



What would you think of if someone were to ask you what you are needful of? Chances are the first things that would probably come to mind are good health, happiness, financial stability, peace, a roof over our heads, clothes to wear, food to eat, and things of that sort. These needs are not sinful, but they all have one thing in common: They all pertain to things of this world. Rarely would hear anyone respond to the same question with things pertaining to something that far outlasts our time on this earth: Eternity. As Christians, our purpose for why we're here on earth has been set for us. We are to become saints (Mt. 5:48). To be holy, and live a life in imitation of Christ in order to prepare ourselves for our heavenly homeland is a call to all the baptized. Therefore, we seek to be always converted (from our old self) and live (according to grace in Christ Jesus -Rom. 12:2). Having good health, happiness, financial stability, peace, a roof over our heads, clothes to wear, food to eat are things only to be used to serve the purpose why we're here. They are a means to an end, not an end in themselves as we often think they are. This is Ignition Spirituality 101 (see the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola) here, and it serves us well to listen to this Saint. If we (a sinner) sincerely do penance, keep all Christs commandments (Jn. 15:14), we too shall live, and not die. That is what is needful. Why, then, do we fear or not take confession seriously? Does not Scripture tell us that we are ALL sinners? No one is exempt. Therefore, go then, with confidence, to the throne of grace. For where sin abounded, there grace did more abound (Rom. 5:20)! Fr. Jean Ikanga Celebrates Holy Mass Ss. Cyril & Methodius Saturday, August 23, 9:00AM

Next Saturday, Fr. Jean will visit our parish and celebrate the 9:00AM Holy Mass with us. He is in the United States this month, working on medical research at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. His visit to Detroit is a special trip to



share with us an update on the progress at the Maternity and Examination Clinic for women in Yassa, Congo.

He will also be celebrating at all Holy Masses at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Lapeer, that weekend where he will join Fr. Brian Hurley and Deacon Joe Hulway. You may remember the days when Fr. Jean regularly served as a Visiting Priest at Ss. Cyril & Methodius, and Deacon Joe was assigned to our parish. The Deacon is also the president of the charity, Friends of the Congo, Inc. (www.congowomensclinic.org).

Through their efforts, and your past donations, Fr. Jean can happily report that the second phase of the clinic, the Examination Building, is nearly complete. When construction is finished the Examination Building will be able to house the diagnostic and medical equipment that had previously been sent to the Congo and is now stored in the nearby school and the Maternity Building.

With the equipment relocated, the Maternity can finally accommodate and care for expectant mothers about to give birth. And, once the Friends of the Congo provides power and water access to the new Examination Building, the diagnostic equipment will be available to serve the villagers in the rural areas around Yassa.

Fr. Jean has more to share. Please pray with him next Saturday morning at the 9:00AM Holy Mass and visit him afterward.

August is here, the catechism books have been ordered, and the teachers are in place anxiously awaiting the first week of class. Mark your calendars as Catechism Classes will begin Wednesday, September 17, 2025, from 6:15PM - 7:30PM.

If we have your paperwork, you will receive a packet later this month with your child's teacher, room assignment, calendar, and program notes. Parents that haven't sent in their child's paperwork, please do

as soon as possible or we will not be able to promise that your child will have a book or classroom assignment the first week of class. The cutoff for registration is August 31st.

- ♦ Home School students making the Sacrament of Confirmation in 2026 (8th grade) and 2027 (7th grade) must enroll at this time. The Confirmation Program is a two-year program. You must be enrolled both years to be eligible.

Confirmation Packets were mailed to registered 7th & 8th Grade Confirmation Families several weeks ago. If you did not receive a packet of information, we do not have your registration forms.


