



Jesus told us, "You, therefore, must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48). It's a difficult command but still real. He would never command us the impossible. No, to be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect is possible. How so? You see, all of our perfection consists in our resemblance to the Heart of Christ. His Heart is the standard of all virtues, which are necessary for our sanctification, and It is holiness itself. So whomever imitates Christ's Heart imitates God, his Savior, perfection itself. Jesus' Heart is the model of sanctity and the very source of every grace. What we learn from it depends on how much we really want it. We will receive only to the degree that we put into it. The more conformed we are to It, the more perfect we will be. The two virtues which are imperative to our perfection are humility and meekness. Humility is the foundation of true sanctity. It is the virtue by which all other virtues grow and thrive. If we don't learn from the humility that comes from Christ's Heart we will never have it. If we have another virtue in place of humility it will not be solid, 'it will be overthrown by the least breath of wind, and great shall be the fall. Meekness, moreover, is full of charity toward God and our neighbor; it is the perfection of holiness. Our heart will never be inflamed with love unless it is burning with the same fire which burns in Christ's Heart. Woe to us if we are enkindled with any love other than the love of Christ! We will burn indeed, but to our own destruction. - Paul A. Ray, stpolycarp77@yahoo.com


