

KEEPING OUR PROMISE TO PROTECT Child and Youth Protection




Matthew 25:40 says, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." As Christians we are called to look out for the innocent as if they were Christ himself. In response to this call from Christ, the Archdiocese of Detroit has updated the safe environment policies it has in place to protect children and vulnerable adults. You may have seen some of the bulletin articles or heard Fr. Libor talk about the changes that now expand the certification requirements to all volunteers. The changes being implemented have been deemed necessary by the Archdiocese in order to better comply with the regulations set forth in the Charter for Protection of Children and Young People by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

As a result of these changes the following steps must be taken:

- 1. All volunteers will need to sign a Code of Conduct on virtus.org. The virtus system will require you to sign this before you are able to register for a class. If you took the recertification class prior to virtus having this uploaded, you should receive an email asking you to go back into virtus to sign the code of conduct.
- 2. **Adult volunteers who have regular contact with children** are required to have annual background checks. The current paper form only authorizes us to run the initial background check. Virtus is working on uploading a form to be completed online that will authorize the annual background checks so the paper form will need to be completed now and the online form will need to be completed once it is available online. Forms are available by the statue of St. Michael in the entryway, on the table in the vestibule, and in the Parish Office. Completed forms can be dropped off in the Parish Office for Deacon Phil. **
- 3. Adult volunteers who do not have regular contact with children are required to have background checks completed at least biennially.
- 4. Any adult volunteer who took a Protecting God's Children course prior to 2020 will need to take a recertification class online at virtus.org by August 31, 2023. There is also a Vulnerable Adults Module connected to the recertification class. In all, the combined class takes approximately two hours to complete. It is self-paced so, if needed, you can pause and return later to complete.
- 5. Any adult volunteer that has not taken a Protecting God's Children class and has regular contact with children must take a live Protecting God's Children course in-person or via zoom before volunteering. You can sign up for a class online at virtus.org.
- 6. Any adult volunteer who has not taken a Protecting God's Children class and does not have regular contact with children, must take a class but can choose from either the live version or the self-paced on-line class.
- 7. **Any teen volunteer (ages 14 17)** will need to take the Healthy Relationships for Teens module in virtus. Teens should enter their date of birth when registering at virtus.org and the proper teen module will be assigned to them. No background checks are required for teens.
- 8. Every three years an online recertification will be required for the Protecting God's Children & Vulnerable Adults class.
- If you do not know your username or password to login to virtus.org, you can select the blue "I need login help" button to try to recover your login information. If you have taken a Protecting God's Children class in the past, it is important that you access your existing account in virtus so you are properly assigned to the recertification class and it will be linked to your previous class. If you are unable to gain access to your account with the "I need login help" button, please contact virtus at (888) 847-8870.
- If you are a group leader, please send us a list of the names of all the current volunteers involved in your group as well as notify them that they need to take the above steps. From there, it is up to you if you want to have each volunteer notify Deacon Phil or our business manager, Rob Avery, directly when they have completed the class or they may notify you and then you can let us know. Once Deacon Phil is able to complete the background check, confirm the sign off on the code of conduct and confirm the class was completed, we will make sure the group leaders are informed that your volunteers are cleared.
- ** If you have concerns with providing all of the information requested on the form, many times the background check can be completed with as little as your full name, date of birth, race and sex. A phone number is also helpful so if something of concern shows up on the background check we can discuss it with you directly. Please be assured all information provided as well as the results of the background checks are kept confidential. Deacon Phil runs the background checks and in the event that Deacon Phil is unavailable to run the check it will be run by our business manager. If your record is clear, it will be identified as such in the virtus system for recordkeeping purposes. If there is an issue involving violence or abuse on your background check, Deacon Phil will discuss the findings directly with Fr. Libor to determine if the issue is one that will prevent the individual from volunteering. If they are unable to volunteer, the reason will not be discussed with anyone. The background check will consist of a criminal history check only to confirm whether there are any criminal or misdemeanor arrests, charges or convictions. The background check is very important for us to ensure that we are not putting anyone who may have a history of violence or abuse in a volunteer position for the parish.

We greatly appreciate everyone's assistance in ensuring all groups/volunteers are in compliance with these new requirements. Though it certainly is going to take some extra effort by all of our volunteers, we are hopeful that the training is not only helpful in protecting our children and vulnerable adults while at church but also outside of church. I think we can all agree that if we can keep just one child or vulnerable adult from violence or abuse this will all be worth it.

Fourth Apparition of Our Lady of Fatima • August 13, 1917



During World War I, Pope Benedict XV made repeated but forlorn pleas for peace, and finally in May 1917, made a direct appeal to the Blessed Mother to intercede for peace in the world. Soon, Our Lady began to appear at Fatima, Portugal to three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos, age 10, and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 9 and 7.

Fatima was a small village about 70 miles north of Lisbon.

As August 13th approached, the story of the apparitions had reached the anti-religious secular press, and while this ensured that the whole country knew about Fatima, it also meant that many biased and negative reports were circulating. The children were kidnapped on the morning of the 13th by the Mayor of Vila Nova de Ourem, Arturo Santos. They were interrogated about the secret; but despite his threats and promises of money, they refused to divulge it. In the afternoon they were moved to the local prison and threatened with death but determined that they would die rather than reveal the secret.

