





A HEARTS DEEPEST LONGING

In this week's article I want to present a challenge. Usually when we hear the word "challenge" we tend to get nervous. It gives us a sense of urgency to prove to ourselves that we can do it. Let those emotions go. This challenge is different. It's easy. It just takes a little discipline on our part. But the results can (and will, if you allow it to) change your perspective and look on life. It will show you a side of Jesus that perhaps you've never experienced before.

I'm well aware that time is of the essence. Even with the recent time change last week where we gained an extra hour, time is still precious. It must be spent wisely. This challenge will take just a little amount of time from your days. I propose one hour from your day for seven consecutive days. That's just 4.17% of your entire day and 4.17% of your entire week. Can you spare that much time? If so, continue to read.



I call it Coffee with Jesus not because we literally drink coffee with Jesus but that it provides us a time to sit and have conversation with Him as we would while having coffee with a friend. Mentally talk to Him. Tell Him everything that's on your mind and heart that day. Your concerns, worries, fears, questions, etc. just like you would with a close trusted friend. If you struggle with belief in the Real Presence (that Jesus is really, actually physically present right there with you), tell Him. Let Him make the first move even if you may feel silly doing it. If you run out of things to say or your mind wanders onto other things, don't worry. Just be there with Him, spending time in His presence. Even if you have nothing to say and have trouble even thinking straight, remain there the rest of the hour. He'll do the rest.

Do this for seven days in a row and then just think about yourself, your life, think of God, think of where you stand in the grand scheme of things. Think about meaning in your life; think about your purpose and why you even exist. If you continue to feel the urge to go to Adoration again, even for a few minutes this time, do so. You're starting to learn who Jesus really is. But we have to take the initiative, for God is a gentleman. He will not force His love upon you. You've got to really want it.

Investiture of the Miraculous Medal • Saturday, November 18 after the 5:30PM Holy Mass (Sponsored by Our Lady Queen of Peace Apostolate)

THE MEANING OF THE MEDAL'S DESIGN: On the front side it shows Mary standing on a globe crushing beneath her feet the head of a serpent. She stands upon the globe as Queen of Heaven and Earth. Her feet crushes the serpent to proclaim that Satan and all his followers are helpless before her (Gn. 3:15). The year 1830 is the year Our Lady gave the

design of the medal to St. Catherine Laboure. The rays of light coming from her outstretched hands symbolize the graces which she showers on all who ask them of her with confidence. The figure is framed with the words which encircled Mary when she appeared to St. Catherine: "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee." This refers to her Immaculate Conception confirmed as a dogma in 1854.

On the reverse side of the medal there are represented the hearts of Jesus and Mary, aflame with love for us. Above is a large M surmounted by a bar and a Cross. The M stands for Mary. The bar represents the earth. The Cross surmounts the bar and symbolizes Christ and our redemption. The interweaving of the M and the Cross shows Mary share in our redemption and she shares in Christ's glory and it is through her that all graces come to man. The twelve stars represent the twelve apostles who represent the entire Church, and her role as Mother of the Church. This also recalls the vision of St. John in Revelation 12:1 in which "a great sign appeared in heaven, a woman clothed with the sun and moon under her feet and on her head a crown of twelve stars."

Originally it was called the Medal of the Immaculate Conception, but the abundance of miracles, conversions, and healings associated with its use soon resulted in the name, Miraculous Medal. The result of Mary's intercession through this tiny, but powerful sacramental was a resurgence in devotion to Our Blessed Mother who gained the title as Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal.

A Plenary indulgence is obtained on the day of investiture with the following conditions:

♦ Have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin. ♦ Sacramentally confessions 20 days before or 20 days after the day of investiture (new ruling on plenary indulgence). ♦ Receive the Holy Eucharist. ♦ Prayer for the intentions of the Pope (1 Our father, Hail Mary & Glory be is suggested). A plenary indulgence may be obtained once a day and may be applied to yourself or a deceased individual or to the souls in purgatory (never for another living individual other than yourself).

Preparation for the investiture includes praying a private novena to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal starting nine days before the investiture and sacramental confession as above. Please pick up a packet with the novena, a Miraculous Medal, a blue ribbon and other information at the Parish Office. Please bring the medal with the blue ribbon threaded into it at the time of the investiture.

We would like to request, if you would, to please fill out a form (found in your packet) with your name and contact information (email, phone, address) and leave it at the Parish Office. Please join our Prayer Force that we can call upon for prayers when the need arises.
