

## Catholic Services Appeal • 2024

It is once again time for the launch of a new Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) campaign. The CSA collection funds many diocesan-wide projects and services that benefit all parishes and help to spread the faith. CSA funds are used to fund the seminary, immigration legal services for clergy, parish services which supports our parish in many ways, youth ministry support services, Pro-Life ministries and so much more. CSA not only supports the Archdiocese, but provides for services that our parish could not survive without. Our contribution to the CSA makes a difference in the lives of many

people and is also a great way to strengthen the parish finances. Our goal for 2024 is \$96,611. If we are able to exceed the goal, anything collected for CSA over and above the \$96,611 will be returned to the parish tax free.

The Archdiocese of Detroit did a direct mailing campaign on the parishes' behalf as they did in 2023. Due to some scheduling conflicts our formal kick off at the parish level was slightly delayed, but parishioners should have already received their packets in the mail. The direct mailing from, and the handling of the majority of payments by, the AOD takes much of the burden of administration off the parish.



## Eucharistic Adoration Hearts Deepest Longing THURSDAY, 1:00PM - FRIDAY, 12:00PM until 7:00PM on FIRST FRIDAYS ONLY

Keeping up with our study on sin we must speak about that sin which causes the death of the soul: mortal sin. Staying honest with ourselves and God, how can we even love, or dare to receive, this deadly foe into our heart?



Having committed mortal sin knowing the three laws by which we acquire it (grave matter, full knowledge, deliberate consent), when admitted, makes us a slave to Hell, the most wretched of men, yes, and even more base than the irrational creatures themselves. Strong words! It simply goes to show the true ugliness of mortal sin and our duty to stay away from it at all costs. How many are there who say, "How horrible are the evils committed in the world!" yet fail to look at the evils that reside within their own souls? This is something very serious that all of us will have to come face-to-face with in our own lives. If we honestly desire to follow God's Divine Will in our lives, we must be cleansed first. This is why I'm writing this, not to frighten you or cause you despair, but to make you aware of how easy it can be to sin and how often we forget about it or sweep it under the rug. Muscle up, my brothers and sisters! Look deep within you. Make an honest and sincere confession. ## What kind of Catholic man do I envision myself to be? - By: Tu Nguyen

Dear Bishop Quinn: In answer to: What kind of Catholic Man I envision myself to be?

Embracing the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, I see myself living with more wisdom, understanding more of my actions, having knowledge of right decisions, receiving counsel from the Holy Spirit, have fortitude in difficulty, having piety in all my actions, and fear of the Lord throughout my life. These are the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit that I will receive on my Confirmation. But I also wonder why do I need them? I've had God already since the beginning and will in the end, why do I need gifts? The Apostles found Jesus and repented in their new life, but they still received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. God continually strengthens us when we ask, and one of those many ways is through his gifts. I'm continually forgiven by the Son, so that I can be with the Father, and with the Holy Spirit I can learn to lead the life in which God calls me to. I've learned that the Holy Trinity is three persons, but one will. The individual work done by each of the persons are done in unison and in one will. Dear Bishop Quinn: I chose Saint Augustine as my Confirmation saint because I believe he is a great example of second chances. When Saint Augustine was a teenager/young adult, he was not a very good person. He committed all sorts of sins; he was even a thief. His mother, Saint Monica, prayed and prayed for 17 years that Augustine would join the Catholic Church. When he was about 31 years old, his mother's prayers were finally answered, and he converted to the Catholic faith. He became a priest and a Bishop.

I like Saint Augustine's story because no matter what he did, and no matter what sins he committed; God still forgave him. God gave him a second chance to live a good and faithful life, and Saint Augustine did just that. He converted about 386 people to Christianity, and Saint Augustine is proof that if you are truly sorry for your sins, you will be forgiven by God. He is a great example for those who have lost their faith and are afraid to come back to the church, and those who can't forgive because they are hurt and offended; Saint Augustine helps. Even though he hurt God and offended God, he was still forgiven and called to be a priest, bishop and a saint. ## Why I have chosen the Saint Name of Blessed Carlo Acutis - By: Sawyer Jones

Dear Bishop John Quinn: I chose Carlo Acutis because he is (*popularly called*) the patron saint of the Internet. Acutis is a 15-year-old saint who was born in 1991 and died in 2006 because of leukemia. Before Acutis died, he documented Eucharistic Miracles on a website he created and approved Marian apparitions.

A quote I found on his website is: "To Always Be Close to Jesus that's My Life Plan" which means to me that even when it doesn't seem like it, God is always there. When I grow up I want to be like Acutis because he was a strong-willed boy who never gave up and I admire that about him.

His full name is Carlo Maria Acutis. Carlo means Noble Spirit, which was also his grandfather's name. Carlo has inspired me to be a better person in the faith and in normal life because even if someone tells you that you can't do something, Carlo proves you can still do anything no matter what. I read the Carlo Acutis book which I would recommend to anyone who needs inspiration to stay in the faith. His feast day is October 12th. (NOTE: On May 23, 2024, the Vatican announced that Pope Francis signed the decrees and will convene a consistory to set a date for the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis.).


