

Learn About the Liturgy

SATURDAY, October 25, 10:00AM

You have been told that the Holy Mass is the summit of our Catholic faith. You know that the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of our Lord, but do you understand what the liturgy is? What place does the liturgy have in the spiritual life? Do you know the meaning behind the prayers, gestures, motions, and actions of the priest and people throughout the Mass? Do you know how to participate in the celebration? Explore the depths of the mystery of liturgy with Father Juraj. Father will guide you through the world of liturgy in order to better understand why the priest, deacon, altar servers, and the people of God do what they do, say what they say, and participate as they do in the liturgical rites of the Mass and in other sacraments. It will help you as well to consciously join in the celebration. There will also be time for questions and answers. Join Father Juraj and your fellow parishioners in the Overflow Room on the 4th Saturday of each month. The next session takes place on Saturday, October 25, immediately following the 9:00AM Holy Mass.

Bring a friend and take this opportunity to deepen your faith and truly appreciate the gift that is at the center of our Catholic life!

Catechísm



Eucharistic Adoration • Heart's Deepest Longing

This week we enter into our first stage in learning how to do a self-examination whenever we sense sin (or the occasion of sin) entering our lives. This first step can easily be done at any time, in any place, even while others are present, and it will not attract their attention. It is to collect ourselves. This means that when an opportunity arises (toward sin) we must turn our hearts and inspect it for a short time. We must consider what it is that is infecting it or what our minds are occupied with because of a certain thing that took place. Consider what it has already done to us, how did we react, how did it make us feel, and what would you speculate it doing to you in the future if you continue to allow it to stay inside you. We often have to do this act frequently since these days are evil and we're surrounded by temptation after temptation; normally at the beginning of an undertaking (before work, before school, before a project or the caring of our children). Think about the things that presented to our senses and in our minds; almost like taking a look at ourselves from the outside-in. Ask what it is that alluring you or tempting you. If we do not do these acts we will be as the wind and waves, never knowing where they'll lead us. In this exercise there should be no difficulty whatsoever. At first some attention must be used but no straining of the mind; and in a short time you will begin to acquire a holy and consoling habit and gather from it the most wholesome fruits. When done frequently, it becomes second-nature and you'll quickly learn how to incorporate this exercise all the time and without effort to your perfection.

Prep Begins: November 5 • Consecration: December 8

Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary is a beautiful exercise to increase our spirituality and ability to truly serve our Lord Jesus Christ. The basic premise set forth by St. Louis Marie de Montfort is simply that Jesus came into the world through Mary and that for us to always be assured of being close to Jesus, even closer than ever before, we should go thru Mary. St. Louis de Montfort (1673 – 1716) developed a 33-day devotion consisting of various prayers and readings to help us to grow in holiness and increase our faith and love for our Lord. It will help us to detach ourselves from the world and bond ourselves more closely with Christ thru the example and intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Consecration to Jesus is for anyone, who is old enough to understand the love of Jesus and Mary. The preparation is intended to prepare our hearts and minds by praying and meditating.

The next preparation begins on November 5, for all who wish to make, or renew their Consecration on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8. "Preparation for Total Consecration" books are available in the Parish Office for \$10.


