

# Pentecost Vigil Holy Mass Begins with Evening Prayer (Vespers) † Saturday, June 7, 7:00PM

Similar to the Easter Vigil, the Vigil of Pentecost can be celebrated in a way that preserves its rich traditions.

Fifty days after the high feast of Easter, the Church comes together to celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. It is one of the principal feasts of the year and marks the end of the Easter season. Historically the feast of Pentecost was given a greater emphasis and its vigil the day before was connected to the Easter Vigil in many ways.

In recognition of the ancient tradition, the current Roman Missal has revived this extended vigil.

**Evening Prayer (Vespers)**—Prior to the start of Mass, it is an option to begin the celebration with the recitation of Evening Prayer (Vespers). This includes three Psalms and ends right before the Liturgy of the Word during Mass.

**Liturgy of the Word**—Similar to the Easter Vigil, there are *four readings* from the Old Testament that are read. The priest will pray before these readings, which summarizes the overall "spirit" of the Pentecost Vigil.

The readings reflect various prefigurements of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost starting in Genesis, and ending in the book of Joel. Each reading has its own proper prayer, which brings out the truths revealed in the ancient texts.

After the fourth reading and its Psalm is completed, the Gloria is sung with great jubilation. Then a reading from Romans is recited, which recalls how the Holy Spirit helps us in our need.

The Gospel is then proclaimed and Mass continues as usual.

After the Gospel, the homily is recited and the Vigil continues with the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

The Magnificat from the Vespers will continue after distribution of Holy Communion.

Mass is concluded with the solemn dismissal, "Go forth, the Mass is ended, Alleluia, Alleluia." Pentecost marks the last use of the Easter season double Alleluia.

After Pentecost, the Easter season officially concludes.

Next Saturday evening, June 7, the eve of the Solemnity of the Sending of the Holy Spirit, we will celebrate the Pentecost Vigil. Instead of our usual Mass time of 5:30PM, the celebration will begin at 7:00PM. Like the Apostles with the Mother of God, we await the descent of the Holy Spirit by keeping vigil in the Upper Room with prayer, the Word of God and the Eucharist. This Vigil includes the Evening Prayer of the Church - Vespers, a rich Liturgy of the Word, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. All are invited to participate in the sacred assembly of the Church in this special Liturgy.

The Pentecost Vigil will take place on Saturday, June 7, at 7:00PM.

It is once again time for the launch of a new Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) campaign. Last year, for the first time in several years, we not only met our goal of \$96,611 but exceeded it by \$4,823. Thank you to everyone who made this possible through your generous donations.

The CSA collection continues to fund many diocesan-wide projects and services that benefit all parishes and help to spread the faith. CSA funds are used to fund the seminary, immigration legal services for clergy, parish services which supports our parish in many ways, youth ministry support services, Pro-Life ministries and so much more. CSA not only supports the Archdiocese, but provides for services that our parish could not survive without. Our contribution to the CSA makes a difference in the lives of many people and is also a great way to strengthen the parish finances. Our goal for 2025 is \$90,729.

Just a reminder that if we are able to exceed the goal, anything collected for CSA over and above the \$90,729 will be returned to the parish without being charged the 7% Archdiocesan Assessment Fee that normal donations are charged. If we do not meet the goal the parish must pay for the remaining balance out of savings that has already been assessed the 7% fee.

The Archdiocese of Detroit did a direct mailing campaign on the parishes' behalf once again so most of you should have already received that. The direct mailing from, and the handling of the majority of payments by, the AOD takes much of the burden of administration off the parish.

If you do not receive a packet in the mail from the Archdiocese you can call (800) 348-2886, go online to givecsa.org/cyril-and-methodius, use the QR code below to donate or go to our parish website and select "give" in the top right corner followed by the red "Give to CSA" button. After several complaints from donors over the last couple of years the Archdiocese changed the website they use for CSA giving so you will notice a difference from the previous years. When filling out the form please fill out as much of the information as you have available, but only the fields with the red

asterisks are required. You can also use the green envelope in the May/June donation envelope packets or simply write a check to "Archdiocese of Detroit-CSA and drop it in the collection basket.
