

RORATE HOLY MASSES

(Fridays in Advent at the 6AM Holy Mass)

The name “Rorate” comes from the opening words of the Entrance Antiphon:

‘Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem.’
which is Latin for:

***“Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above,
and let the clouds rain the just:
let the earth be opened and bud forth a Savior.”***

The Rorate Mass was traditionally a Solemn Votive Mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary and celebrated during Advent by using candlelight on the altar. As the Holy Mass comes to a close, the sky is dawning its first lights, beautifully symbolizing the coming of Christ, the Light of the World.

Rorate Masses will take place at 6AM every Friday in Advent, by a candlelight procession beginning by the outdoor Slovak Cross.

The program provides activities based on each participant's capabilities, lunch, prayer time, and personal care in a 1:2 caregiver to participant ratio. Our donations will help offset the costs of this intensive, much needed service for vulnerable individuals and their families.

SLOVAK SEMINARY SCHOLARSHIP FUND DONATIONS

The seminary in Bratislava, which we have assisted with individualized sponsorships for many years, is currently undergoing major renovations. The students are now at the seminary in Nitra, making a combined total of 70 seminarians in formation. This larger number of students makes it unreasonable for our parish to sponsor them individually for a \$300 donation as we have in the past. Instead, parishioners who wish to support the future priests in Slovakia may make a donation in any amount to a seminary scholarship fund. Our monetary gift will help support seminarians with financial needs, at the rector's discretion. To contribute to the scholarship, place your donation in a blue Advent Giving envelope and place it **in the Sunday collection basket by December 25**. 

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: THURSDAY, 1:00PM - FRIDAY, 12:00PM

A HEARTS DEEPEST LONGING

Polls have shown that more than half of professing Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. We have discussed many different avenues as to why that is the case and offered some practical advice for consideration. We can be intellectually convinced that the self-same Jesus who walked the earth nearly 2000 years ago is the same Jesus we seen under the appearance of bread of wine at every Holy Mass. But like the term goes, the longest journey is from the head to the heart.

The great St. Augustine of Hippo once told his listeners, "You (his listeners) say to me, 'help us to understand so that we may believe'. But I say to you, 'believe so that you may understand.'" This holds true for us today just as much as when St. Augustine said it over 15 centuries earlier. If you have been validly baptized you have been infused with the virtue of faith. This means God freely gave to you this virtue without you having to work at strengthening it as we would work through trial and error to perfect the virtue of patience, or prudence, fortitude or temperance.

Faith is the acceptance of the word of another, trusting that one knows what the other is saying and is honest in telling the truth. We exercise faith on a daily basis even outside the realm of the spiritual. We have faith in the word of our automakers that they knew what they were doing when making our vehicle. We have faith in our doctors that they know what they're saying when diagnosing us. So faith is not alien to us.

The question is do you have faith in what Jesus and His Church said of the Blessed Sacrament? Do you choose what to believe and what not to believe according to your own understanding? Do you believe Christ's words are hit and miss, as in some are true and trustworthy and some we can take with a grain of salt? Or is it all or nothing?

Jesus gave us an ultimatum in the book of Revelation. We're either in or out, there is no in-between. He says of the lukewarm, "So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spew you out of my mouth (Rev. 3:16)." It is up to us to use this infusion of faith which God gave to us and believe in all He taught us or nothing at all.
