Day of Fasting and Prayer • THIS Friday, October 27

Pope Francis sets October 27 as a day of fasting and prayer,

inviting those of other religions and anyone with a heart for peace to participate however they see fit.

POPE: Take just one side in this conflict, the side of peace.

(Aleteia, October 18, 2023): Pope Francis made another heartfelt plea for peace in the Holy Land this October 18, at the end of the Wednesday general audience. He said:

Today too, dear brothers and sisters, our thoughts turn to Palestine and Israel. The number of victims is rising and the situation in Gaza is desperate. Please, let everything possible be done to avoid a humanitarian disaster. The possible widening of the conflict is disturbing, while so many war fronts are already open in the world. May weapons be silenced, and let us heed the cry for peace of the poor, the people, the children ...

Brothers and sisters, war does not solve any problem: It sows only death and destruction, foments hate, proliferates revenge. War cancels out the future, it cancels out the future. I urge believers to take just one side in this conflict: that of peace. But not in words – in prayer, with total dedication.

Concretely, the Holy Father called for another day of fasting and prayer, to be held this Friday, October 27. He suggested that those of other religions and anyone who desires the cause of peace to “join in as they see fit.” He asked local Churches to organize activities of prayer on that day. (See box below.)

With this in mind, I have decided to call for a day of fasting and prayer on Friday 27 October, a day of penance to which I invite sisters and brothers of the various Christian denominations, those belonging to other religions, and all those who have at heart the cause of peace in the world, to join in as they see fit.

That evening, at 18.00 at Saint Peter's, we will spend an hour of prayer in a spirit of penance to implore peace in our time, peace in this world. I ask all the particular Churches to participate by arranging similar activities involving the People of God.

Please join in this special day of FASTING and PRAYER for WORLD PEACE on Friday, October 27

As the Pope begins an hour of prayer starting at 6:00PM ROME TIME in St. Peter's “imploping for peace in the world”, we will begin our 12:00PM Holy Mass. Stay after Mass for a special hour of Eucharistic Adoration and private prayer at Ss. Cyril & Methodius “imploping for peace in the world” on:

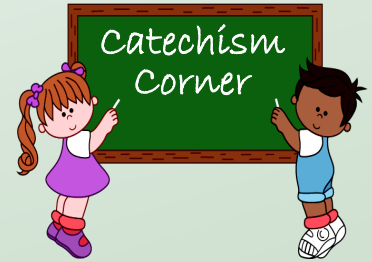

Total Consecration to Jesus thru Mary

Prep Begins November 5 for Consecration on December 8

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary is a beautiful exercise to increase our spirituality and ability to truly serve our Lord Jesus Christ. The basic premise set forth by St. Louis Marie de Montfort is simply that Jesus came into the world through Mary and that for us to always be assured of being close to Jesus, even closer than ever before, we should go thru Mary. St. Louis de Montfort (1673 – 1716) developed a 33-day devotion consisting of various prayers and readings to help us to grow in holiness and increase our faith and love for our Lord. It will help us to detach ourselves from the world and bond ourselves more closely with Christ thru the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Consecration to Jesus is for anyone, who is old enough to understand the love of Jesus and Mary. The preparation is intended to prepare our hearts and minds by praying and meditating. The next preparation begins on November 5, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8. "Preparation for Total Consecration" books are available in the Parish Office for \$10.

## A HEARTS DEEPEST LONGING

To follow along with last week's article we pick up where we left off (as I will do each week). We're looking at the greatest threat against the Catholic Church: the lack of belief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist in baptized Catholics.

According to a 2019 survey done by the Pew Research Center, a staggering 69% of professed Catholics polled believe that the bread and wine are just symbols. There are many reason why this may be so. I'll take what I believe to be the most prevalent cause and explain it.

Now, what takes place on the altar during the Holy Mass when a valid Catholic priest consecrates the bread and wine during the Liturgy of the Eucharist a miracle happens right before our eyes. Yes, an actual 100% miracle that science and the greatest minds in world history cannot explain. This alone ought to be enough for all Catholics to tremble in awe and fear. But it doesn't for the majority of Catholics.

I have a few ideas that may help explain why. We are prideful people by nature. When we think "miracle" we expect something that jumps out at us, something that our eyes cannot believe; like a limb which has been severed off growing back immediately. Secular society, movies, social media, and the like have taught us what miracles "should" look like. But we don't see anything like this during consecration. It's invisible to human sight.

Our God, on the other hand, coming from a place of absolute authority and power humbles Himself when He takes on the appearance of bread and wine. The validly consecrated bread and wine no longer are bread and wine but are actually the real Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Yes, the same physical Jesus who walked the earth almost 2000 years ago. Confused yet? That's why it is a miracle. Miracles confuse us because they're beyond our understanding. If you believe Jesus is alive still then believe His words. Believe every last one of them; even if they don't make sense to you yet. One day they will. Humility truly unlocks that which is impossible. - Paul A. Ray
