

November Indulgences for "The Holy Souls in Purgatory"

Please pray for the faithful departed throughout the month of November, and especially on November 2. The Church gives us ample opportunities today to help those suffering in Purgatory. All the faithful can seek to obtain a plenary indulgence for a soul in Purgatory. We would certainly want people to help us through their prayers if we go to Purgatory. And if we help get someone to Heaven, you can be sure that they will help us and pray for us before the Throne of God. What is an indulgence? "Indulgences are a part of the Church's teaching on the forgiveness of sins. Through the Sacrament of Baptism, we receive forgiveness for our sins, and all punishment is remitted. Through the Sacrament of Penance, sins are also forgiven, and the eternal penalty that is due to sin—namely, damnation, the eternal loss of the presence of God—is taken away. However, consequences still remain that the sinner must bear. This is what is traditionally called the temporal punishment for sin. This consequence of sin disrupts our relationship with God, with the Church and with others. Those who have received forgiveness for their sins may still have an obligation to undergo a process of purification to restore these disrupted relationships. The necessary and painful process that brings this reconciliation and purification can take place in this life or in Purgatory, because whatever part of the process remains unfinished at death must be completed in Purgatory" (Indulgences and our Spiritual Life). An indulgence (full or partial) is what we receive when the Church lessens the temporal (lasting only for a short time) penalties to which we may be subject even though our sins have been forgiven.

Plenary (Full) Indulgence Available on All Souls Day (Thursday, November 2)

* Piously visit a church to pray for the faithful departed. * Say one "Our Father" and the "Creed" in the visit to the church. * Say one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the intentions of the Pope. * Worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally on the same day). * Make a Sacramental Confession within 20 days of (before or after).

All Souls Day Plenary Indulgence Available from November 1 to November 8

* Devoutly visit a cemetery and pray for the dead, even if the prayer is only mental. * Say one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary" for the intentions of the Pope. * Worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally on the same day). * Make a Sacramental Confession within 20 days of (before or after) All Souls Day.

A partial indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, can be obtained when the Eternal Rest is prayed especially during the month of November: *Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.*

THE GENERAL CONDITIONS REQUIRED FOR GAINING A PLENARY INDULGENCE:

All attachment to sin, even venial sin, must be absent. If one's disposition is less than perfect or if some of the above conditions are not fulfilled, the indulgence becomes partial.

One must also remember that one can acquire only one plenary indulgence a day.

The above indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory.

Several Plenary Indulgences may be gained on the basis of a single Sacramental Confession; only one may be gained, however, on the basis of a single Eucharistic Communion and prayer for the Pope's intentions.

Total Consecration to Jesus thru Mary Prep Begins November 5 for Consecration on December 8

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary is a beautiful exercise to increase our spirituality and ability to truly serve our Lord Jesus Christ. The basic premise set forth by St. Louis Marie de Montfort is simply that Jesus came into the world through Mary and that for us to always be assured of being close to Jesus, even closer than ever before, we should go thru Mary. St. Louis de Montfort (1673 - 1716) developed a 33-day devotion consisting of various prayers and readings to help us to grow in holiness and increase our faith and love for our Lord. It will help us to detach ourselves from the world and bond ourselves more closely with Christ thru the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Consecration to Jesus is for anyone, who is old enough to understand the love of Jesus and Mary. The preparation is intended to prepare our hearts and minds by praying and meditating. The next preparation begins on Sunday, November 5, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8. Reproductive Health Act

(micatholic.org) Michigan Catholic Conference has been heavily engaged in efforts to defeat the Reproductive Health Act, legislation that promotes an unregulated abortion industry in Michigan.



UPDATE (10/20/23): The Senate has voted to move the RHA legislation to the House. It's crucial to contact all House members to urge them to stand opposed to the RHA to keep it off the Governor's desk.

Background: The Legislature is seeking to repeal widely-supported and long-standing laws that provide basic health and safety limits on abortions, which will hurt the dignity and wellbeing of the vulnerable women who seek out abortions.

These proposed changes in the so-called Reproductive Health Act (RHA) would advance an unregulated abortion environment in Michigan and put the interests of the abortion lobby over the health and safety of women. With support from the Governor and abortion advocacy groups, the proposed legislative changes would remove important health and safety standards like:

- Abortion clinics having to be licensed and inspected by the state.
- A woman's right to know by receiving informed consent prior to an abortion.
- Screening women to determine if they are being coerced into an abortion.

A HEARTS DEEPEST LONGING

Disbelief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist is rampant within the Catholic Church and has created an atmosphere of doubt, skepticism, and widespread disbelief in truth itself. This has caused deception, scandal, and all other vices to creep into the Church and its members; a perfect plan from Satan.

Let's look at other reasons why so many professed Catholics believe the Eucharist is just a symbol. We already looked at it as truly being a miracle that takes place before our very eyes at every Holy Mass. We saw how our perception of what we personally believe really is "miraculous" skews our understanding of what a miracle really is. This week I want to take a look at reason itself through a spiritual lens. Read carefully what Pope St. John Paul II had to say about the Eucharist: "Receiving the Eucharist means entering into a profound communion with Jesus.

(Jesus said) 'Abide in me, and I in you' (Jn 15:4). This relationship of profound and mutual 'abiding' enables us to have a certain foretaste of heaven on earth. Is this not the greatest of human yearnings? Is this not what God had in mind when He brought about in history His plan of salvation? God has placed in human hearts a 'hunger' for His work (Amos 8:11), a hunger which will be satisfied only by full union with Him. Eucharistic communion was given so that we might be 'sated' with God here on earth, in expectation of our complete fulfillment in heaven (Mane Nobiscum Domine, Oct. 7, 2004).

What the saint was saying is not merely pious rhetoric that's pleasing to hear but out of reach in reality. It is real. Now if these words are reality how can they not be Divine in nature? They are referring to a real person, for you cannot abide in a symbol. Examine yourself; is not your hearts greatest longing union with the Divine (Transcendent)? Do you have a desire for, and deep longing for perfect love, truth, beauty, justice, and belonging? All of which were given us by God so that we might desire Him above all else. It's in us right now. We were born with it. Do not ignore this yearning. Do not think it's only a dream. It truly is reality, and that reality is Jesus in the Eucharist.

Investiture of the Miraculous Medal • Saturday, November 18 (after the 5:30PM Holy Mass

At her apparition to Sister Catherine Laboure, Holy Mary expressed that all of her children wear the Miraculous Medal. Initially, it was called the Medal of the Immaculate Concepcion, but because of the many miracles attributed to Our Lady through the medal, it became known as the miraculous medal. One wears the medal as a sign of love and fidelity to Our Blessed Mother. One must not think of it as a good luck charm or a rabbits foot. Our Lady promised great graces to all who ask for them with confidence.

A Plenary indulgence is obtained on the day of investiture with the following conditions:

- Have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin.
- Sacramentally confessions 20 days before or 20 days after the day of investiture (new ruling on plenary indulgence).
- Receive the Holy Eucharist.
- Prayer for the intentions of the Pope (1 Our father, Hail Mary & Glory be).

A plenary indulgence may be obtained once a day and may be applied to yourself or a deceased individual or to the souls in purgatory (never for another living individual other than yourself).

Preparation for the investiture includes praying a private novena to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal starting nine days before the investiture and sacramental confession as above.

Please pick up a packet with the novena, a Miraculous Medal, a blue ribbon and other information at the parish office. Please bring the medal with the blue ribbon threaded into it at the time of the investiture.
