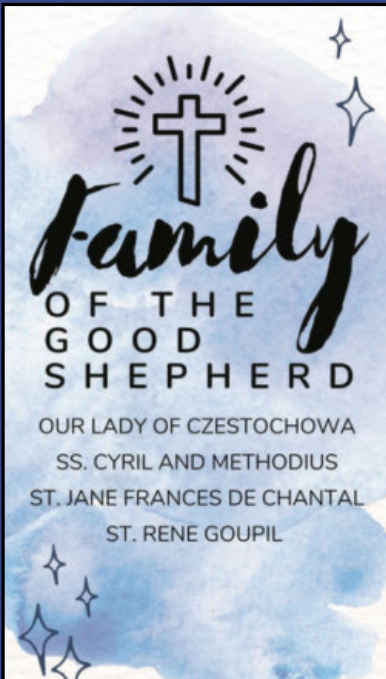

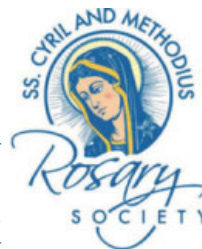
CSA Update

- ◆ The Parishioner rate is available to families in the Good Shepherd Family of Parishes.
- ◆ Unfortunately, due to limited room availability, registered parishioners will be placed first. Non-registered parishioners will be placed if room is available. Family must be registered for 6 months before they are eligible for parishioner rate. Non-parishioners must supply letter from their pastor giving permission for them to attend St. Cyril's Catechism Program.
- ◆ The ideal method of payment is online through parish's Pushpay. Please be sure to select the drop-down for Religious Education and include the date, receipt number and authorization code on your registration form in the upper LEFT-hand corner. Don't forget to include the medical and media forms with the registration form in your envelope.
- ◆ If necessary, tuition may be paid by check (payable to Ss. Cyril & Methodius) and mailed with all registration, media, and medical forms to the church address, Attn. Paul or Carroll Schuller.
- ◆ If there are any question about eligibility or tuition costs, please contact *Paul or Carroll Schuller*.

Homeschool Program

- ◆ Only those who are homeschooled for other academics and active members in our church may homeschool for Religious Education.
- ◆ Home School students making the Sacrament of COMMUNION in 2025 must enroll at this time.
- ◆ Home School students making the Sacrament of CONFIRMATION in 2025 (8th grade) and 2026 (7th grade) must enroll at this time. The Confirmation Program is a two-year program. You must be enrolled both years to be eligible.
- ◆ KINDERGARTNERS: There is a \$20 supply fee and must be age of five by December 1st, 2024.

Registration Directions

- ◆ When completing the forms, keep in mind that you need to note the grade of your child for the next school year (2024-2025).
 1. Print clearly all family information or review all information if your form came preprinted.
 2. Fill out Media Form and list all your students under Name – example: John, Mary & Ann Smith
 3. Fill out Medical Form in its entirety and if possible include copy of medical card.

National Eucharistic Revival (2022-25)

Spotlight on the 2024 National Eucharistic Congress

After three years of intense preparation, the 10th National Eucharistic Congress was held from July 17-21, 2024, in Indianapolis, Indiana. A Eucharistic Congress is a gathering of clergy, religious, and laity to bear witness to the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The last National Eucharistic Congress was in 1941, 83 years ago.

An unprecedented historic pilgrimage led to the congress from May 18- July 17, 2024, with four routes in the shape of a cross: 1) (North) Marian Route from Lake Itasca, MN, 2) (East) Elizabeth Ann Seton Route from New Haven, CT, 3) (South) Juan Diego Route from Brownsville, TX, and 4) (West) Junipero Serra

Route from San Francisco, CA. This was a giant Benediction over our whole nation.

Over the course of 5 days, more than 60,000 individuals attended the congress with all 50 U.S. states represented and thousands of participants from 17 countries speaking 43 languages (almost every nationality and ethnicity). There were approximately 1,000 priests and 150 bishops together with numerous deacons, seminarians and consecrated religious. There were families, singles, children, teenagers and seniors.

One of the major highlights of the congress was the Saturday, 3:00PM, outdoor Eucharistic procession led by seminarians, consecrated religious, deacons, priests and bishops. Tens of thousands of Catholics walked through the streets of downtown Indianapolis on July 20th for what Bishop Andrew H. Cozzens said "might be the largest Eucharistic procession in the country in decades."

The congress ended on July 21st with the celebration of the Eucharist where more than 50,000 people gathered at Lucas Oil Stadium. The Mass was celebrated by papal envoy Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle, who serves the Holy See as the pro-prefect of the Section for the First Evangelization and New Particular Churches of the Dicastery for Evangelization. He brought with him the "fatherly, paternal blessings" of Pope Francis, who "prays, as we all do, that the congress may bear much fruit for the renewal of the church and of society in the United States of America."

At the conclusion of the Mass, the 11th National Eucharistic Congress was announced to be held in 2033, the Year of Redemption -- 2,000 years after Jesus' death and resurrection.

Further, a National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will be in 2025, the Year of Mission, starting in Indianapolis and arriving in Los Angeles in time for Corpus Christi Sunday, June 22, 2025, and that Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles said he would welcome "all of you."

Let us praise the Lord for his unfailing generosity!
