August 13th—Fourth Apparition of Our Lady of Fatima

Tuesday, August 13 - Marian Procession & Devotions after the 12:00PM Holy Mass

On the 13th of each month, from May thru October, join in a very special Holy Mass and procession in honor of the apparitions of Our Blessed Mother to three Shepherd Children in 1917 in Fatima, Portugal.

The Rosary is prayed before Mass. Confessions are heard beginning one half hour before Holy Mass if it is on a weekday. Each Holy Mass concludes with a procession with the statue of Our Lady of Fatima from the Church to the outdoor Grotto, chanting Marian Hymns and Prayers to Our Lady of Fatima. Please join in this special day to honor Our Blessed Mother! Please join in this special day to honor Our Blessed Mother! The Mass will take place this Tuesday, August 13, at 12:00PM with the Marian Procession afterward.

During World War I, Pope Benedict XV made repeated but forlorn pleas for peace, and finally in May 1917, made a direct appeal to the Blessed Mother to intercede for peace in the world. Soon, Our Lady began to appear at Fatima, Portugal to three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos, age 10, and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 9 and 7. Fatima was a small village about 70 miles north of Lisbon.

August 13, 1917

As August 13th approached, the story of the apparitions had reached the anti-religious secular press, and while this ensured that the whole country knew about Fatima, it also meant that many biased and negative reports were circulating. The children were kidnapped on the morning of the 13th by the Mayor of Vila Nova de Ourem, Arturo Santos. They were interrogated about the secret; but despite his threats and promises of money, they refused to divulge it. In the afternoon they were moved to the local prison and threatened with death but determined that they would die rather than reveal the secret.

Late in the afternoon on August 19, Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta were together at a place called Valinhos, near Fatima, when they again saw Mary, who spoke to Lucia: "Go again to the Covada Iria on the 13th and continue to say the Rosary every day." Mary also said she would perform a miracle, so all would believe and that if they had not been kidnapped it would have been even greater.



Looking very sad, Mary then said: "Pray, pray very much, and make sacrifices for sinners; for many souls go to hell, because there are none to sacrifice themselves and pray for them." With that she rose into the air and moved towards the east before disappearing.

By now the children had thoroughly absorbed Mary's plea for prayer and penance, and did everything they could to answer it. They prayed for hours while lying prostrate on the ground and went as long as they could without drinking in the burning heat of the Portuguese summer. They also went without food as a sacrifice for sinners to save them from hell, the vision of which had so profoundly effected them. They even knotted some pieces of old rope around their waists as a form of mortification, not removing them day or night.

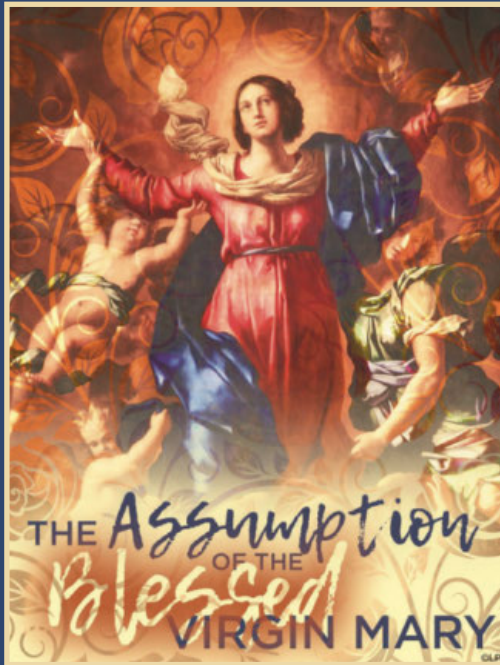

Let's always keep the following in mind as we go about our pilgrimage here on earth: Venial sin does six different things in us. It offends God's divine Majesty, it wounds His Heart, it deprives the soul of special graces, it hinders all our progress, it makes all our good deeds imperfect, and it paves the way to our destruction. Although venial sins are lesser than mortal sins, you can see how they still have a tremendous effect on us. And we, on our part, think little of them. We may use the excuse, "I'm only human" or "It's no big deal" when we sin venially. It's easier, after all, to simply not think of things that do not have instantaneous or immediate harm; much like a small oil leak in our vehicle or a leaky faucet. What's worse is thinking about how many times we actually have committed venial sins in our lives! The amount is without number and without measure. Whether it be through carelessness, the abuse of our free will, or through the influence of emotion, our venial sins add up over time. Is this the return we make to the Lord, by Whose goodness we live, to Whose love we owe whatever we are or whatever we possess? All of these show us how in need we really are before we can step foot in heaven. Before the Most Blessed Sacrament pray that Jesus might give you a more acute sense of your own shortcomings in venial sins. Pray that He will grant you the grace to overcome them. It's all there waiting for you, and a life lived in union with the Will of God is far more rewarding than a life lived in thinking it's out of our control. ~ Paul Ray

Home School Fee:	\$30 (during Sacrament Years)
Kindergarten:	\$30 supply fee

- ◆ The Parishioner rate is available to families in the Good Shepherd Family of Parishes.
- ◆ Unfortunately, due to limited room availability, registered parishioners will be placed first. Non-registered parishioners will be placed if room is available. Family must be registered for 6 months before they are eligible for parishioner rate. Non-parishioners must supply letter from their pastor giving permission for them to attend St. Cyril's Catechism Program.
- ◆ The ideal method of payment is online through parish's Pushpay. Please be sure to select the drop-down for Religious Education and include the date, receipt number and authorization code on your registration form in the upper LEFT-hand corner. Don't forget to include the medical and media forms with the registration form in your envelope.
- ◆ If necessary, tuition may be paid by check (payable to Ss. Cyril & Methodius) and mailed with all registration, media, and medical forms to the church address, Attn. Paul or Carroll Schuller.
- ◆ If there are any question about eligibility or tuition costs, please contact *Paul or Carroll Schuller*.

Homeschool Program

- ◆ Only those who are homeschooled for other academics and active members in our church may homeschool for Religious Education.
- ◆ Home School students making the Sacrament of COMMUNION in 2025 must enroll at this time.
- ◆ Home School students making the Sacrament of CONFIRMATION in 2025 (8th grade) and 2026 (7th grade) must enroll at this time. The Confirmation Program is a two-year program. You must be enrolled both years to be eligible.
- ◆ KINDERGARTNERS: There is a \$20 supply fee and must be age of five by December 1st, 2024.

Registration Directions

- ◆ When completing the forms, keep in mind that you need to note the grade of your child for the next school year (2024-2025).
 1. Print clearly all family information or review all information if your form came preprinted.
 2. Fill out Media Form and list all your students under Name – example: John, Mary & Ann Smith
 3. Fill out Medical Form in its entirety and if possible include copy of medical card.

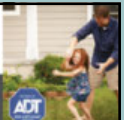
