

This larger number of students makes it unreasonable for our parish to sponsor them individually for a \$300 donation as we have in the past. Instead, parishioners who wish to support the future priests in Slovakia may make a donation <u>in any amount</u> to a seminary scholarship fund. Our monetary gift will help support seminarians with financial needs, at the rector's discretion. To contribute to the scholarship, place your donation in a <u>blue Advent Giving envelope</u> and place it **in the Sunday collection basket by December 25.** Note: per the IRS, this international donation is not tax deductible. Reporting Sexual Abuse



### A HEARTS DEEPEST LONGING

I want to stick with how Jesus taught us to pray in this week's edition of the Heart's Deepest Longing. I do so because in order to bring about the transformation of mind needed to recognize Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, is we need to foster communication, just as communication is mandatory in all relationships and conversations with other people. Prayer is nothing less than conversation with God. We tell Him what's on our mind and heart and He responds.

Christ gave us the Lord's Prayer when His disciples asked Him how to pray (Luke 11:1). In this prayer, Jesus centers around the adoration of God and on His kingdom, and then petitions Him for what we need in order to receive and collaborate with that kingdom. Finally, it links our forgiveness of our neighbor. If we look beyond the meaning of what Jesus prayed for and, instead, look at the circumstances of what prompted the discipleS to ask Him how they ought to pray, we find the very thing we ourselves need to find inside of us when approaching Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

To set the scene, Jesus was praying in a certain place and when He had stopped, one of His disciples said to Him, "Lord, teach us to pray." What was it that the disciple saw that gave him the desire to pray? This is a question with which we must discover in ourselves as well. The Catechism says that "By contemplating and hearing the Son, the Master of prayer, the children (disciples) learn to pray to the Father" (par. 2601)."

What we need to know about this, that is the disciples, and us, is we need to contemplate about ourselves and about God. Contemplation is the simple intuition of divine truth which produces love. In other words, the disciples recognized Christ as speaking truth and felt pulled to unite themselves with Him out of love for Him and the truth He spoke. Therefore, when we approach Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist we must truly and sincerely want to know truth and love, which is through Him, with Him, and in Him. This will open the floodgates of our prayer life and make Him more alive and active within our heart, soul, and mind. In this way the Real Presence will be manifested to us in an undeniable way. *Paul A. Ray*

# **Consecration to Jesus thru Mary & Consecration to St. Joseph**

# Prep Begins: Friday, December 22





# (Private) Consecration Date:

January 23 (Performed Privately) Mary is our spiritual mother, and St. Joseph is our spiritual father. The spiritual fatherhood of St. Joseph is extremely important for our spiritual growth. Everything we have given to Jesus and Mary can also be given to St. Joseph. The hearts of Jesus, Mary, and St. Joseph are one.

<u>Program Overview</u>: Consecration to St. Joseph emulates the tried-and-true preparation method employed by St. Louis de Montfort in his Marian consecration, highlighting many of St. Joseph's titles, privileges, and heroic virtues. The program of preparation and consecration takes 33 days. You'll spend about 20-30 minutes a day on a short exposition on one of the invocations in the powerful Litany of St. Joseph, followed by a reading on St. Joseph, concluding with the recitation of the Litany of St. Joseph. If you miss a day, just make it up and continue your preparation. On the day of your consecration, feel free to use whichever act of consecration you like best; you can also make up your own, if you like.



**Presentation of the Lord • February 2** 

The next 33-day preparation for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, St. Louis de Montfort, begins on Sunday, December 31, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on February 2, the Presentation of the Lord. Once you make the consecration, it is for life. It can then be renewed annually.



This is a formal consecration to Our Lady, like a vow. You are giving Mary ALL of yourself - your heart, your mind, and your soul - in order to bring you closer and help you be more faithful to her Son, Jesus Christ and that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan. She assists you, through the Holy Spirit, to conform to her virtues and to use your prayers, sacrifices, and sufferings for the greater glory of God.
