Adoration ~ Come Let Us Adore Him

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION: THURSDAY, 1:00PM - FRIDAY, 12:00PM Until 7:00PM on FIRST FRIDAYS ONLY A HEARTS DEEPEST LONGING

To illustrate the vitality of the Sacred Heart of Jesus consider the following: Though you may distribute your possessions among the poor, though you should give up your body to the greatest penances, though you can understand all the mysteries of the faith, though you worked astonishing miracles, if your heart is not seeking first the same Heart as Jesus you are nothing, and all those things you do will not avail you anything forever. It is by the likeness of your own heart to Christ's that we will be judged and our eternal destination determined.

But, - at the general judgement, many people will say, "Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your name, and cast out demons in Your name, and do many mighty works in Your name? And then I (Jesus) will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you evildoers' (see John 7:22-23)." Jesus will say to to them: "Do you see these wounds that you have afflicted?" Do you recognize My side which you have pierced? Which, for your sake, remained open and yet you would not enter into the same affliction in your own life for Me?" Whatever we do in our daily lives avails us nothing unless it is done according to the Heart of Christ.

Not the outward appearance of piety, but a devoted heart makes a man truly good and dear to Jesus. Our glory in heaven will be secured to the degree that we do things in accordance to His Heart. When you are about to die, you will find that everything you have done in life is lost unless it was directed towards Christ and your own salvation. The season of Lent was created for this very purpose: to learn how to make Christ first in our lives, above all else, and to learn how we can imitate His Sacred Heart, Everything we need is offered to us; all we need to do is just truly want it.

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE FOR ADULTS

- 1. I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me.
- Do I give God time every day in prayer? Do I seek to love Him with my whole heart?
- Have I been involved with superstitious practices or have I been involved with the occult?
 - Do I seek to surrender myself to God's word as taught by the Church?
 - Have I ever received communion in the state of mortal sin?
- Have I ever deliberately told a lie in Confession or have I withheld a mortal sin from the priest in Confession?
 - Are there other "gods" in my life? Money, Security, Power, People, etc.?
 - 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
 - Have I used God's name in vain: lightly or carelessly?
 Have I been angry with God?
- Have I wished evil upon any other person?
 Have I insulted a sacred person or abused a sacred object?
 Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.
 - Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation?
- Have I tried to observe Sunday as a family day and a day of rest?
 Do I do needless work on Sunday?
 4. Honor your father and your mother.
 - Do I honor and obey my parents? Have I neglected my duties to my spouse and children?
 - Do I try to bring peace into my home life?
- Have I given my family good religious example?
 Do I care for my aged and infirm relatives?
 You shall not kill.
- Have I had an abortion or encouraged or helped anyone to have an abortion?
 Have I physically harmed anyone?
 - Have I abused alcohol or drugs? Have I participated in or approved of euthanasia?
 - Did I give scandal to anyone, thereby leading him or her into sin?
 - Have I been angry or resentful?
 Have I harbored hatred in my heart?
 - Have I mutilated myself through any form of sterilization? Have I encouraged or condoned sterilization?
 - Have I engaged, in any way, in sins against human life such as artificial insemination or in vitro fertilization?

6. You shall not commit adultery.

- Have I been faithful to my marriage vows in thought and action?
 - · Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage?
- · Have I used any method of contraception or artificial birth control in my marriage?
- Has each sexual act in my marriage been open to the transmission of new life?
- Have I been guilty of masturbation?
 Do I seek to control my thoughts and imaginations?
- Have I respected all members of the opposite sex, or have I thought of other people as mere objects?
 Have I been guilty of any homosexual activity?
 - Do I seek to be chaste in my thoughts, words, actions?
 Am I careful to dress modestly?
 You shall not steal.
 - Have I stolen what is not mine? Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen?
- Do I waste time at work, school, and home? Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
 - Do I pay my debts promptly? Do I seek to share what I have with the poor?
 - Have I cheated anyone out of what is justly theirs, for example creditors, insurance companies, big corporations?
 You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
 - Have I lied? Have I gossiped?
 Do I speak badly of others behind their back?
 - Am I sincere in my dealings with others? Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
 - Do I keep secret what should be kept confidential? Have I injured the reputation of others by slanders?
 - 9. You shall not desire your neighbor's wife.
- Have I consented to impure thoughts?
 Have I caused them by impure reading, movies, television, conversation or curiosity?
 Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?
 - Have I behaved in an inappropriate way with members of the opposite sex: flirting, being superficial, etc.?

10. You shall not desire your neighbor's goods.

- Am I jealous of what other people have? Do I envy the families or possessions of others?
 - Am I greedy or selfish?
 Are material possessions the purpose of my life?

I firmly resolve with the help of Thy grace to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.
