





A HEARTS DEEPEST LONGING

I shift my perspective on the Holy Eucharist this week, and in the weeks to come, from disbelievers to believers. If you still doubt the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, I encourage you to read (or re-read) the articles I posted since the beginning of this Eucharistic journey. However, now is the time to foster and build up our belief in the Real Presence and raise our knowledge of what we have before us.

I would like to begin this sector of our journey with the help of 19th century priest and author Fr. Peter J. Arnouldt, S.J. A Belgium Jesuit, Father Arnouldt lived from 1811-1865 and is known for, "Imitation of the Sacred Heart of Jesus" (written by 1846 and first approved and published in Rome in 1863). This book offers to the reader a full school of true Christian holiness and the means and exercises necessary to attain sanctity. It is not simply pious rhetoric and comfy thoughts, but a real, easy to comprehend and digestible spiritual truths that are practical for any serious Catholic today. Reflecting on these spiritual maxims before the Blessed Sacrament will serve us gratuitously in our own path to know, love and serve God in our own lives.

Jesus said to us, "Come to Me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you, and learn from Me; for I am gentle (meek) and lowly (humble) in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy, and My burden light. (Matthew 11:28-30). And this is where we'll begin. Always call to mind these words of our Lord each time you enter into Eucharistic Adoration or Holy Mass. Approaching our Savior with the right frame of mind and purpose is the beginning of union with Him.

The Feasts of the Blessed Virgin ~ by St. Francis de Sales

he days upon which the Blessed Virgin Mary shows herself bountiful of her favors, are the feasts celebrated in her honor; and if we desire to profit by them, we must sanctify them fervently. Let us approach the Sacraments on those days, and propose to practice some particular virtue of the Blessed Virgin, adapted to the mystery of the day. For instance, on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, let us propose to practice purity of intention; on that of her Nativity, a renewal of fervor, banishing all tepidity from our soul; on that of the Presentation, detachment from those desires which require to be mortified; on the Feast of the Annunciation, of the Visitation, on the Feast of the Purification, obedience to Superiors; and on the Feast of the Assumption, preparation for death. Such was ever the practice of all the true servants of Mary.



On New Year's Eve, 1895-1896, St. Gemma Galgani wrote: "During this new year I resolve to begin a new life. I do not know what will happen to me during this year, but I abandon myself entirely to You, my God, and my aspirations and all my affections will be for You. I feel so weak, dear Jesus, but with Your help I hope and resolve to live a different life, that is, a life closer to You."

Writing to her spiritual director Gemma wrote: "Father, do you know the latest idea that has come into my head? It is to become a saint at all costs."

While 2024 comes with uncertainties about the future, the vocation and goal of each and every one of us remains the same - to become saints and strive for Heaven!

Let us, therefore, spend these final days of 2023 in fervent prayer asking the Holy Spirit to inspire us with what we must do to attain great holiness, thus becoming true saints!
