heart of His Blessed Mother: that His Heart was formed in imitation of hers.

> > Not only was the Sacred Heart of Jesus born of her Immaculate flesh. It was also born from her Immaculate love: A love most pure and focused solely on God, expressing God's will alone. And of course, her pure and tender love was embodied within her Immaculate Heart. St. Jean's focus was particularly on the Incarnation of Divine Love. And in his eyes, this commenced with the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Not only did she perfectly love God, she also reflected His

The Sacred Heart of Jesus was formed from the marriage between the Divine Love of the Holy Spirit and Mary's Immaculate love. Of this, he wrote: "The Heart of Christ is a temple of divine love. It is the uncreated and eternal love, namely, the Holy Spirit who has built this magnificent Temple and built it from the Virginal blood of the Mother of love."
