

It is an unfortunate task to have to discuss the reality of sin, especially the sin in our own lives. Sin is unpopular and embarrassing. We avoid the topic seemingly at all costs yet know that we possess it nevertheless. However, coming face-to-face with our sins before ourselves and God is mandatory in order to grow in intimacy with Christ and His Most Sacred Heart. But how can we come face-to-face with something we're not very familiar with? Consider this a learning opportunity and a stepping stone to happiness. We start by defining sin itself. What exactly does the Church mean when she says "Sin"? St. Augustine of Hippo put it the best: "[sin is] a word, deed or desire in opposition to the eternal law". What is the Eternal Law? The eternal law is the plan of divine wisdom, insofar as it directs all the actions and events of the universe. It is, therefore, the unchangeable effective decree of God binding the whole of creation to the fulfillment of its purpose, and to the use of such means for attaining this purpose, and to the use of such means for attaining this purpose as are adapted to each nature. In layman's terms this means God created everything for a specific purpose and if we speak contrary to, desire outside of, or do something opposite of what God created it for, we sin. Doing so offends God. Sin can be broken down even more specifically, which we will look into in the next article. A lot to absorb? Yes it is, but knowing our faith is the beginning of living our faith. (Paul A. Ray)

It is once again time for the launch of a new Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) campaign. The CSA collection funds many diocesan-wide projects and services that benefit all parishes and help to spread the faith. CSA funds are used to fund the seminary, immigration legal services for clergy, parish services which supports our parish in many ways, youth ministry support services, Pro-Life ministries and so much more. CSA not only supports the Archdiocese, but provides for services that our parish could not survive without. Our contribution to the CSA makes a difference in the lives of many people and is also a great way to strengthen the parish finances. Our goal for 2024 is \$96,611. If we are able to exceed the goal, anything collected for CSA over and above the \$96,611 will be returned to the parish tax free.

The Archdiocese of Detroit did a direct mailing campaign on the parishes' behalf as they did in 2023. Due to some scheduling conflicts our formal kick off at the parish level was slightly delayed, but parishioners should have already received their packets in the mail. The direct mailing from, and the handling of the majority of payments by, the AOD takes much of the burden of administration off the parish.