Late in the afternoon on August 19, Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta were together at a place called Valinhos, near Fatima, when they again saw Mary, who spoke to Lucia: "Go again to the Cova da Iria on the 13th and continue to say the Rosary every day." Mary also said she would perform a miracle, so all would believe and that if they had not been kidnapped it would have been even greater.

Looking very sad, Mary then said: "Pray, pray very much, and make sacrifices for sinners; for many souls go to hell, because there are none to sacrifice themselves and pray for them." With that she rose into the air and moved towards the east before disappearing.

By now the children had thoroughly absorbed Mary's plea for prayer and penance, and did everything they could to answer it. They prayed for hours while lying prostrate on the ground and went as long as they could without drinking in the burning heat of the Portuguese summer. They also went without food as a sacrifice for sinners to save them from hell, the vision of which had so profoundly effected them. They even knotted some pieces of old rope around their waists as a form of mortification, not removing them day or night.

On the 13th of each month, from May thru October, we invite everyone to join in a special Mass and procession in honor of the apparitions of Our Blessed Mother in Fatima. Since August 13 falls on a Sunday this year, there <u>will not be a procession</u> since we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord on this day.

Catechism Corner - Registration (Grades K-8th) Limited Space Available Did you register your children for Catechism?

August is here, the catechism books have been ordered, and the teachers are in place anxiously awaiting the first week of class. Mark your calendars as Catechism Classes will begin Wednesday, September 13, 2023, from 6:15PM - 7:30PM.

If we have your paperwork, you will receive a packet later this month with your child's teacher, room assignment, calendar, and program notes. Parents that haven't sent in their child's paperwork, please do as soon as possible or we will not be able to promise that your child will have a book or classroom assignment the first week of class.

The cutoff for early registration was July 31st. Fees increased on August 1st as follows:.

Registration after July 31st

*Parishioner: \$125 per Student

Family Maximum: \$300

Non-Parishioner: \$175 per Student

Family Maximum: \$400 Non-Parishioner

Home School Fee: \$30 (during Sacrament Years)

Kindergarten: \$30 Supply Fee **Special Needs:** No Charge

- Only those who are home schooled for other academics may home school for Religious Education.
- Home School students making the Sacrament of Communion in 2024 must enroll at this time.
- Home School students making the Sacrament of Confirmation in 2024 (8th grade) and 2025 (7th grade) must enroll at this time. The Confirmation Program is a two year program. You must be enrolled both years to be eligible.

Confirmation Packets were mailed to registered 8th Grade Confirmation Families several weeks ago. If you did not receive a packet of information, we do not have your registration forms.

Families of registered 7th Grade Students received their packets at the parent meeting on July 26th. If you did not receive your child's packet, please contact us.

Update from:



Our Family of the Good Shepherd Walking with Moms In Need (WWMIN) Committee was established in February 2023. The current two main goals of our WWMIN committee are 1) to research (by visiting in person) all pregnancy resources available in our local community and 2) make this information known to all parishioners. Our hope is that every parishioner would know what to do if

they found out one of their family members, a friend, or any woman was experiencing a problem pregnancy. Our core team includes Joan Moses, Betty Abate, Katie MacFarland, all from St. Cyril's, James Torres, Christian Service Coordinator at St. Jane Francis De Chantal, and Iwona Fontana from Our Lady of Czestochowa. We also have about 15 members at-large. Thus far, we have visited/validated six pregnancy resource centers: Abigayle Ministries (Sterling Heights), Compassion Pregnancy Center (Clinton Township), Image of God (Madison Heights), Mary's Mantle-Home for Mothers (Southfield), Problem Pregnancy Center (Southfield), and Pregnancy Aid (Eastpointe). These resource centers offer both emotional and physical support to moms in need by providing free pregnancy tests and ultrasounds, every kind of baby supplies, job counseling, and much much more. We have plans to visit approximately seven more pregnancy resource centers. Once this is accomplished we plan to share our results with the parish and commit to a parish response.


In April, our committee members donated household supplies, a large amount of clothing, ect. to a single mother of three children who had lost everything in an apartment fire in Sterling Heights. The St. Jane Francis Conference of St. Vincent de Paul worked with Nationalwide Furniture to deliver 2 complete brand new beds. SVdP members also donated other household goods, and a St. Jane parishioner donated several pieces of furniture. Clearly the Holy Spirit is at work in our parishes.

On May 18th, we hosted Melinda Yageman from Project Rosie of Protect Life Michigan who gave an excellent presentation on their confidential pregnancy help 24 hour hotline/texting service. Although this service is marketed towards college women, any woman needing emotional or physical support for pregnancy can call or text (616)-312-2282/24 hours every day.


ministries, services and programs to respond to the physical and spiritual needs of countless individuals and families in Southeast Michigan.

Jesus: The Way, the Truth, and the Life A Study on the Life of Jesus Christ

The marvelous treasures of the Catholic Faith—the Eucharist, Mary, the saints, and the Creed—are all centered on a single figure: Jesus Christ. Jesus is more than a historical or theological figure. He is our Savior, our Redeemer, our Lord, and our God. While many of us already know a lot about him, how well can we say we really know him?
