

World Day of the Sick • Saturday, February 10

Saturday, February 11, is World Day of the Sick, an observation introduced by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. It coincides with the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes, commemorating 18 apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary between February 11 and July 16, 1858. Since then, Lourdes has become a pilgrimage site where many people experienced physical and spiritual healing.

The Church always wants to stand by those who are in need and offers them grace from the sacraments established by Jesus Christ.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is meant for those who suffer from illness or old age. The celebration consists of the anointing of the forehead and hands of the sick person accompanied by the liturgical prayer of the celebrant.

The special grace of this sacrament has as its effects:

- the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church
- the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age
- the forgiveness of sins, if unable to obtain through the Sacrament of Penance
- the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul
- the preparation for passing over to eternal life Elderly and sick people will have the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during the 9:00AM Holy Mass on Saturday, February 10.

Saints Cyril & Methodius Solemnity of the Patrons of the Parish February 10 (Vigil Mass) and February 11 (All Masses)

The Slovaks who started to gather in the early 20th century in the east side of Detroit with the purpose of having a place for the



community, for living their faith, and for instructing their children in their mother tongue, chose Saints Cyril and Methodius, the apostles of the Slavs, as patrons of their new church.

Now, more than 100 years later, Saints Cyril and Methodius are still venerated as the patrons of the Parish which is home to Slovak people and many Catholics of all ethnic backgrounds.

The Feast Day of Ss. Cyril & Methodius falls on Wednesday, February 14. Since the same day this year also opens the Lenten Season (Ash Wednesday), we will celebrate the Solemnity of SS. Cyril and Methodius in our Church on:

- ♦ Saturday, February 10, 5:30PM
- Sunday, February 11, at 7:30AM, 9:30AM, 11:30AM (in Slovak), and 8:30PM

Attend one or more of these Masses to celebrate in thanksgiving for the patrons of our beautiful Parish.

Support the Church in Central and Eastern Europe

Catholics are called to evangelize their neighbors and loved ones by leading them into an encounter with Jesus Christ. When faithful disciples offer a visible and active presence in their communities, they live that calling through their works of mercy, their public worship, and their willingness to share the gospel message with those they meet.

In two former republics of the Soviet Union, which experienced 70 years of communist oppression, the Church is becoming that visible and active presence. Since 2018, the Center for Catholic Youth in the Republic of Georgia has brought together hundreds of children and youths for faith-enriching activities like Bible school, Lenten spiritual exercises, pilgrimages, and works of service in parish communities. Meanwhile, in central Asia, the construction of a new cathedral and pastoral center in the heart of Kyrgyzstan's capital city, Bishkek, is a visible sign of hope and welcome in a land where 90% of the population is Muslim.

For more than 30 years, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has worked to restore a visible, active Church in Central and Eastern Europe and to build a hopeful new future in Georgia, Kyrgyzstan, and more than 25 other countries throughout the region. Your contributions to the USCCB's Collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe fund grants to construct churches, enliven the faith of children and young people, and form disciples who live to help others encounter Christ.

We are now gathering the fruits of our labor in Christ. Once we've cultivated the habit of studying and practicing what He tells us through what we've learned in Matthew 11:28-30, we can rightfully bring together the harvest of fruits which come from it. While we're gathering this fruit we will at the same time secure our end, the never-fading desire of our souls. For Jesus said, "...you will find rest for your souls" (Matthew 11:29). Our souls are ours, however, they are not ours because we created them, God created them – not us. They're ours because God gave them to us. In giving them to us He gave them for an end worthy of Himself. After He gave them to us He does what He always does: gives us a means to gain for our souls a blissful and tranquility in Him.

God is as a good father before His children, a guide and companion along with His Mother, our angels, and the saints, pointing out a safe and pleasant while, at the same time, relieves and refreshes us.



This enables Christians to spread their faith, serve the needy, transform work and family life into an offering to God, and extend Christ's presence everywhere into society. The Eucharist changes the world from the inside out, becoming an oasis of truth, beauty, and love in a fallen world.

Using the great Saints of the Church, Dr. Staudt will guide you through a systematic study of the Eucharist, not only in its biblical foundations, but also, it's centrality in the lives of the saints, art, culture, the devotions and prayers of the Church, and how to live in holy communion in an unbelieving world.







