



## **Eucharistic Adoration HEART'S DEEPEST LONGING**

As we pursue our understanding of God's will and spiritual perfection we turn our attention to the third means we ought to practice to deepen our relationship with Christ: Ask God for the gift of living in the Divine Will every day. As in all relations, communication is necessary. Imagine living with someone you never talk to, or even worse, YOU do all the talking without listening. Such can become the case with our relationship with Jesus. Being all-knowing, God does already know our thoughts and desires in our hearts. However, how much more meaningful would it be if we actually talked to Him about them? Even in our natural human relationships (ask any parent) when our child comes to you and starts to tell you what is on his/her mind and heart it means so much more even if you already know what it is. It shows our child actually cares and comes to us in trust and love. The same holds true with God. This is not a difficult requirement at all. But the conditions through which we pray (talk to) God must be sincere and honestly from the heart. You could say when first waking up before your feet hit the floor, "Here I am, Lord, I want to do Your will in all things today. Guide me along the way You want me to go and say only what You want me to say. Thank You for this gift to be able to do my Father's will and so to please You and give You glory." Nothing warms the Sacred Heart of Jesus more than our desire to do His will (Jn 4;34; Jn 5:30; Jn 6:38; Jn 7:18; Jn 8:44). It is in this setting where we will see what our Lord said when He told us, "If you ask anything in My name, I will do it" (Jn 14:14). Do this every day for the rest of your life and just cooperate with the grace He will send to you. - Paul A. Ray

Saint Blaise, bishop & martyr of Sebaste in Armenia, is believed to have been martyred during the persecution of Licinius around 316AD. According to various accounts he was a physician before becoming a bishop and is also venerated by the Eastern Church.

St. Blaise is associated with the healing of the throats because of an event that took place when a mother came to him with her young son who had a fish bone caught in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone.

For the blessing of the throats, candles are blessed first. The priest either holds the crossed candles in front of each person's throat or gives the blessing to all people at once by extending his hands without crossed candles, while saying the following prayer of blessing: "Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Suffering and illness have always been among the greatest problems that trouble the human spirit. Christians feel and experience pain as do all other people; yet their faith helps them to grasp more deeply the mystery of suffering and to bear their pain with greater courage!

#### World Day of the Sick • Saturday, February 8

February 11 is World Day of the Sick, an observation introduced by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. It coincides with the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes, commemorating 18 apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary between February 11 and July 16, 1858. Since then, Lourdes has become a pilgrimage site where many people experience physical and spiritual healing.

The Church always wants to stand by those who are in need and offers them grace from the sacraments established by Jesus Christ.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is meant for those who suffer from illness or old age. The celebration consists of the anointing of the forehead and hands of the sick person accompanied by the liturgical prayer of the celebrant.

The special grace of this sacrament has as its effects:

- ♦ the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church
- ♦ the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age
- ♦ the forgiveness of sins, if unable to obtain through the Sacrament of Penance
- ♦ the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul
- ♦ the preparation for passing over to eternal life Elderly and sick people will have the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during the 9:00AM Holy Mass on Saturday, February 8.

#### Saints Cyril & Methodius Solemnity of the Patrons of the Parish February 15 (Vigil Mass) and February 16 (All Masses)

The Slovaks who started to gather in the early 20th century in the east side of Detroit with the purpose of having a place for the

community, for living their faith, and for instructing their children in their mother tongue, chose Saints Cyril and Methodius, the apostles of the Slavs, as patrons of their new church.

Now, more than 100 years later, Saints Cyril and Methodius are still venerated as the patrons of the Parish which is home to Slovak people and many Catholics of all ethnic backgrounds.

The Feast Day of Ss. Cyril & Methodius is on Friday, February 14, and will be celebrated as a Solemnity in our Church as follows:

# Total Consecration to Jesus thru Mary 33-Day Preparation Begins: February 20 Consecration On: March 25, The Annunciation of Our Lord

St. Louis de Montfort (1673 – 1716) had a profound and deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and wrote extensively on the virtues of Our Lady, what true devotion to her consists of, and how the faithful need to turn to her as the way to her Son, Jesus Christ. He recommends that the faithful formally consecrate themselves to the Blessed Mother. For this end he developed a specific 33-day program consisting of various prayers and readings to help the faithful detach themselves from the world and bond themselves more closely with Christ through the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. St. Louis de Montfort stands in a long tradition of saints completely devoted to Our Lady, and his work has been influential in the lives of many other saints, one of the most famous among them is Pope St. John Paul II, who took his papal motto, "Totus Tuus" (Totally Yours) from de Montfort.

This "Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary" consists of an initial 12-day preparation followed by a period of three consecutive weeks, each week focusing on a different theme. It is recommended that the consecration be done on a major feast day of Our Lady, meaning that the preparation would begin 33 days prior. That is, after the 33-day program is completed, the formal Act of Consecration is made on a Marian feast day. Once you make the consecration, it is for life. It can then be renewed annually. Keep in mind that this is a formal consecration to Our Lady, like a vow. Through this 33-day program you are giving Mary ALL of yourself - your heart, your mind, and your soul - in order to bring you closer and help you be more faithful to her Son, Jesus Christ. Also, that she may use you as a holy instrument in her battle with Satan - i.e. this consecration allows her the free reign in your life to make you holy (she assists you, through the Holy Spirit, to conform to her virtues) and to use your prayers, sacrifices, and sufferings for the greater glory of God.

The next preparation begins on Thursday, February 20, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on Tuesday, March 25, the Feast of the Annunciation of Our Lord.
