Eucharistic Adoration • Heart's Deepest Longing

We are discussing our unfortunate tendency toward sin even after our baptism and confessions. This is a very practical conversation we can bring up with our Lord during our visits to Him in Eucharistic adoration. St. Peter tells us in his epistle to, *"Be sober, be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour (1 Pt. 5:8)."* And that is exactly what he does in our own lives as well as in the lives of the first Christians that Peter was writing to. Peter then gives us the solution: *"Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same experience of suffering is required of your brotherhood throughout the world (1 Pt. 5:9)."* What we need to do is faithfully withdraw our minds from the object of the temptation, turning it to the side of things good or indifferent, and persevere in resisting, not with anxiety or impatience, but by being calm and steady. With this, the enemy will either flee or you'll have the complete strength to resist. Don't let it be enough for you to just repulse Satan; strive also to injure him. We can do this by the weapons of Divine love coming from God that He Himself will furnish us with and we will turn our temptations of the enemy against himself. As often as the evil spirit tempts you, so often are we to use the temptation against him. By doing this we unite ourselves ever more closely to Christ, glorify Him, and acquire for ourselves greater strength and merit. So it will come to pass that the adversary, frightened by his defeat, either dares not return to you or, if he does, will secure for you a more signal victory and a brighter crown! - Paul Ray

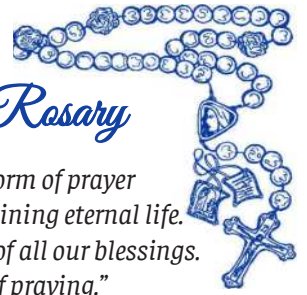
