

## Anniversary of the Dedication of Ss. Cyril & Methodius Church Wednesday, June 11

he Anniversary of the Dedication of a Church is celebrated as a solemnity in every particular church. Our Parish Church of Ss. Cyril & Methodius was dedicated on June 11, 1989, a long 36 years ago and we are grateful for this beautiful place, dear to many people.

The term temple, in the most profound sense of the word, designates the human nature of the incarnated second person of the Holy Trinity. This temple is not built by human hands and the fulness of divinity dwells in him. All Christians have access to this temple and can participate in its life. Therefore, the brick and steel construction is always more than just a locality for gatherings of the Christian community. The physical construction helps us to understand the profound truth that all faithful, as members of the mystical body, belong to the head. Being members of the Body of Christ, who is the true temple, the faithful, as the living stones, build the Church

The faithful gather in a visible temple built from physical stones. This temple is an expression of the invisible temple and the invisible Lord present in His Church. His elevated human nature is the source of sanctification and salvation, which reach us in the visible way through liturgical celebrations.

The liturgy of the dedication of the Church includes several rites: blessing of the baptismal font and renewal of baptismal promises, blessing of the ambo, anointing of the altar and the walls of the church marked by twelve crosses with candles. Holy Chrism is used for this anointing. These twelve candles are lit on the anniversary of the dedication every year.

The Anniversary of the dedication of the Parish Church of Ss. Cyril & Methodius takes place on Wednesday, June 11 each year (unless it falls on a Sunday). Therefore, we will celebrate this special occasion of our 36th Anniversary of the dedication of our Church this Wednesday at the 9:00AM and 12:00PM Holy Masses. Please join us in celebrating this special Solemnity.

# June 13th - Second Apparition of Our Lady of Fatima Friday, June 13 - Marian Procession & Devotions after the Noon Holy Mass

During World War I, Pope Benedict XV made repeated but forlorn pleas for peace, and finally in May 1917, made a direct appeal to the Blessed Mother to intercede for peace in the world. Soon, Our Lady began to appear at Fatima, Portugal to three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos, age 10, and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 9 and 7. Fatima was a small village about 70 miles north of Lisbon.

**June 13, 1917:** About 50 people turned up at the Cova da Iria on June 13 as the three children assembled near the holm oak tree where the Lady had appeared. The children then saw a flash of light followed immediately by the apparition of Mary as she spoke to Lucia: "I want you to come on the 13th of next month, to pray the Rosary every day, and to learn to read. Later, I will tell you what I want."

Lucia asked Mary to take them to heaven and was reassured in this way: "I will take Jacinta and Francisco shortly, but you will stay here for some time to come. Jesus wants to use you to make me known and loved. He wishes to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart throughout the world. I promise salvation to whoever embraces it. These souls will be dear to God, like flowers put by me to adorn his throne."

This last sentence is found in a letter written in 1927 by Sister Lucia to her confessor. Lucia was sad at the first part of this reply and asked: "Am I to stay here alone?" Mary replied: "No, my daughter. Are you suffering a great deal? Don't lose heart. I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and the way that will lead you to God."

One of the witnesses to this apparition, Maria Carreira, described how Lucia then cried out and pointed as Mary departed. She herself heard a noise like "a rocket a long way off," and looked to see a small cloud a few inches over the tree rise and move slowly towards the east until it disappeared. The crowd of pilgrims then returned to Fatima where they reported the amazing things they had seen, thus ensuring that there were between two and three thousand people present for the July apparition.

#### **Eucharistic Adoration Heart's Deepest Longing**

We come now to our second from last aspect of following the will of God in our lives. These dispositions open us up to allow the grace of God to flourish within us. Once we willfully cooperate with God's grace we will be better able to hear His still small voice and see His hand in operation in and around our lives. This application is to fast each Wednesday and Friday as you deem yourself called. Fasting is uncomfortable because it's a form of penance. But rightfully so, it's how we can show God we love Him, by imposing limits on the kind or quantity of food and drink we have. Moreover, fasting allows us to practice self-control and selfdenial. This is vital in our spiritual lives as we learn to "put on [our] new nature (Eph. 4:24)" and take off our "old self (Rom. 6:6)" in order to align ourselves with the will of God. Our fasting doesn't have to be extravagant, Christ warns us of this (Matt. 6:16-18), but let it be something only you and God know that you're doing. The selfmastery we learn during times of fasting will help us in ways you wouldn't even think of in the future. By shifting our thoughts on things other than food when we're hungry sharpens the mind. Fasting is not only for Lent. The Church advices the faithful to continue to fast on Fridays all throughout the year (but it's not mandatory) and by adding Wednesdays only serves to aid us even more spiritually. If you struggle with fasting the better! That means God has given you the opportunity to grow in holiness without impressing upon you penance or occasion from without. Much can be gained by fasting, but not many people take the time to learn and work with it. Give it a try! You honestly have nothing to lose! -Paul A. Ray

The Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) campaign has officially launched for 2025. Last year, for the first time in several years, we CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL not only met our goal of \$96,611

but exceeded it by \$4.823. Thank you to everyone who made this possible through your generous donations.

The CSA collection continues to fund many diocesan-wide projects and services that benefit all parishes and help to spread the faith. CSA funds are used to fund the seminary, immigration legal services for clergy, parish services which supports our parish in many ways, youth ministry support services, Pro-Life ministries and so much more. CSA not only supports the Archdiocese, but provides for services that our parish could not survive without. Our contribution to the CSA makes a difference in the lives of many people and is also a great way to strengthen the parish finances. Our goal for 2025 is \$90,729.

Just a reminder that if we are able to exceed the goal, anything collected for CSA over and above the \$90,729 will be returned to the parish without being charged the 7% Archdiocesan Assessment Fee that normal donations are charged. If we do not meet the goal the parish must pay for the remaining balance out of savings that has already been assessed the 7% fee.

The Archdiocese of Detroit did a direct mailing campaign on the parishes' behalf once again so most of you should have already received that. The direct mailing from, and the handling of the majority of payments by, the AOD takes much of the burden of administration off the parish.

If you do not receive a packet in the mail from the Archdiocese you can call (800) 348-2886, go online to givecsa.org/cyril-andmethodius, use the QR code below to donate or go to our parish website and select "give" in the top right corner followed by the red "Give to CSA" button. After several complaints from donors over the last couple of years the Archdiocese changed the website they use for CSA giving so you will notice a difference from the previous years. When filling out the form please fill out as much of the information as you have available, but only the

fields with the red asterisks are required. You can also use the green envelope in the May/June donation envelope packets or write a check to "Archdiocese of Detroit-CSA and drop it in the collection basket.


