You have been told that the Holy Mass is the summit of our Catholic faith. You know that the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of our Lord, but do you understand what the liturgy is? What place does the liturgy have in the spiritual life? Do you know the meaning behind the prayers, gestures, motions, and actions of the priest and people throughout the Mass? Do you know how to participate in the celebration?

Explore the depths of the mystery of liturgy with Father Juraj. Father will guide you through the world of liturgy in order to better understand why the priest, deacon, altar servers, and the people of God do what they do, say what they say, and participate as they do in the liturgical rites of the Mass and in other sacraments. It will help you as well to consciously join in the celebration. There will also be time for questions and answers. Join Father Juraj and your fellow parishioners in the Overflow Room on the 4th Saturday of each month. The next session takes place on Saturday, September 27, immediately following the 9:00AM Holy Mass.

Eucharistic Adoration • Heart's Deepest Longing

We are looking at our human nature after baptism and even after confession. We always continue to sin. In this article I hope to offer a little aid in equipping ourselves against such a hard taskmaster. There will be days where we're surrounded by the enemy on all sides. Society calls these "bad days" or "bad luck" of people will state phrases like, "When it rains, it pours." Nothing seems to go as planned and things are said and done that are contrary to our happiness. It is during these days, or times, that we must be well armed at all times that they can never find us defenseless. At these times, our minds and emotions may feel like they're on a roller coaster, but what we must do is keep our heart lifted up and united to Christ's. We must be determined in mind and heart not to let what's taking place get the better of us. So much so that, as many saints have said, we would rather die than be defeated. Without this resolve, we will not be able to withstand the assaults. In this warfare, two kinds of weapons are necessary, one defensive, and the other offensive. Humility will furnish our weapons to defend ourselves. In this capacity, place no reliance upon yourself, and trust completely in God. Then, being convinced of our own frailty, disregard all inordinate thoughts and keep going about your way. Trust God knows you have to endure these to grow in Him and in virtue. Otherwise, He would not have permitted them to happen. If you rely on yourself or others, you will never feel satisfied. And offensively, pray confidently for grace knowing God will provide you with exactly what you need. Cooperate with this grace and as you go about the rest of your day know that you are pleasing to God for willfully doing His most often demanding, will in your life. A few short and simple prayers may include, "O, Jesus! Hide me within Thy Heart, that I may not be separated from Thee", or, "O' God! My God! Come to my assistance", or, "Jesus and Mary! Make haste to help me." - Paul Ray

Highlights from St. Mark's Bible Study

We continued to learn and confirm the traditional claim that St. Mark's writing was based on St. Peter's testimony. Some time was spent talking about the personality of St. Peter as being a man of action and direct to the point. This can be seen in the first verse when Mark writes: "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." We also studied some passages from the Old Testament to see how God was working to lead the people on the way to the promised land and how Jesus is doing the same work in the New Testament. We studied the Baptism of Jesus. We learned about the rending of the sky and the Holy Spirit coming down. The next two verses quickly mention Jesus going into the desert for 40 days and being tempted by Satan and then John the Baptist being handed over. Ending with Jesus preaching to repent and believe in the Gospel.


