# Eucharistic Adoration HEART'S DEEPEST LONGING

Moving forward in our path to discovering God's will for our lives we arrive at recommendation number eight: wear a Crucifix, Miraculous Medal, and Brown Scapular every day. These are Sacramentals. This means in and of themselves they are simply objects. However, once blessed properly become a spiritual weapon at our disposal on many levels. All of them point us to Jesus Christ who is our main focus and

aid ... not the sacramentals themselves. We can wear a crucifix around our neck with a Miraculous Medal attached to it. The Brown Scapular is worn by itself over our shoulders. All of them serve a specific purpose in helping us along the narrow road. The crucifix can remind us of God's love for us, and that our walks with Christ are often accompanied by having to carry our own crosses in imitation of Him. The Miraculous Medal and the Brown Scapular have a story behind them which I cannot write in this article due to its length. I highly encourage everyone to look it up and familiarize yourself with it. Great graces await us! In essence, the Miraculous Medal and Brown Scapular are a reminder of Our Lady's continual prayers for us and her motherly care she has for us. Wear these Sacramentals and the evil spirits will flee. Draw closer to Our Lord and await His loving care in revealing to you what He created you to do. - Paul A. Ray

# CELEBRATING 100 YEARS OF THE ROSARY SOCIETY!

My first introduction to Saints Cyril & Methodius' Rosary Society was shortly after arriving in Detroit in 1970. Not being able to speak English, our family found a home in St. Cyril's Slovak community, attending Slovak Holy Mass, and my enrollment there in fourth grade. Mrs. Ann Venglar, the current longest member of the Rosary Society, became our lifeline in overcoming the language barrier as fresh immigrants from then communist Czecho-Slovakia and starting over in the U.S. Their whole family took us under their wing, and

Joseph and Ann Venglar became my Uncle Joe and Auntie Ann to this day. They hosted "coffee and cake" Fellowships after Slovak Holy Mass each Sunday for many years, and Auntie Ann was President of the Rosary Society for a number of years in the eighties. The Slovak Fellowship still takes place after Sunday Mass each week now.

My earliest memories of St. Cyril's Slovak Rosary Society were the pilgrimages the ladies took by bus. And, I got to tag along with my mother, Hildegard Ivin, who is currently an active member in the Rosary Society and has been since 1971 (more than 50 years)! We made day trips to Seven Dolors Shrine in Valparaiso, Indiana, and to the Basilica and National Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation in Carey, OH. Singing Slovak Marian hymns, reciting the Rosary, and the joyous sisterhood among the ladies left an indelible mark on me as a young teen. So many ladies, no longer with us, left a deep impression and are remembered fondly by me. Miss Emily Bires, the rectory housekeeper; Mrs. Mary Papcun, our neighbor in Detroit, with her sister, Veronica Papcun; Mrs. Emilia Bobak; Mrs. Tokarcik with daughters Annmarie and Lillian; Mrs. Anna Nota; and many more ladies not named but well remembered from the old St. Cyril's church in Detroit.

The ladies hosted many receptions, bake sales, arts & crafts gatherings and fundraisers with a yearly retreat at the Dominican Sisters' chapel and motherhouse in Oxford, Michigan. These events were more than mere social gatherings; they were the glue that held the community together, providing a sense of belonging and purpose to members of the Rosary Society and the wider Slovak community. The retreats at the Dominican Sisters' chapel were particularly special, offering a time of spiritual renewal and deep reflection. I remember the serene environment of Oxford, where the gentle rustle of leaves and the tranquil ambiance of the chapel provided the perfect backdrop for prayer and contemplation.

The Rosary Society was not just about spiritual activities. It played a crucial role in integrating new immigrants into the community. When the church moved to Sterling Heights in 1988, the Rosary Society experienced a significant growth with new members and friends from the parish. Women from multiple generations came together, forming a bond of sisterhood under our Mother Mary. Our spiritual practices and dedicated work continued, including hosting and participating in May Crowning Masses, Corpus Christi processions, and receptions following the first Mass of newly-ordained priests. Additionally, we organized annual Tea Parties, Salad Luncheons with Afghan raffles, Rummage Sales, and Bakes Sales at our Slovak Festivals, and for Easter and Christmas.

The Rosary Society continues and remains active within SS. Cyril & Methodius, engaging in acts of worship, shared prayers of the rosary, devotions, retreats, and practical activities such as fundraising, ministry, and community support within the parish. Reflecting on my experience with the Rosary Society at St. Cyril's for over fifty years, I can sincerely say that I have been blessed, fulfilled, and have received much more than I have given.

May God Bless our church and Rosary Society, Our Lady of Sorrows, patron saint of Slovakia, pray for us!


