EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE FOR ADULTS

- 1. I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me.
- Do I give God time every day in prayer? Do I seek to love Him with my whole heart?
- Have I been involved with superstitious practices or have I been involved with the occult?
 - Do I seek to surrender myself to God's word as taught by the Church?
 - Have I ever received communion in the state of mortal sin?
- Have I ever deliberately told a lie in Confession or have I withheld a mortal sin from the priest in Confession?
 - Are there other "gods" in my life? Money, Security, Power, People, etc.?
 - 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.
 - Have I used God's name in vain: lightly or carelessly?
 Have I been angry with God?
- Have I wished evil upon any other person?
 Have I insulted a sacred person or abused a sacred object?
 Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.
 - Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation?
- Have I tried to observe Sunday as a family day and a day of rest?
 Do I do needless work on Sunday?
 4. Honor your father and your mother.
 - Do I honor and obey my parents? Have I neglected my duties to my spouse and children?
 - Do I try to bring peace into my home life?

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- Have I given my family good religious example?
 Do I care for my aged and infirm relatives?
 You shall not kill.
- Have I had an abortion or encouraged or helped anyone to have an abortion? Have I physically harmed anyone?
 - Have I abused alcohol or drugs? Have I participated in or approved of euthanasia?
 - Did I give scandal to anyone, thereby leading him or her into sin?
 - Have I been angry or resentful?
 Have I harbored hatred in my heart?
 - Have I mutilated myself through any form of sterilization? Have I encouraged or condoned sterilization?
 - Have I engaged, in any way, in sins against human life such as artificial insemination or in vitro fertilization?

6. You shall not commit adultery.

- Have I been faithful to my marriage vows in thought and action?
 - · Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage?
- · Have I used any method of contraception or artificial birth control in my marriage?
- Has each sexual act in my marriage been open to the transmission of new life?
- Have I been guilty of masturbation?
 Do I seek to control my thoughts and imaginations?
- Have I respected all members of the opposite sex, or have I thought of other people as mere objects?
 Have I been guilty of any homosexual activity?
 - Do I seek to be chaste in my thoughts, words, actions?
 Am I careful to dress modestly?
 You shall not steal.
- Have I stolen what is not mine?
 Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen?
- Do I waste time at work, school, and home? Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
 - Do I pay my debts promptly? Do I seek to share what I have with the poor?
 - Have I cheated anyone out of what is justly theirs, for example creditors, insurance companies, big corporations?
 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
 - Have I lied? Have I gossiped?
 Do I speak badly of others behind their back?
 - Am I sincere in my dealings with others? Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
 - Do I keep secret what should be kept confidential? Have I injured the reputation of others by slanders?
 - 9. You shall not desire your neighbor's wife.
- Have I consented to impure thoughts?
 Have I caused them by impure reading, movies, television, conversation or curiosity?
 Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?
 - Have I behaved in an inappropriate way with members of the opposite sex: flirting, being superficial, etc.?

10. You shall not desire your neighbor's goods.

- Am I jealous of what other people have? Do I envy the families or possessions of others?
 - Am I greedy or selfish?
 Are material possessions the purpose of my life?



PLENARY INDULGENCE on DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY • April 7 Begin Novena • Good Friday, March 22

All Holy Masses on Sunday, April 7, are Divine Mercy Masses. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be recited after each Holy Mass.

HOW SHOULD WE PREPARE FOR THIS GREAT FEAST of MERCY?

Jesus told St. Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened". (Diary 699) Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to Confession and then receive Him in Holy Communion on the Feast of Mercy - the Sunday after Easter, which is now called Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus promised that "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary 699). To observe this feast, we should commence a Novena to the Divine Mercy on Good Friday. The Novena includes special intentions for each day and is concluded with the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

Thus, to fittingly observe the Feast of Mercy, we should...

- Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter
- Come to Jesus with a humble and contrite heart, repenting of all your sins. Go to confession (with a priest) 20 days before or after the feast, as approved by the Church.
- Receive Holy Communion on the Day of the Feast of Divine Mercy. (D 1072)
- Venerate the image of Divine Mercy on the Feast of Divine Mercy. (Diary 47, 48 & 49)
- Be merciful as God is merciful. Practice works of Mercy, physically by helping others or spiritually by your prayers of intercession.
- Be open to receive a Plenary Indulgence as Jesus promised: that of forgiveness of all sin and punishment; which is available to you on the Feast of Divine Mercy. (D 699). In simple terms this means that if we go to Confession and receive Holy Communion, we can obtain the total forgiveness of all sins and their due punishment. This means we would go straight to Heaven!
- To venerate a sacred image or statue simply means to perform some act or make some gesture of deep religious respect toward it because of the person whom it represents in this case, our Most Merciful Savior.

In His revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, Jesus made mention of His desires concerning the Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) on 14 different occasions. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in entry 699 of the Diary of St. Faustina Kowalska:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened.
