

Besides numerous activities and initiatives on the personal and parish level, our Diocese – the Archdiocese of Detroit – runs about



I want all my readers to know that I haven't been speaking on sin the past few weeks to make you feel horrible about yourself. Nor do I take any pleasure in having to write about it. Sin often goes unspoken. It can be compared to walking on a trail through the wilderness. There's a cliff straight ahead but no one wants to talk about it. Yet we keep walking because we enjoy the scenery around us. The cliff is inevitable. If we continue to ignore it or pretend it's not there, we will eventually plunge to our death thinking the whole time we were okay. Yet the cliff is so obvious; yet not obvious enough to be more of a warning than our enjoying ourselves. The "trail we walk through the wilderness" is our lives we live in this world. It's a wilderness because we're pilgrims here on Earth (we were created by God for heaven in union with Him). It's uncharted territory and we learn and grow as we walk along its oftentimes mysterious path. The cliff represents all of our eventual deaths (Hebrews 9:27). While on Earth we enjoy the things God has given us to enjoy through disorder and vice, sometimes to our own detriment. Over time, they grow bigger than God in our lives and we listen to them/it instead of the truth of what God has revealed to us. This is sin. It is the distractions of this life that take our focus away from God and place them on ourselves. We want the spotlight, not ordering it to God. Doing this leads us to nonchalantly fall over the cliff to our death and destruction of both body and soul. We must be aware of this in the most essential way. That is why I take the time to write about sin. The less of it we have in our lives, the clearer God becomes and the happier we truly are! Perhaps we'll cover effective ways the Church and the saints have taught us about overcoming sin in our lives but we will have to save that for the future. May God's will be done! (Paul A. Ray)

Peter's Pence Collection • June 29 & 30

Turkey and Syria are situated in a region that experiences frequent, major earthquakes. In early February 2023, central Turkey's most powerful earthquake since 1939 struck with a magnitude of 7.8. More than 10,000 aftershocks continued for weeks afterward, including a powerful magnitude 6.4 aftershock that struck the biblical city of Antioch, known as Antakya. More than 50,000 people in Turkey and neighboring Syria were killed by the initial earthquake, followed by more deaths and the destruction of structures damaged by the first earthquake. UN officials estimated that more than 1.5 million people were left homeless in what is believed to be the largest natural disaster in Turkey's history. In a mid-February meeting with Turkey's new ambassador to the Holy See, Pope Francis asked what sort of aid Turkey most needed. Within 24 hours, Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, the papal almoner and prefect of the Vatican's Dicastery for the Service of Charity, organized a shipment of canned food, diapers, thermal garments, and other necessities, to be sent from Rome to a warehouse in Turkey for distribution to those in need. At the same time, economic aid to Syrian victims was entrusted to the apostolic nunciature in Syria. In addition to this material relief, the Vatican's prefect for the Dicastery for the Eastern Churches, Archbishop Claudio Gugerotti, visited Syria and Turkey to provide a ministry of presence to victims. The Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war, migrants and refugees, the poor, and those affected by illness and natural disasters is supported by your contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection. When you participate in the collection, you join Catholics across the globe in supporting the pope's mission of mercy as well as the Holy See dicasteries that assist his ministry. 

VBS News and Rules - June 24-28, 2024

MASS or EUCHARISTIC LITURGY daily at 9:00AM (Parent must stay with the child at Mass. Mass is not required but highly encouraged. Have your children ever taken up the offertory gifts? If not, let me know?)

VBS runs from 10:00AM - 1:00PM daily!

DROP OFF your child/children each day in the Gallery no earlier than 9:45AM.

PICK UP your child/children in the Fr. Mikus Hall promptly at 1:00PM. Parents are encouraged to join us for our closing assembly at 12:50PM. Allow a half hour for pick-up due to 250 kids being at camp this week.

VBS T-SHIRTS are required to be worn each day with CLOSE-TOED SHOES (Gym shoes). NO SHORT SHORTS—shorts must be a modest length.

Shirts will be available Monday morning of VBS either before or after Mass.

WATER will be provided at each station, but children may bring in water bottles.

FULL LUNCH will be provided. If your CHILD HAS AN ALLERGY and is bringing lunch from home, please drop the lunch off at the registration table in the Gallery. I recommend that parents have a snack for the car ride home. The children will be hungry and tired.

Consecration to Jesus Through Mary • Preparation Begins July 13 for Consecration on August 15

St. Louis de Montfort (1673 – 1716) had a profound and deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and wrote extensively on the virtues of Our Lady, what true devotion to her consists of, and how the faithful need to turn to her as the way to her Son, Jesus Christ. He recommends that the faithful formally consecrate themselves to the Blessed Mother. For this end he developed a specific 33-day program consisting of various prayers and readings to help the faithful detach themselves from the world and bond themselves more closely with Christ through the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Louis de Montfort stands in a long tradition of saints completely devoted to Our Lady, and his work has been influential in the lives of many other saints, one of the most famous among them is Pope St. John Paul II, who took his papal motto, "Totus "Tuus" (Totally Yours) from de Montfort.

This "Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary" consists of an initial 12-day preparation followed by a period of three

consecutive weeks, each week focusing on a different theme. It is recommended that the consecration be done on a major feast day of Our Lady, meaning that the preparation would begin 33 days prior. That is, after the 33-day program is completed, the formal Act of Consecration is made on a Marian feast day. Once you make the consecration, it is for life. It can then be renewed annually. Keep in mindthat this is a formal consecration to Our Lady, like a vow. Through this 33-day program you are giving Mary ALL of yourself - your heart, your mind, and your soul - in order to bring you closer and help you be more faithful to her Son, Jesus Christ. Also, that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan—i.e. this consecration allows her the free reign in your life to make you holy (she assists you through the Holy

Also, that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan—i.e. this consecration allows her the free reign in your life to make you holy (she assists you, through the Holy Spirit, to conform to her virtues) and to use your prayers, sacrifices, and sufferings for the greater glory of God.

The next preparation begins on Saturday, July 13, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on Thursday, August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

 Non-registered parishioners will be placed if room is available. Family must be registered for 6 months before they are eligible for parishioner rate. Non-parishioners must supply letter from their pastor giving permission for them to attend St. Cyril's Catechism Program.
- The ideal method of payment is online through parish's Pushpay. Please be sure to select the drop-down for Religious Education and include the date, receipt number and authorization code on your registration form in the upper LEFT-hand corner. Don't forget to include the medical and media forms with the registration form in your envelope.
- If necessary, tuition may be paid by check (payable to Ss. Cyril & Methodius) and mailed with all registration, media, and medical forms to the church address, Attn. Paul or Carroll Schuller.
- If there are any question about eligibility or tuition costs, please contact Paul or Carroll Schuller.

Homeschool Program

- Only those who are homeschooled for other academics and active members in our church may homeschool for Religious Education.
- Home School students making the Sacrament of COMMUNION in 2025 must enroll at this time.
- Home School students making the Sacrament of CONFIRMATION in 2025 (8th grade) and 2026 (7th grade) must enroll at this time. The Confirmation Program is a two-year program. You must be enrolled both years to be eligible.
- KINDERGARTNERS: There is a \$20 supply fee and must be age of five by December 1st, 2024.


