This week, please join in the public rosary on the eve before the election, Monday, November 4, at 5:30PM. Please bring your rosary and a lawn chair. If you cannot join us in person, please unite your prayers wherever you are.

Through the intercession of Our Lady we will ask God to Protect our Religious Liberties and preserve our rights to Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness. Begin with the Election Prayer by Servant of God, Fr. John A. Hardon, S.J., followed by the recitation of the Holy Rosary and conclude with the Memorare and the Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel.

Total Consecration to Jesus thru Mary

Consecration/Immaculate Conception: December 8

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary is a beautiful exercise to increase our spirituality and ability to truly serve our Lord Jesus Christ. The basic premise set forth by St. Louis Marie de Montfort is simply that Jesus came into the world through Mary and that for us to always be assured of being close to Jesus, even closer than ever before, we should go thru Mary. St. Louis de Montfort (1673 – 1716) developed a 33-day devotion consisting of various prayers and readings to help us to grow in holiness and increase our faith and love for our Lord. It will help us to detach ourselves from the world and bond ourselves more closely with Christ thru the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Consecration to Jesus is for anyone, who is old enough to understand the love of Jesus and Mary. The preparation is intended to prepare our hearts and minds by praying and meditating.

The next preparation begins on November 5, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8. *"Preparation for Total Consecration"* books are available in the Parish Office for \$10.

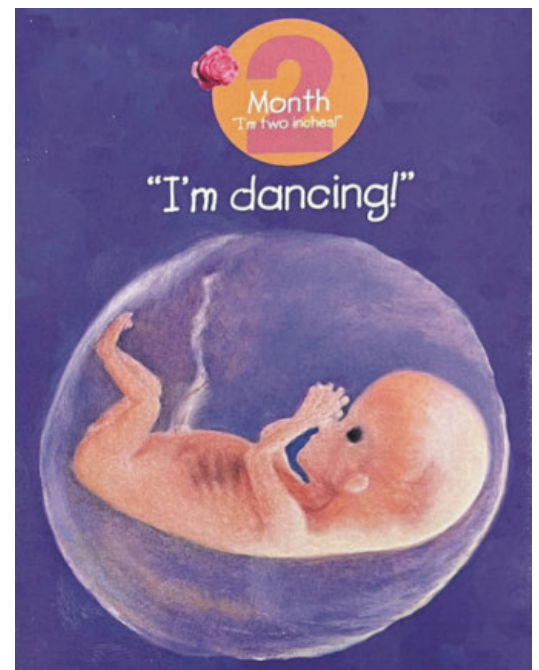

WE ARE ENTERING MONTH TWO

Thank you again to everyone who spiritually adopted a baby on the weekend of October 5 & 6. We are already entering our second month of praying. To date, a total of 165 babies have been adopted: boys: 68, girls:74, and unnamed: 23. All the new marvelous development updates are described in the paragraph below. As a reminder, our daily prayer was written by Archbishop Fulton Sheen over fifty years ago:

***Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I love you very much.
I beg you to spare the life
of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted
who is in danger of abortion.***

The baby is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form and her fingers and toes are developing. Ears, nose, and lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Even her brain waves can now be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks all body systems are present and the baby is called a "fetus", a Latin word meaning "little one" or "young one". Ultrasound reveals that this little one can now spring up and jump - her first dance steps!

Please have them attend the first rehearsal if they are signed up to participate. Students must attend at least two rehearsals (December 7, 14 & 21). We cannot accept students who only attend the last rehearsal.

PARENTS/TEENS: A few volunteers are needed to assist with the children and set-up/clean-up as needed. We also hand out the bells at the 4:00PM Holy Mass and would love to continue this beautiful tradition. Parents/Teens normally assemble the bells during rehearsals. Seamstresses/Costume help is also needed. Many of our costumes and things are in great disrepair and it would be so awesome to have assistance with mending and sorting costumes. This is a good opportunity for 8th Grade Confirmation Students to get Service Hours.
