When we approach Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, we must take to mind all that was mentioned in the last article and ask Him to create within us a clean heart, and to renew a right spirit. A right spirit is our souls willingness to follow, no matter what, the Will of God in all things. Recognize our whole heart is defiled with uncleanness and this infection affects our will. Ask for grace above all. Grace gives us the desire, the want, and the strength to do God's will. Ask Him to enlighten our minds to see ourselves as He sees us. Implore His mercy on us. Like the leper who knelt before Him, we can ask, "Lord, if You will, You can make me clean" (Matthew 8:1-2). Then ask Him to enter your heart and drive out all that defiles it like He did with the money-changers at their business in the temple (John 2:15). Then proclaim as you stand before Him that your house (your heart) will be a house of prayer through which you will worship Him and love Him. Do not be afraid of judgment or rejection. God's love and mercy for you far outweigh any offense against Him if approached in humility of heart and mind. Then allow Him to reign in your heart and life like never before.
