Eucharistic Adoration • Heart's Deepest Longing

Our next recommendation in striving to understand and do God's will in our lives is to go to confession at least monthly. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a beautiful gift from God. He knows we still have concupiscence (an inordinate desire to sin) even after our Baptism and, let's face it, we still do continue to sin. In normal circumstances Mortal (serious) Sins need be confessed, however, in cases where Venial Sins become habitual it is proper to gain the grace from the Sacrament in order to put a stop to the Venial Sin before it escalades into Mortal Sin. Venial Sins are absolved during Holy Mass if the proper dispositions are in place. We cannot please God or merit rewards for our good works unless we remain in a state of grace. This means making sure we do not have any unconfessed Mortal Sin on our conscience/soul. Like Baptism, the Sacrament of Reconciliation places our soul in right standing with God. This is vital in order to be able to work with Him and grow in love for Him and neighbor. In fact, everything we've gone over in these articles from the beginning would all be for naught if we are not in a state of grace. The closer you get to God the more you will see how ugly sin really is and you'll develop abhorrence for it. Like sin, the more we do it the easier it is to continue to do it the next time. Growing in virtue (what makes us like God) is the same way but opposite; the more we are victorious in overcoming sin and practicing virtue the easier it becomes to do it the next time. Confessing once a month should be sufficient unless you notice yourself struggling in a certain area. Demons have told Exorcists that Confession is more powerful against them than the actual Rite of Exorcism! Take full advantage of all that God has given us and before long you'll find yourself on the fast track to sainthood! *-Paul A. Ray*

Spiritual Adoption Month 7

We are beginning month 7 and by the end of the month our baby will be 15 inches long and about 2 pounds. The baby is now using four senses: 1) eyelids open and close so the baby can look around, 2) taste, 3) touch, and 4) can recognize mother's voice. The baby can also cough, yawn and hiccup. The baby's grip is very strong, even stronger than it will be after birth. The hair on its head is growing longer and the downy hair covering the rest of the body is disappearing. The baby is receiving antibodies from mom to provide immunity to many diseases.
