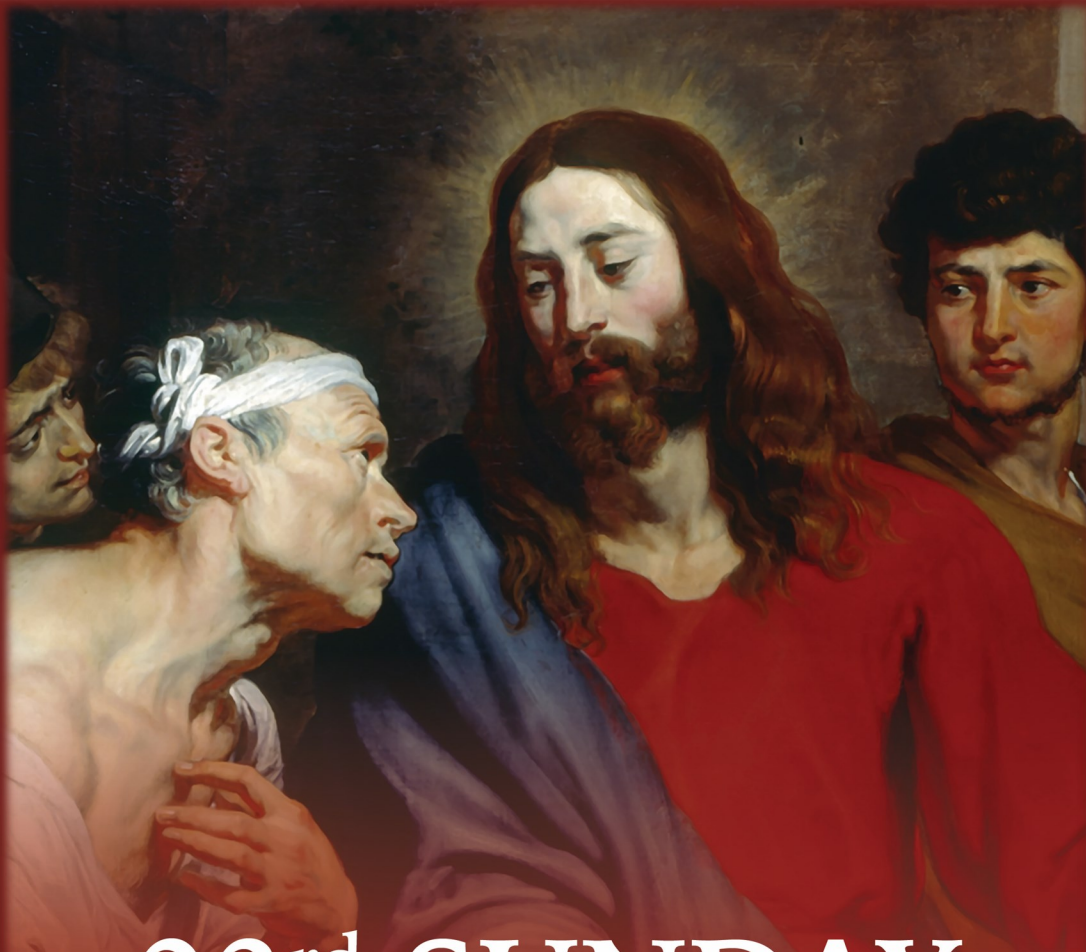

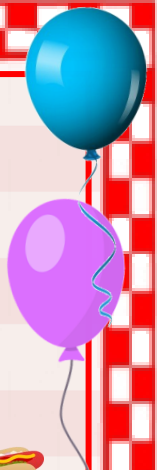

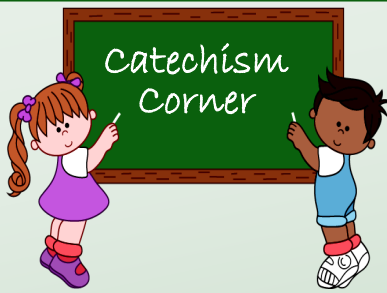

A person steeped in sin is an unhappy person. Even if the sin committed gives a brief momentary satisfaction, it quickly fades away. That is what an addiction becomes. In fact, Scripture tells us we are slaves to sin (Romans 6:17), and like an addiction when it is taken away from us we experience withdrawals. As a result, our lives turn in circles we run trying to satisfy an insatiable momentary urge. You can see how this behavior/lifestyle will always end up destructive. What peace could we feel, what joy can we experience, when we have turned God into our enemy? We banish ourselves from His Sacred Heart and a conscience always tormented by the thought of being plunged into everlasting fire. How unhappy we feel when we cannot even look up to heaven because of embarrassment and the lies from the devil that God is angry with us? Still terrible worse is not even being able to turn within your own self and finding only Satan there. We are not Satan himself, no, but we do his bidding. He instructs us, he is our master.

Pray, therefore, that Jesus will undo what we have done. Pray that Christ take us back to our innocents and give to us newness of life. Sin, no matter how great or small, is a serious matter, and so few people take it seriously or even care anymore. Once we grab hold of the grace offered to us the transformation will begin, with our cooperation. Preserve it, guard it, hold it close to your heart and learn from it. As long as we're on this side of eternity there is always an opportunity.

## Fifth Apparition of Our Lady of Fatima • September 13

During World War I, Pope Benedict XV made repeated but forlorn pleas for peace, and finally in May 1917, made a direct appeal to the Blessed Mother to intercede for peace in the world. Soon, Our Lady began to appear at Fatima, Portugal to three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos, age 10, and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 9 and 7.

Fatima was a small village about 70 miles north of Lisbon.

**September 13, 1917:** On September 13, very large crowds began to converge on Fatima from all directions. Around noon the children arrived. After the customary flash of light they saw Mary on the holm oak tree. She spoke to Lucia: "Continue to pray the Rosary in order to obtain the end of the war. In October Our Lord will come, as well as Our Lady of Dolours and Our Lady of Carmel. Saint Joseph will appear with the Child Jesus to bless the world. God is pleased with your sacrifices. He does not want you to sleep with the rope on, but only to wear it during the daytime."

Lucia then began to put forward the petitions for cures, to be told: "Yes, I will cure some, but not others. In October I will perform a miracle so that all may believe." Then Our Lady began to rise as usual and disappeared.

On the 13th of each month, from May thru October, join in a very special Holy Mass and procession in honor of the apparitions of Our Blessed Mother to three Shepherd Children in 1917 in Fatima, Portugal.

The Rosary is prayed before Mass. Confessions are heard beginning one half hour before Holy Mass if it is on a weekday. Each Holy Mass concludes with a procession with the statue of Our Lady of Fatima from the Church to the outdoor Grotto, chanting Marian Hymns and Prayers to Our Lady of Fatima. Please join in this special day to honor Our Blessed Mother! The Mass will take place this Friday, September 13, at 12:00PM with the Marian Procession afterward.
