

Highlights from St. Mark's Bible Study

This week we continued to learn about Jesus revealing Himself by referring to Himself as the Son on Man and having divine authority as seen in Daniel chapter 7. Matthew was also called to become a disciple of Jesus and is depicted in a painting by Caravaggio. Matthew was seen as sinner by the scribes and Pharisees because he was a tax collector causing them to be suspicious and disapproving of Jesus. We also discussed the devil's tactic of using gossip and accusations to separate the disciples from Jesus. Lastly, fasting on Fridays is a Christian practice to remember the day that Jesus was crucified.

Eucharistic Adoration • Heart's Deepest Longing

Continuing our look into our struggle with sin we bring the following before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament: Falling back into sin once again. If we find ourselves falling to a temptation we must arise right away and fight with more humility and courage for fear of falling into the bonds of becoming a slave to that sin. Many have lost because after having fought against it so bravely, when they are at the point of gaining the victory, are cast down by the demanding temptation that appears to never go away. They, therefore, surrender to it disgracefully, and perish miserably. What we have to bear in mind is that the struggle is short, but the prize is everlasting. We must be magnanimous; courage is a great part of the victory. It prepares us for the grace we need to fight, it raises the heart, increases strength, moderates labor, and it frightens and weakens the enemy. We confess before God privately and immediately after our falling into sin happens, and then confess it before Him in the Sacrament once the next available time presents itself. Defeating temptation is as simple as saying, "No!" to a particular sinful temptation. That's all. Relying on our own ability and strength to do so, however, is foolish, because on our own we cannot defeat sin. When we ask for grace, we will be given the supernatural ability not only to say "No!" to the sinful temptation, but defeat it! All powerful emotions associated with sin and temptation will fade away and the victory will be ours! - Paul Ray


Update on Freedom Rangeman Project: Outdoor Pavilion


