


container (we will plate the cookies).

(Private) Consecration Date: January 23 (Performed Privately)


Mary is our spiritual mother, and St. Joseph is our spiritual father. The spiritual fatherhood of St. Joseph is extremely important for our spiritual growth. Everything we have given to Jesus and Mary can also be given to St. Joseph. The hearts of Jesus, Mary, and St. Joseph are one. <u>Program Overview</u>: Consecration to St. Joseph emulates the tried-and-true preparation

method employed by St. Louis de Montfort in his Marian consecration, highlighting many of St. Joseph's titles, privileges, and heroic virtues. The program of preparation and consecration takes 33 days. You'll spend about 20-30 minutes a day on a short exposition on one of the invocations in the powerful Litany of St. Joseph, followed by a reading on St. Joseph, concluding with the recitation of the Litany of St. Joseph. If you miss a day, just make it up and continue your preparation. On the day of your consecration, feel free to use whichever act of consecration you like best; you can also make up your own, if you like. A limited number of books are available in the Parish Office for \$15.

Presentation of the Lord • February 2 The next 33-day preparation for the Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, St. Louis de Montfort, begins on Tuesday, December 31, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on February 2, the Presentation of the Lord. Once you make the consecration, it is for life. It can then be renewed annually. This is a formal consecration to Our Lady,

Eucharistic Adoration ~ Hearts Deepest Longing THURSDAYS, 1:00PM - FRIDAYS, 12:00PM until 7:00PM on FIRST FRIDAYS ONLY

This week's Holy Mass Gospel has us reflect on the annunciation of the birth of St. John the Baptist (Lk. 3:1-6). However, I want to direct your attention to the second reading from St. Paul from his letter written to the church in Philippi (Phil. 1:4-6, 8-11). Here, St. Paul was writing from prison. And far from being a stereotypical prisoner, St. Paul writes about joy and encouragement. This is a testament to how we ought to be in life. Even under the most uncomfortable of circumstances God can and will fill us with joy. See how earnestly St. Paul prays for his fellow believers, even from prison (v. 4-5). This joy is available to all of us, not just the saints. The Christians in Philippi were still learning about the Gospel at the time. St. Paul is confident that God will continue to teach them until the end as spoken of in last week's Gospel. He prays specifically that, "[their] love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perception. (v. 9-10). Why this? "To discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ (v. 10)" The more we come to know and serve God with sincerity of heart and mind the more we will grow in love. It is the knowledge of God (through study, prayer, and life experience) and perception (our new outlook on life from God's perspective lived out daily). When we combine these things we will be "filled with the fruits of righteousness (v. 11). For what reason? "for the glory and praise of God (v. 11)". Take the time from your busy days and do just that. It will be far more rewarding than doing what's keeping you so busy! ~ Paul A. Ray

Monetary Donations to Local Ministries



International Monetary Donations

Slovak Seminary Donation: Future priests from all five Slovak dioceses are currently studying at St. Gorazd Seminary in Nitra. This year 50 theology students are in formation at St. Gorazd. This annual donation from our parish is a small way for us to support the church in Slovakia. Rather than a direct sponsorship, our donation will be used at the rector's discretion to provide financial assistance or to help fund retreats or other formation events.

Catholic Medical Clinic in Kahama, Tanzania: The town of Kahama, home of our sister parish Holy Family, desperately needs a medical clinic that cares for each patient's heart and soul, as well as their immediate medical concerns. It needs a Catholic medical clinic. Since his visit to our parish last spring, Bishop Christopher has started construction a building for this clinic. However, funds have run low and the project is at a stand-still. Our donation will allow construction to continue and move closer to providing this loving and essential resource to the people of Kahama.
